**T**HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to bear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord Chancellor, and the Marquis of Stafford, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

*An Act to indemnify such Persons as have omitted to qualify themselves for Offices and Employments, and to indemnify Justices of the Peace or others who have omitted to register or deliver in their Qualifications within the Time limited by Law, and for giving further Time for those Purposes; and to indemnify Members and Officers in Cities, Corporations and Borough Towns, whose Admissions have been omitted to be stamped according to Law, or, having been stamped, have been lost or mislaid, and for allowing them Time to provide Admissions duly stamped; to give further Time to such Persons as have omitted to make and file Affidavits of the Execution of Indentures of Clerks to Attornies and Solicitors; and for indemnifying Deputy Lieutenants and Officers of the Militia, who have neglected to transmit Descriptions of their Qualifications to the Clerks of the Peace within the*

*Time limited by Law, and for giving further Time for that Purpose.*

*An Act to continue the Laws now in Force for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Dominions and the Inhabitants of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, so far as the same relate to the Trade and Commerce carried on between this Kingdom and the Inhabitants of the Countries belonging to the said United States.*

*An Act to prevent Acts of Parliament from taking Effect from a Time prior to the passing thereof.*

*An Act to enable the Royal Exchange Assurance Companies and their Successors to grant, purchase and sell Annuities upon or for Lives.*

*An Act to enable the Governor and Company of the Bank of England to purchase certain Houses and Ground contiguous to the Bank of England.*

*An Act for effectually carrying into Execution an Act of Parliament of the Thirtieth Year of His present Majesty, for making and maintaining a navigable Communication between Stowmarket and Ipswich in the County of Suffolk.*

*An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the Canal Navigation from Manchester to or near Ashton under Lyne and Oldham to extend the said Canal from a Place called Clayton Demesne, in the Township of Droylsden, in the Parish of Manchester aforesaid, to a Place in the Turnpike Road in Heaton Norris leading between Manchester and Stockport, opposite to the House known by the Sign of the Three Boars Heads, and from or nearly from a Place called Taylor's Barn, in the Township of Reddish, to Denton, at a Place called Beat Bank, adjoining the Turnpike Road leading between Stockport and Ashton under Lyne; and also from the intended Aqueduct Bridge, at or near a Place called Waterhouses, in the Parish of Ashton under Lyne aforesaid,*

to a Place called *State Leach*, at *Hollinwood*, in the Township of *Oldham* aforesaid.

An Act for making and maintaining a navigable Canal from the *Glamorganshire Canal* to or near the Village of *Aberdare*, in the County of *Glamorgan*, and for making and maintaining a Rail Way or Stone Road from thence to or near *Abernant*, in the Parish of *Cadoxton* juxta *Neath*, in the said County.

An Act for making and maintaining a navigable Canal from the *Worcester and Birmingham Canal Navigation*, in the Parish of *King's Norton*, into the Borough of *Stratford upon Avon*; and also certain collateral Cuts from the said intended Canal.

An Act for making and maintaining a navigable Canal from the Town of *Brecknock* to the *Monmouthshire Canal* near the Town of *Pontypool* in the County of *Monmouth*, and for making and maintaining Rail Ways and Stone Roads from such Canal to several Iron Works and Mines in the Counties of *Brecknock* and *Monmouth*.

An Act for making and maintaining a navigable Canal from the River *Severn*, at or near the City of *Gloucester*, into a Place called *Berkeley Pill* in the Parish of *Berkeley*; and also a Cut to or near the Town of *Berkeley* in the County of *Gloucester*.

An Act for effectually carrying into Execution an Act of Parliament of the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for making a navigable Canal from the Town of *Basingstoke* in the County of *Southampton*, to communicate with the River *Wey*, in the Parish of *Cherisley* in the County of *Surrey*, and to the South East Side of the Turnpike Road, in the Parish of *Turgis* in the said County of *Southampton*.

An Act for separating the Chapels of *Chorley* and *Rufford* from the Parish of *Croston* in the County of *Lancaster*, and for making them Two distinct Parish Churches.

