**C**EREMONIAL of the Knighthood and Investiture of Lieutenant-General the Honorable Sir Charles Stuart; of Sir Henry Harvey, Vice-Admiral of the White Squadron of His Majesty's Fleet; and of Sir Andrew Mitchell, Vice-Admiral of the Blue Squadron of His Majesty's Fleet; Knights of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath.

The Dean, the Knights, and the Officers of the Order, attended in the Privy-Chamber in their Mantles, Collars, &c. and proceeded from thence, after the Levee, into the Sovereign's Presence, making the usual Reverences, in the following Order:

Gentleman Usher of the Order, in his Mantle; Chain, and Badge, bearing the Scarlet Rod.

Register and Secretary of the Order, in his Mantle, Chains, and Badges.

Deputy to Bath King of Arms, in the Mantle, Chain, and Badge, and bearing the Sceptre of Bath, carried the Ribbons and Badges of the Order on a Crimson Velvet Cushion.

The Genealogist, in his Mantle, Chain, and Badge. Knights' Companions.

Lord Bridport.

Right Honorable Sir William Fawcett.

The Bishop of Rochester, Dean of the Order, in his Mantle, Chain, and Badge.

His Royal Highness the Duke of York, First and Principal Companion.

Then, by His Majesty's Command, Lieutenant-General the Honorable Charles Stuart was introduced into the Presence between Lord Bridport and the Right Honorable Sir William Fawcett, the Two Junior Knights Companions present, preceded by the Gentleman Usher of the Order, with Reverences as before.

The Sword of State was delivered to the Sovereign by the second Knight in Seniority, and Lieutenant-General the Honorable Charles Stuart kneeling, was knighted therewith. Then His Royal Highness the Duke of York, the Senior Knight, presented the Ribbon and Badge to the Sovereign, and His Majesty put them over the new Knight's Right Shoulder, who being thus invested, had the Honor to kiss His Majesty's Hand.

In like Manner, Vice-Admirals Henry Harvey and Andrew Mitchell were severally introduced into the Presence, knighted and invested with the Ribbon and Badge of the Order, and having likewise kissed His Majesty's Hand, the Procession returned to the Privy Chamber in the Order abovementioned.

The Ceremony was performed in His Majesty's Closet; several Great Officers of the Court being present.

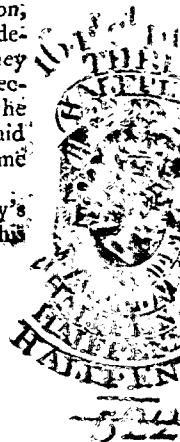

*Extract of a Letter from Mr. Robert Hoffer, Commander of the Private Schooner of War the Revenge, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated Viana, the 16th December 1799.*

I Have the Honor to acquaint you, for the Information of their Lordships, that on the 4th Instant, at Five A. M. in Vigo-Bay, I was attacked by Four Spanish Privateers, Two Schooners, a Brig, and a Lugger, mounting from Four to Fourteen Guns. The Wind being Southerly, I kept up a running Fight till I got clear of the Islands to the Northward, which lasted about Fifteen Minutes, when one of the Schooners having lost her Mainmast, gave up the Chace, and the other Three immediately hauled their Wind; having suffered very much in our Rigging and Sails, it was not in my Power to chase them to Windward, I therefore made sail to the N. W. At Two P. M. saw a Schooner to the Westward, gave Chace; at Three got close alongside, saw she had Spanish Colours flying, desired them to strike; on making no Answer gave them our Broadside, which they returned, and a smart Fire was kept up on both Sides about an Hour, when she blew up close alongside. Our Boat being very much shattered, it was some Time before I could get her ready to hoist out, and I am sorry to say I was enabled to save but Eight of the Crew, who informed me she was the new Privateer Brilliant, Ramo de Castillo, Master, of Eight Guns, Six and Twelve-Pounders; had, when she began the Action, Sixty-three Men; had sailed from Pontevedra that Morning on a Cruise off Oporto, which I am happy in having prevented, as there are at this Time Fifty Sail of Vessels off that Bar, who cannot get in, owing to the Badness of the Weather.

*Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Lord Keith, K. B. Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the Mediterranean, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated Queen Charlotte, at Gibraltar, December 22, 1799.*

SIR,

IN justice to the intrepid Behaviour of Lieutenant Bainbridge, I cannot resist reporting, for their Lordships' Information, that last Evening an English Cutter (the Lady Nelson,) was seen off Cabreta Point, surrounded by French Privateers and Gun-

Vessels all firing; I ordered the Boats from the Queen Charlotte and Emerald to row towards the Enemy, in Hopes it might encourage the Cutter to resist until she could get under our Guns, but she was boarded and taken in Tow by Two of the French Privateers, in which Situation Lieutenant Bainbridge in the Queen Charlotte's Barge, with Sixteen Men, run alongside the Cutter, and after a sharp Conflict, carried her, taking Seven French Officers and Twenty-seven Men Prisoners; Six or Seven more were killed or knocked overboard in the Scuffle: the Privateers cut the Tow-Ropes, and made off close under the Guns of Algaziras, pursued and attacked by Lord Cochrane in the Queen Charlotte's Cutter, which had by this Time got up. Had not the Darkness of the Night prevented the Boats acting in Concert, all the Privateers would have been taken. Lieutenant Bainbridge is severely wounded on the Head by a Stroke from a Sabre, and slightly in other Places, but I trust he is not in Danger.
