of Corn, or other Articles before mentioned, are prohibited to be exported, by reafon of the Price of fuch Sort of Corn or of Oatmeal being at or above the Prices mentioned in Table B. in the faid A& passed in the Thirty-first Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, contained, fubject to the like Securities, Conditions, Regulations and Reftrictions, Forfeitures and Penalties, as are in either of the faid Two Acts, or by any other Act now in Force, in any

• fuch Cafe required and imposed ; nor to prohibit the Exportation of fuch Corn, or other Articles as aforefaid, which shall have been entered Outwards, and shall have been actually shipped or laden on board, or fo much thereof expressed in such Entry, as shall have been fo shipped or laden on board at the Time of the Date of this prefent Order, in the fame Manner as if this Prohibition to export had not been made.

Provided, neverthelefs, that any fuch Corn, or other Articles as aforefaid, fhall not be permitted to be carried Coaltwife, or to be otherwife carried from any Port, from which the Exportation thereof is not, at the Time of Shipping the fame, allowed by Law, and be landed and unfhipped at any other Port from which the fame may then be legally exported.

And His Majesty, by and with the Advice aforefaid, hath thought fit further to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the Date of this prefent Order, until the Thirty-first Day of August, 1793. it shall be lawful to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and to take out of Warehouse, for Home Confumption, any Foreign Wheat, Whear Meal or Flour, Rye, Peas, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats or Oatmeal, and alfo to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and to take out of Warehouse, for Home Confumption, any Foreign Barley, Peas, Oats and Oatimeal, on Payment of the fecond Low Duty only, mentioned in the faid Table marked E. and no other.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury are to give the neceffary Directions herein accordingly.
