A PROCLAMATION,
For giving Currency to a new Coinage of Copper
Money of One Penny and Two Penny Pieces.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS in consequence of the unanimous Address of Our Commons of Great Britain, in Parliament assembled, praying that We would be graciously pleased to give Directions that Measures might be taken for an immediate Supply of such Copper Coinage as might be best adapted to the Payment of the Laborious Poor in the present Exigency; We have thought fit to order, that certain Pieces of Copper should be coined, which should go and pass for One Penny and Two Pennies, and that each of such Pieces of One Penny should weigh One Ounce Avoirdupois, and that each of such Two Penny Pieces should weigh Two Ounces Avoirdupois; the intrinsic Value of such Pieces of One Penny and Two Pennies, Workmanship included, corresponding as nearly as possible with the nominal Value of the same respectively; every such Piece having, on one Side thereof, Our Effigies or Portraiture, with Our Name or Title, and on the Reverse, the Figure of Britannia, represented sitting on a Rock in the Sea, holding a Trident in her Left Hand, and a Branch of Olive in her Right Hand, with the Year of our Lord.—And whereas Penny and Two Penny Pieces of Copper, of the Weight and Description aforesaid, have been coined, and will be soon ready for Delivery, according to the Orders which We have given for that Purpose: We have therefore, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby ordain, declare and command, that the said Pieces of Copper Money, so coined as aforesaid, shall be current and lawful Money of Our Kingdom of Great Britain, and shall pass and be received as current and lawful Money of

Our said Kingdom; that is to say, such Penny Pieces as of the Value of One Penny, and such Two Penny Pieces as of the Value of Two Pennies, in all Payments and Transactions of Money; provided that no Person shall be obliged to take more of such Copper Money in any one Payment, than shall be of the Value of One Shilling, after the Rate aforesaid.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twenty-sixth Day of July, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, in the Thirty-seventh Year of Our Reign.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-sixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by his said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Ma-

His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the said Month of February, 1793, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the said Proclamations for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of August next; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the said Thirtieth Day of August next, to the Thirty-first Day of October next inclusive:—Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

THE following Dispatches have been received at this Office by Evan Nepean, Esq;

Ville de Paris, off Cadiz, July 5, 1797.

S I R,

I Desire you will acquaint the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that the Terpsichore, with the Thunder Bomb, having a Detachment of Artillery on Board, and the Urchin Gun-Boat, from Gibraltar, joined on the 2d Instant, and the Night following Rear-Admiral Nelson, having made his Dispositions, the Bomb, covered by the Gun-Boat, Launches and Barges of the Fleet, was placed near the Tower of San Sebastian, and fired some Shells into the Town, when an Attempt was made by the Gun-Boats and Launches of the Enemy to carry her. The Rear-Admiral, who is always present in the most arduous Enterprizes, with the Assistance of some other Barges, boarded and carried Two of the Enemy's Gun-Boats, and a Barge Launch of one of their Ships of War, with the Commandant of the Flotilla. In this short Conflict 18 or 20 Spaniards were killed, the Commandant and several wounded; he and 25 Men made Prisoners; the rest swam ashore.

This spirited Action was performed with considerable Loss on our Part, as per Inclosed. The Launch of the Ville de Paris was sunk by a raking Shot from the Enemy's Gun-Boats; but, by the active, intelligent Mind of Captain Troubridge, got up Yesterday Morning, and repaired on Board the Culoden.

Rear-Admiral Nelson's Actions speak for them-

elves; any Praise of mine would fall very short of his Merit.

S I R,

IN Obedience to your Orders, the Thunderer Bomb was placed, by the good Management of Lieutenant Gourly, her present Commander, assisted by Mr. Jackson, Master of the Ville de Paris, who volunteered his able Services, within 2500 Yards of the Walls of Cadiz, and the Shells were thrown from her with much Precision, under the Direction of Lieutenant Baynes of the Royal Artillery; but unfortunately it was soon found that the large Mortar was materially injured from its former Services; I therefore judged it proper to order her to return under the Protection of the Goliath, Terpsichore, and Fox, who were kept under Sail for that Purpose, and for whose active Services I feel much obliged.

The Spaniards having sent out a great Number of Mortar Gun-Boats and Armed Launches, I directed a vigorous Attack to be made on them, which was done with such Gallantry, that they were drove and pursued close to the Walls of Cadiz, and must have suffered considerable Loss; and I have the Pleasure to inform you, that Two Mortar-Boats and an Armed Launch remained in our Possession.

I feel myself particularly indebted for the successful Termination of this Contest to the Gallantry of Captains Fremantle and Miller, the former of whom accompanied me in my Barge, and to my Coxswain, John Sykes, who, in defending my Person, is most severely wounded, as was Captain Fremantle, slightly, in the Attack: And my Praises are generally due to every Officer and Man, some of whom I saw behave in the most noble Manner, and

I regret

I regret it is not in my Power to particularize them. I must also beg to be permitted to express my Admiration of Don Miguel Tyrason, the Commander of the Gun-Boats, in his Barge; he laid my Boat alongside, and his Resistance was such as to honor a brave Officer, 18 of the 26 Men being killed, and himself and all the Rest wounded. Not having a correct List of the Killed and Wounded, I can only state, that I believe 6 are killed and 220 wounded.

