A PROCLAMATION,

For apprehending Archibald Hamilton Rowan.

WHEREAS Archibald Hamilton Rowan, late of Rathcoffey in the County of Kildare in the Kingdom of Ireland, Esquire, was, in the last Hilary Term, committed to His Majesty's Gaol of Newgate in the City of Dublin in the said Kingdom, under a Sentence of the Court of King's Bench of the said Kingdom, of Imprisonment for Two Years, for publishing a seditious Libel:

And whereas the said Archibald Hamilton Rowan has lately been charged with High Treason: And whereas Information on Oath has been received that the said Archibald Hamilton Rowan did, in the Night of Thursday the First Day of May instant, make his Escape from the said Gaol:

We have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby requiring and commanding all Our loving Subjects to discover and apprehend, and cause to be discovered and apprehended, the said Archibald Hamilton Rowan, and to carry him before some of Our Justices of the Peace, or Chief Magistrates of the County, Town or Place where he shall be apprehended, who are respectively required to secure him, and thereof to give speedy Notice unto Our Privy Council, or One of Our Principal Secretaries of State, to the End he may be forth coming, and be dealt withal, and proceeded against, according to Law. And whoever shall discover and apprehend the said Archibald Hamilton Rowan, and bring him before such Justice of Peace or Chief

Magistrate,

Magistrat, or so discover him that he may be apprehended and committed, shall receive for Reward the Sum of ONE THOUSAND POUNDS; which said Sum of One Thousand Pounds the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby required and directed to pay accordingly.

WHEREAS the Island of Martinique in the West Indies has been conquered by His Majesty's Forces, under the Command of General Sir Charles Grey and Vice-Admiral Sir John Jervis, and the said Island is now in His Majesty's Possession: And whereas by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act more effectually to prevent, during the present War between Great Britain and France, all traitorous Correspondence with, or Aid or Assistance being given to His Majesty's Enemies," all Persons residing or being in Great Britain are prohibited, under the Penalties of High Treason, during the Continuance of the present War between Great Britain and France, from supplying, to or for the Use of any Person or Persons residing or being within any of the Dominions of France, or any Town, Territory, Port or Place annexed to France, or under the Government of the Persons then exercising, or who might thereafter, during the said War, exercise the Powers of Government in France, divers Articles specified in the said Act, without Licence from His Majesty, under His Sign Manual, or by Order in Council, or by Proclamation first had and obtained, specifying the Articles with respect to which the same shall be had and obtained, and also the Place and Places from which and to which the same shall be sent: His Majesty, taking the Premises into His Royal Consideration, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order,

and it is hereby ordered, that it shall be lawful to and for all Persons, residing or being in Great Britain, to sell, supply and deliver from any Port or Place in Great Britain, or any Part of His Majesty's Dominions in or out of Europe, or in any Country in Amity with His Majesty, to the said Island of Martinique, being in His Majesty's Possession, any of the Articles specified and enumerated in the before mentioned Act, subject, nevertheless, to such Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, Restrictions, Penalties and Forfeitures as the Trade, in the said several Articles to any of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations is or shall be liable to by Law; but it is His Majesty's Pleasure that nothing herein contained shall extend to authorize the Exportation from Great Britain, or from any other of His Majesty's Dominions in or out of Europe, of any of the Articles aforesaid, which are or shall be prohibited to be exported otherwise than by the said Act.

And His Majesty is pleased further to order and declare, and it is hereby further ordered and declared, that all His loving Subjects may lawfully trade to and from the said Island of Martinique, subject, nevertheless, to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, Restrictions, Penalties and Forfeitures, to which the Trade to and from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations and Islands in the West Indies, is or shall be subject by Law.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that all Commodities, being of the Growth, Produce or Manufacture of the said Island of Martinique, being in His Majesty's Possession, shall be permitted to be imported into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, in British Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, subject to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Restrictions, Conditions, Penalties and Forfeitures, as Articles of the like Sort are subject to, coming from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations or Islands in the West Indies.

