and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever (except the Master-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordinance, for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the faid 23d of Day this instant May, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, except in the Cases comprized within the aforementioned Orders in Council, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties instituted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An Act improvement His Majesty to prohibit the French Prohibit the Prohibit th "to impower His Majefly to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law
for empowering His Majefly to prohibit the
Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of
Arms and Ammunition; and also to impower " His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms " or Ammunition." - And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commis-fioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
