A Letter, of which the following is an Extract, was Yesterday received from His Royal Highness the Duke of York by the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, dated St. Amand, April 8, 1794.

I have received this Morning a Report from Count Walmoden, that the Enemy, having succeeded in surprizing the Hessian Posts at Tenbreuil, between Werwick and Ypres, got behind the Hanoverian Pickets, and cut them off. Succour, however, having arrived from Menin, the Enemy was driven back, and forced to re-cross the Lys, and to destroy the Bridge which they had made. Our Loss was One Man killed, One Officer and Seven Men wounded, and Three Officers and One Hundred and Forty-three Men taken Prisoners.

St. James's, April 12.

I have only Time to inform your Worship that a Number of Men landed this Evening from some French Privateers cruising off this Coast, and have carried away all the Cattle they could seize, and I apprehend they will do more Mischief. If there are any armed Ships at Shields I hope you will send them for our Protection, otherwise we cannot tell how far the Evil may extend.