And His Majesty is pleased further to order and declare, and it is hereby further ordered and declared, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to affect or dispense with any of the Provisions contained in His Majesty's Order in Council, bearing Date this Day, prohibiting the Resort of Aliens to the said Island without Licence for that Purpose.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS it is highly important to the internal Tranquillity and future Security of the Islands, or Territories, Parts of Islands, in the West Indies, which, since the Commencement of the present War, have been conquered by His Majesty's Arms, or surrendered to His Majesty, to prevent, during the Continuance of the said War, too great a Resort to such Islands, or Parts of Islands, of Persons not Subjects to His Majesty, and particularly of such as are Enemies to His Majesty; His Majesty, taking the Premises into His Royal Consideration, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That no Person, being an Alien, who shall have been a Subject of His late Most Christian Majesty, or shall be under the Government of the Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France, shall resort or go to such Parts of the Island of St. Domingo as are or may be in the Possession of His Majesty, or to the Island of Martinique, or to any other Islands or Parts of Islands in the West Indies, Part of the Dominions of His late Most Christian Majesty, which are or may be in the Possession of His Majesty, during the said War, without special Licence first had and obtained from His Majesty, or from the Governour appointed by His Majesty, or, in his Absence, the Lieutenant-Governour so appointed, or the Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Forces at Jamaica or the Leeward Islands respectively, or some Persons or Person authorized to grant such Licence by His Majesty, or by such Commander in Chief at Jamaica or the Leeward Islands respectively: And it is further ordered, that no such Alien shall be permitted to land in any of the said Islands, or Parts of Islands, so in the Possession of His Majesty, without such Licence as aforesaid: But nevertheless His Majesty is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby further ordered and declared, that nothing in this Order contained shall be construed or taken in any Manner to affect any Treaty or Capitulation made or entered into upon the Conquest or Surrender of such Islands or Parts of Islands respectively, or any Article or Thing in any such Treaty or Capitulation contained. And the Governours and Lieutenant-Governours so appointed by His Majesty in the said Islands and Parts of Islands, and the Commanders in Chief of His Majesty's Forces at Jamaica and the Leeward Islands respectively, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have been concerned in advising or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury respecting the Exportation of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes; for preventing Suits in consequence of the same; for authorizing His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying Coastwise of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, and for making further Provisions relative thereto," it was, amongst other Things, enacted, That His Majesty might, by Proclamation or Order in Council when He should see Cause, and for such Time as should be therein expressed, prohibit the exporting or carrying Coastwise, or the attempting to export or carry Coastwise, any Pot or Pearl-Ash, or other Articles, which should be judged by His Majesty to be capable of being converted into Naval or Military Stores, or made useful in increasing Naval or Military Stores; and it was thereby provided that His Majesty might, by special Licence under His Sign Manual, or in such Order in Council or Proclamation, make such Exception with respect to the Exportation or carrying Coastwise of any Pot or Pearl Ash, or other Articles as aforesaid, and such Regulations concerning the Manner of exporting or carrying the same Coastwise, as to Him, with the Advice of His Privy Council, should appear to be proper, specifying the said Articles, and also the Place and Places to and from which the same should or might be so exported or carried Coastwise: And His Majesty, judging it necessary to prohibit the Exportation of Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash, doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, under the Authority of the said Act, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months from the Date of this Order in Council, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Vessel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by the aforementioned Act: But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to the Exportation of the said Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's

His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of the said Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the said Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

**T**HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Mr. Quarre, Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to bear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

*An Act for granting to His Majesty a certain Sum of Money out of the Consolidated Fund, for applying a certain Sum of Money therein mentioned, for the Service*

*of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninety-four, and for further appropriating the Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament.*

*An Act for granting to His Majesty a certain Sum of Money to be raised by a Lottery.*

*An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Duties of Customs on Slate, Stone and Marble.*

*An Act for granting to Majesty the Sum of Two Hundred Thousand Pounds, to be issued and paid to the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, to be by them placed to the Account of the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt.*

*An Act for repealing so much of an Act made in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, as directs that no Cambrick or Lawn shall be imported from Ireland, until the Importation of Cambricks and French Lawns into Ireland shall be prohibited by Law; to allow the Importation of Cambricks and French Lawns from the Austrian Netherlands for a limited Time; for making more effectual an Act, made in the Twenty-fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for the more effectual Prevention of Smuggling in this Kingdom; and for preventing the fraudulent re-landing of Tobacco shipped for Exportation.*

*An Act to empower the East India Company to continue a Bond Debt of Two Millions, and to increase the same by a further Sum, as Circumstances may require.*

*An Act to enable Subjects of France to enlist as Soldiers in Regiments to serve on the Continent of Europe, and in certain other Places; and to enable His Majesty to grant Commissions to Subjects of France, to serve and receive Pay as Officers in such Regiments, or as Engineers, under certain Restrictions.*

*An Act for granting to Foreign Ships, put under His Majesty's Protection, the Privileges of Prize Ships, under certain Regulations and Restrictions; for allowing Aliens in Foreign Colonies, surrendered to His Majesty, to exercise the Occupations of Merchants or Factors; and for repealing an Act, passed in the Twelfth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty, intitled, An Act for granting a Liberty to carry Sugars, of the Growth, Produce or Manufacture of any of His Majesty's Sugar Colonies in America, from the said Colonies directly to Foreign Ports, in Ships built in Great Britain, and navigated according to Law; and also so much of an Act, passed in the Fifteenth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty, as amends the said Act.*

*An Act to amend an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intitled, An Act to provide for the Families of Persons chosen by Lot to serve in the Militia of this Kingdom, and of Substitutes serving therein; and to explain and amend an Act of Parliament, passed in the Twenty-sixth Year of His present Majesty, intitled, An Act for amending and reducing into One Act of Parliament the Laws relating to the Militia in that Part of Great Britain called England; and also an Act, made in this present Session of Parliament, intitled, An Act for augmenting the Militia.*

