first of December last, to declare, that for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, Rice, and Live Stock, might be imported into the said Island, from any of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, by British Subjects, and in British built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, under the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions required by the said Order: And whereas it may be expedient also to allow, for the ensuing Season only, the Importation of salted Beef, Pork, Butter, and of such other Articles of Provision, as may be wanted for the Supply of the said Inhabitants and Fishermen of Newfoundland, from the said United States to the Island of Newfoundland, under the like Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Permission to import into Newfoundland, from the Territories belonging to the United States of America, Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, Rice, and Live Stock, be extended to salted Beef, Pork, Butter, Pease, and such other Articles of Provision as may be wanted for the ensuing Season only, in the Manner, and under the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions required by His Majesty's above recited Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirty-first of December last, and according to the Licence thereunto annexed. *W. 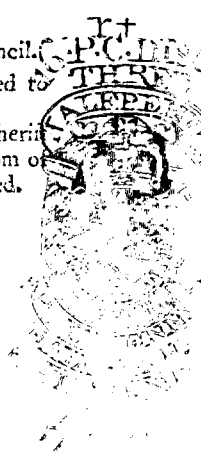
