**W**HEREAS the Parliament of this Kingdom stands prorogued to Thursday the Twentieth Day of September instant: We do publish and declare, that the said Parliament be, and accordingly the said Parliament is hereby further prorogued to Thursday the Second Day of October next: Whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons in this present Parliament, are to take Notice accordingly.

*Dublin-Castle, September 23.*

Yesterday being the Anniversary of Their Majesties Coronation, at Noon the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in the Royal Square at the Barracks. In the Evening a Play was given

by his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and every other Demonstration of Joy.