*An Act to continue an Act, made in the last Session of Parliament, for establishing Courts of Judicature in the Island of Newfoundland; and to revive and continue so much of Two Acts, made in the Tenth and Sixteenth Years of His present Majesty's Reign, as relates to regulating the Fees of the Officers of the Customs, and of the Naval Officers, in the British Colonies in America, and of the Officers of the Customs in the Island of Newfoundland.*

*An Act to enable His Majesty to establish a Court of Criminal Judicature in Norfolk Island.*

*An Act for taking of Special Bail in Actions and Suits depending in the Court of Common Pleas of the County Palatine of Lancaster.*

*An Act for building a new Shire Hall for the County of Stafford.*

An Act for paving, cleansing, lighting, watching, watering, and otherwise improving and keeping in Repair, the Streets, Squares, and other public Passages and Places, which are or shall be made upon certain Pieces of Ground, in the Parishes of Saint Pancras, Saint George the Martyr, and Saint George Bloomsbury, or some or one of them, in the County of Middlesex, belonging to the Hospital for the Maintenance and Education of exposed and deserted young Children, commonly called the Foundling Hospital.

An Act for the better Relief, Regulation, and Employment of the Poor within the Town of Bedford in the County of Bedford.

An Act to alter and amend an Act of the Twenty-third Year of His present Majesty, for improving the Navigation of the River Trent; and for making and maintaining a navigable Canal from the said River, in the Parish of Becon, to join the Nottingham Canal, in the Parish of Lencon in the County of Nottingham; and also certain Cuts on the Side of the said River.

An Act to continue the Term and enlarge the Powers of an Act, made in the Twelfth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intitled, An Act for deepening, cleansing, scouring, preserving and maintaining the Harbour of Ayr; for enlarging and improving the Quays and Piers; for erecting Docks, Breafts, Jettees, and Piers; and for regulating Ships, Lighters, and other Vessels cruising into and going out of the said Harbour; and for other Purposes therein mentioned.

An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the Canal Navigation from Leas to Liverpool to complete the said Navigation, and to vary the Line thereof; and to raise a further Sum of Money for those Purposes; and for making a navigable Branch, therein described, from the intended new Line of the said Canal.

An Act for making and maintaining a navigable Canal, from the Coventry Canal at or near Marston Bridge, in the Parish of Bedworth, in the County of Warwick, to a certain Close in the Parish of Abby-de-la-Zouch, in the County of Leicester, and for continuing the same from thence, in One Line, to the Lime Works at Ticknall, in the County of Derby, and in another Line to the Lime Works at Cloundbill, in the said County of Leicester; with certain Cuts or Branches from the said Canal.

An Act for making and maintaining a navigable Canal from Wisbech River, at or near a Place called the Old Sluice, in the Town of Wisbech, in the Isle of Ely, and County of Cambridge, to join the River Nene, in the Parish of Outwell, in the said Isle of Ely, and in the County of Norfolk, and for improving and maintaining the Navigation of the said River from Outwell Church to Salters's Load Sluice.

An Act to continue the Term and enlarge the Powers of Two Acts made in the Seventeenth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, and the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for continuing the Duty of Two Pennies Scots, or a Sixth Part of a Penny Sterling, upon every Scots Pint of Ale and Beer, which shall be brewed for Sale, brought into, tapped or sold within the Town of Burrowsstonefs, and Liberties thereof, in the County of Linlithgow; and for extending the same over the Parish of Burrowsstonefs; for repairing the Harbour of the said Town; and for other Purposes therein mentioned.

An Act to continue the Term and enlarge the Powers of an Act made in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intitled, An Act for repairing the Roads in the County of Forfar, and for regulating the Statute Labour within the same; and for repairing several other Roads in the said County; and for building a Bridge over the River South Esk, near Finhaven.

An Act to continue the Term and enlarge the Powers of several Acts of Parliament for repairing the Highways between Tyburn and Uxbridge, in the County of Middlesex; and for amending the Road leading from Brent Bridge, over Hanwell Heath, through the Parishes of Hanwell, New Brentford, and Ealing, to the Great Western Road, in the said County; and for lighting, watching and watering the Highway between Tyburn and Kensington Gravel Pits.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of an Act of the Eleventh Year of His present Majesty, for repairing the Road between the Bear Inn in Reading and Puntsfield, in the County of Berks, and several other Roads in the said County.

A Letter, of which the following is a Copy, was this Day received from His Royal Highness the Duke of York, by the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

SIR,

Tourney, May 6, 1794.

SINCE my Arrival here with the Troops on Saturday, nothing particular has happened in this Part.

The Day before Yesterday the Enemy attacked the Post of Rouffelaer, where Colonel Linlithgen was cantoned with One Squadron of the Hanoverian Regiment du Corps, and Two Squadrons of the Tenth Regiment of Light Dragoons. They were, however, repulsed, with the Loss of Three Pieces of Cannon and Two Hundred Men killed.

Colonel Linlithgen, thinking this Post untenable without Infantry, fell back in the Evening to Thourout, and from thence to Bruges; but, having received a Reinforcement, he will again move forwards to Thourout.