An Act for paving the Foot Paths within the Borough of *Ludlow* in the County of *Salop*, and for lighting, watching, and otherwise improving the said Borough.

An Act for supplying the Towns of *Plymouth Dock*, *Stoke Damarel*, *Stonehouse*, and the Parts adjacent, in the County of *Devon*, with Water.

An Act for amending, widening, altering, and keeping in Repair the Road leading from *Uttoxeter* to the Westwardly Part of *Hardwick Heath*, and for setting out and making a new Road from thence to *Stoke*, near *Stone*; and for amending, widening, altering, and keeping in Repair the Road leading from the Village of *Millwich* to *Sandon* in the County of *Stafford*.

An Act for enlarging the Term and altering the Powers of an Act, passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King *George the Third*, intituled, An Act for more effectually repairing several Roads leading from *Ledbury* in the County of *Hereford*, and the Road through the Parish of *Bromeharrow* in the County of *Gloucester*, and *Corfe Lawn*, till it joins the Road from *Gloucester* to *Worcester*.

An Act for opening and making a new Road from the Turnpike Road at *Craig Euan Leyson*, in the Parish of *Lanvabon*, to the Confines of the Parish of *Ystradyvoduck*, near *Abernant*, in the County of *Glamorgan*.

An Act for more effectually repairing the Road from *Blackburn* to *Burfcough Bridge* in the County of *Lancaster*.

An Act for continuing and amending an Act, passed in the Thirteenth Year of His present Majesty King *George the Third*, intituled, An Act for amending, widening, and keeping in Repair the Road from the Guide Post at the West End of the Town of *Hampden*, over *Sunbury Common*, to the Town of *Staines* in the County of *Middlesex*.

An Act to continue the Term and alter and enlarge the Powers of an Act, passed in the Sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for repairing and widening the Road from *Barwry* in the County of *York* to *East Markham Common* in the County of *Nottingham*, and from *Little Drayton* to *Twyford Bridge*, in the said County.

An Act for making and maintaining a Road from or nearly from *French Top*, in the Parish of *Saddleworth*, in the West Riding of the County of *York*, to *Brookhouses*, in the Parish of *Glossop* in the County of *Derby*, and for repairing and altering the Road leading from or nearly from a Close, called *Copley Meadow*, in *Stayley*, to or near *Stayley Bridge* in the County of *Chester*.

An Act for repairing and amending the Roads leading from the Town of *Manchester* in the County of *Lancaster*, through the Town of *Astor* under *Line* and Parish of *Mottram Longdendale*, and from thence to *Salter's Brook* in the County Palatine of *Chester*.

An Act for continuing the Term and altering and enlarging the Powers of an Act, made in the Tenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for repairing the Highways from *Speenhamland* in the County of *Berks*, to *Marlborough* in the County of *Wilts*, and several other Roads therein mentioned.

An Act for continuing the Term of an Act of the Eleventh Year of His present Majesty, for amending, widening, turning, and altering the Road from the Bottom of *Galley Hill*, near the Town of *Witney*, to the Cross in *Clanfield*, in the County of *Oxford*.

An Act for continuing the Term and altering and enlarging the Powers of an Act of Parliament of the Seventeenth Year of His present Majesty, for repairing and widening the Road from the Town of *Halifax* in the West Riding of the County of *York*, to the Town of *Sheffield* in the same Riding, so far as relates to the first District of the Roads mentioned in the said Act.

An Act for repairing and widening the Road from the Foot of a certain Bridge, in the Parish of *Little Bowden* in the County of *Northampton*, commonly called *St. Mary's Bridge*, to the West Side of the Toll Bar, at the North End of the Town of *Rockingham* in the said County.

An Act to enlarge the Terms and Powers of Two Acts of Parliament, the one passed in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for repairing and widening the Road from *Newcastle under Line* to *Hassop*, and from *Middlebills* to the *Macclesfield Turnpike Road* near *Buxton*; and also the Road, branching out of the said first mentioned Road at *Cobridge*, to *Burslem*, and to the *Uttoxeter Turnpike Road* at *Skelton* in the County of *Stafford*; and the other passed in the Thirteenth Year of the Reign of His said Majesty, to enlarge the Term and Powers of the said Act, and for amending several other Roads therein described.