Copy of a Letter from the Earl of St. Vincent, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels employed on the Coast of Portugal, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated on Board His Majesty's Ship Ville de Paris, off Cadiz, the 9th of July, 1797.

S I R,

I Enclose, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, Letters I have lately received from Captain Elphinstone, of His Majesty's Ship the Hamadryad, and the Honourable Courtney Boyle, Commander of His Majesty's Ship the Kangaroo, relating the Capture of some of the Enemy's Vessels.

MY LORD,

I Have the Honour to inform your Lordship, that on my Passage from Plymouth (with the Boyne Transport under my Convoy) in His Majesty's Sloop Kangaroo, on the 22d Instant, Latitude 46. deg. 25 min. N. Longitude 7 deg. 12 min. W. I fell in with and captured La Surprise French Luger Privateer, of 47 Tons, 8 Guns and 48 Men; had been Six Days out of Crovic (Entrance of the Loire), and made no Capture.

I have further to inform your Lordship, that on the 3d Instant; Cadiz bearing E. by S. Distance 17 Leagues, I fell in with and captured La Purissima Conception, a Luger, sent out from Cadiz with a King's Officer and 9 Men, under Orders to cruise for a Brig from the Havannah, having Dispatches for her.

Hamadryad, in Gibraltar-Bay, July 3, 1797.

S I R,

IN Obedience to your Orders, I proceeded to Sea on the 29th of June, light Airs and a strong Current set us a little to the Eastward. On the 30th I fell in with Two Xebecs, one of which we took, and the other, which was a Spanish Privateer, we drove on Shore, the Crew of the former made their Escape. After seeing her safe into Gibraltar Yesterday Morning, I stretched across to Ceuta, and at Two A. M. I fell in with and captured L'Acteon French Cutter Privateer, of 6 Guns, coppered, and 30 Men: I have anchored for the sole Purpose of

putting the Prisoners on board the Prison Ship, and getting my People out of the Prize, and shall weigh again in a few Hours.

Copy of another Letter from the Earl of St. Vincent to Mr. Nepean, dated Ville de Paris, off Cadiz, the 10th of July, 1797.

S I R,

I Desire you will acquaint the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that Rear-Admiral Nelson ordered a second Bombardment of Cadiz on the Night of the 5th, under the Direction of Captain Bowen, of the Terpsichore, Captain Miller, of the Theseus, and Captain Waller, of the Emerald; and appointed Mr. Jackson, Master of the Ville de Paris, to piece the Thunderer, Terror and Strombolo, and that the Bombardment produced considerable Effect in the Town and among the Shipping, Ten Sail of the Line, among them the Ships carrying the Flags of Admirals Mezzaredo and Gravina, having warped out of the Range of Shell with much Precipitation the following Morning; and it is with great Satisfaction I inform you, that this important Service was effected with very little Loss on our Side, as per enclosed Return of Killed and Wounded. The Rear-Admiral meditated another Operation on the Night of Saturday the 8th, under his own Direction, but the Wind blew so strong down the Bay he could not get his Bomb Vessels up to the Point of Attack in Time.

Mr. Hornsey, Master's Mate of the Seahorse, distinguished himself in a very remarkable Manner.

THE Commissioners for carrying into Effect the Sixth Article of the Treaty of Amity, Commerce and Navigation, concluded between His Britannic Majesty and the United States of America, on the 19th Day of November, 1794, having this Day constituted their Board, pursuant and agreeably to the said Treaty, do hereby give Notice, that they are ready to proceed to Business accordingly; and they desire that all Claims under the said Article, (which so far as the same describes the Cases thereby provided for is hereunto annexed) may be lodged with their Secretary without Delay.

They further desire that all such Claims may not only state in what Manner the several Cases come within the Description of the said Article, but also, specially set forth the Nature of the Evidence by which the Claimants respectively undertake to substantiate the same.

EXTRACT FROM THE SAID ARTICLE.

“Whereas it is alleged by divers British Merchants and others, His Majesty's Subjects, that Debts to a considerable Amount, which were bona fide contracted before the Peace, still remain owing to them by Citizens or Inhabitants of the United States; and that, by the Operation of various lawful Impediments since the Peace, not only the full Recovery of the said Debts has been delayed, but also the Value and Security thereof have been in several Instances impaired and lessened; so that, by the ordinary Course of judicial Proceedings, the British Creditors cannot now obtain and actually have and receive full and adequate Compensation for the Losses and Damages which they have thereby sustained; It is agreed that in all such Cases, where full Compensation for such Losses and Damages cannot, for whatever Reason, be actually obtained, had and received by the said Creditors, in the ordinary Course of Justice, the United States will make full and complete Compensation for the same to the said Creditors; but it is distinctly understood that this Provision is to extend to such Losses only as have been occasioned by the lawful Impediments aforesaid, and is not to extend to Losses occasioned by such Insolvency of the Debtors, or other Causes, as would equally have operated to produce such Loss, if the said Impediments had not existed; nor to such Losses or Damages as have been occasioned by the manifest Delay or Negligence, or wilful Omission of the Claimant.”
