Gower Sutherland, to be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire
of Sutherland ; Archibald Earl of Eglintoun to be
Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of Air ; Francis Earl
of Moray to be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of
Elgin ; Charles William Montagu, Earl of Dalkeith,
to be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of Setkirk ; James
Earl of Fife to be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of
Banff ; Archibald Lord Douglas to be Lord Lieu-
tenant of the Shire of Forfar ; Sir Thomas Dundas,
Baronet, to be Lieutenant of the Shire of Orkney ;
George Graham, Esquire, to be Lieutenant of the

A PROCLAMATION,

For apprehending Archibald Hamilton Rowan.

WHEREAS Archibald Hamilton Rowan, late of
Rathcoffey in the County of Kildare in the
Kingdom of Ireland, Esquire, was, in the last Hilary
Term, committed to His Majesty's Gaol of Newgate
in the City of Dublin in the said Kingdom, under a
Sentence of the Court of King's Bench of the said
Kingdom, of Imprisonment for Two Years, for pub-
lishing a seditious Libel :

And whereas the said Archibald Hamilton Rowan
has lately been charged with High Treason : And
whereas Information on Oath has been received that
the said Archibald Hamilton Rowan did, in the
Night of Thursday the First Day of May instant,
make his Escape from the said Gaol :

We have therefore thought fit, by and with the
Advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal
Proclamation, hereby requiring and commanding all
Our loving Subjects to discover and apprehend, and
cause to be discovered and apprehended, the said
Archibald Hamilton Rowan, and to carry him before
some of Our Justices of the Peace, or Chief Ma-
gistrates of the County, Town or Place where he
shall be apprehended, who are respectively required
to secure him, and thereof to give speedy Notice unto
Our Privy Council, or One of Our Principal Se-
cretaries of State, to the End he may be forth com-
ing, and be dealt withal, and proceeded against,
according to Law. And whoever shall discover and
apprehend the said Archibald Hamilton Rowan, and
bring him before such Justice of Peace or Chief
Magistrate,