That your Majesty may reign long over a free, happy and victorious Nation, is the most ardent Prayer of our Hearts.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Magistrates, Town Council and other Inhabitants of the Town of Thurso, in Common Council assembled.

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Magistrates, Town Council and other Inhabitants of the Town of Thurso, beg Leave to

approach the Throne with Assurances of our distinguished Regard for your Majesty's sacred Person and Family, and of our inviolable Attachment to the British Constitution.

With a Magnanimity becoming the Sovereign of a free and a generous People, your Majesty beheld the distracted State of a Nation, ever ready to avail herself of the Misfortunes of this Country, without attempting to interfere in the internal Affairs of France, or to seize the Advantages which her Situation presented, and the Reflection of past Events would have fully justified.

In Return for this generous and disinterested Conduct, we have seen, with Indignation, the pretended Government of France endeavour to sap the Foundation of our happy Constitution, by exciting and encouraging a Spirit of Insurrection and Sedition in this Country, which, if allowed to spread, might be productive of the most direful Consequences. We must therefore applaud the Wisdom of your Majesty, and your Ministers, in taking proper Measures to check the growing Evil, and for counteracting the insidious and treacherous Attempts of the French Nation, whose Language and Conduct were early directed to the total Subversion of every Government; who, by embruing their Hands in the Blood of an amiable Sovereign, have testified their Disregard of every Law, divine and human; and of whose hostile Designs against this Country in particular, if any Doubt could remain, they have given irrefragable Proof by their late unprovoked Declaration of War.

Impressed with these Sentiments, we feel ourselves called upon to declare our entire Approbation of the Measures which your Majesty is pursuing for carrying on the present War with Vigour and Effect; and to assure your Majesty of our fixed Resolution to support Government, to the utmost of our Power, in whatever is necessary for maintaining the Safety, Glory and Dignity of the British Empire.

That your Majesty's Reign may be long and prosperous; and that the Crown of these Realms may continue in your illustrious House in uninterrupted Succession and with undiminished Lustre to the latest Posterity, is the earnest Prayer of,

Lieutenant Western, of His Majesty's Frigate the Syren, who was unfortunately killed on the 21<sup>st</sup>, by a Shot from the Enemy's entrenched Battery at the Noord Post, was buried Yesterday in the Church of Dordrecht, with Military Honours, and with every Solemnity that could mark Regard to the Memory of a young Officer, who had shewn on all Occasions an active and steady Courage, and an ardent Desire to distinguish himself. His Royal Highness the Duke of York was present, with the Officers and Troops under his Command. The Funeral was also attended by the Officers and Crews of the English Gun-Boats.

*Hague, March 26.*

Accounts have been received here from the Prince of Saxe Cobourg, dated Breibeck near Louvain, the 23<sup>d</sup> Instant, stating, that on the preceding Day he had attacked the French, who were advantageously posted between Tirlemont and Louvain: That the Engagement was long and obstinate; but that the French were beat, and driven beyond Louvain, and were then posted behind the Dyle, between Louvain and Brussels.

*Hague, March 28.*

A Letter was this Morning received Expreps from Captain Bentinck, dated Yesterday, at Bois le Duc, containing Intelligence from Antwerp and Maestricht that the Advanced Guard of the Austrian Army entered Brussels on the 24<sup>th</sup> at Noon: That the French Army was posted at Halle: That the Country, from Bois le Duc to Lier, was clear of the Enemy; and that the French Force still at Breda, amounted to 4000, and that at Gertruydenberg to 2500 Men.

Accounts are also received that Diest was taken on the 20<sup>th</sup>, in an Attack by Colonel Mylius; that a considerable Magazine was left by the French at Louvain; and that, in the Affair of the 22<sup>d</sup>, the Austrians had 1000 Men killed and wounded, and the French had 4000 killed.
