WHereas it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that, about half-past one o'clock of the morning of the 13th instant, a large-decked lugger, laden with contraband goods, having been discovered in the Downs, and chased by the boats of the Lively cutter, in the service of the Revenue of Excise, and having been boarded by one of the said boats, the crew of the lugger attacked the officer and cutter's men, and, after beating them severely, took a pistol from one of them, and fired it at him, wounded him in the head, and threw him overboard.

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons who have been guilty of this outrageous conduct, is hereby pleased, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually fired at the cutter's man, as stated) who shall discover his or their accomplices, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

Office of Ordnance, February 14, 1812.

THE Principal Officers of His Majesty's Ordnance do hereby give notice, that proposals will be received at their Office in Pall-Mall, on or before Monday the 2d day of March next, from such persons as may be willing to undertake the raising of River Ballast, by means of a steam engine, for the service of the Royal Engineer Department at Woolwich, and for the term of two years, at per ton.

The ballast must consist of gravel procured from the River near the Royal Arsenal, and be delivered into Ordnance barges alongside the engine.

The daily supply required will be from 300 to 600 tons, and the steam engine must commence working within three weeks from the date of the proposal being accepted.

Further particulars may be known at the Secretary's Office, in Pall-Mail aforesaid, any day between the hours of ten and four o'clock; where the proposals must be delivered, sealed up, and indorsed "Proposals for River Ballast;" but no proposal can be admitted after the said 2d day of March, at twelve o'clock at noon of the same day; neither will any tender be noticed, unless the party making it, or an agent in his behalf, shall attend.
