" Whereas it is alledged by divers British Merchants and others, His Majesty's Subjects, that Debts to a confiderable Amount, which were bana fide contracted before the Peace, still remain owing to them by Citizens or Inhabitants of the United States; and that, by the Operation of various lawful Impediments fince the Peace, not only the full Recovery of the faid Debts has been delayed, but alfo the Value and Security thereof have been in feveral Infrances impaired and leffened; fo that, by the ordinary Courfe of judicial Proceedings, the British Creditors cannot now obtain and aftually have and receive full and adequate Compensation for the Losses and Damages which they have thereby fustained : It is agreed that in all fuch Cafes, where full Compensation for such Losses and Damages cannot, for whatever Reafon, be actually obtained, had and received by the faid Creditors, in the ordinary Courfe of Jultice, the United States will make full and complete Compensation for the same to the faid Creditors; but it is diffinctly underflood that this Provision is to extend to fuch Losses only as have been occasioned by the lawful Impediments aforefaid, and is not to extend to Losses occasioned by fuch Infolvency of the Debtors, or other Caufes, as would equally have operated to produce fuch Lofs, if the faid Impediments had not existed; nor to such Lofles or Damages as have been occafioned by the manifest Delay or Negligence, or wilful Omission of the Claimant."
