PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in
Council.

WHEREAS, in consequence of information having been received of a Declaration of War by the Government of the United States of America against His Majesty, and of the issue of Letters of Marque and Reprisal by the said Government against His Majesty and his subjects, an Order in Council, bearing date the thirty-first of July last, was issued, directing that American ships and goods should be brought in and detained till further orders; and whereas His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, acting in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, forbore at that time to direct Letters of Marque and Reprisal to be issued against the ships, goods, and citizens of the said United States of America, under the expectation that the said Government would, upon the notification of the Order in Council of the twenty-third of June last, forthwith recall and annul the said Declaration of War against His Majesty, and also annul the said Letters of Marque and Reprisal:

And whereas the said Government of the United States of America, upon due notification to them of the said Order in Council of the twenty-third of June last, did not think fit to recall the said Declaration of War and Letters of Marque and Reprisal, but have proceeded to condemn and persisted in condemning the ships and property of His Majesty's subjects as prize of war, and have refused to ratify a suspension of arms agreed upon between Lieutenant-General Sir George Prevost, His Majesty's Governor-General of Canada, and General Dearborn, commanding the American forces in the Northern Provinces of the United States, and have directed hostilities to be recommenced in that quarter:

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, acting in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, is hereby pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that General Reprisals be granted against the ships, goods,

and citizens of the United States of America, and others inhabiting within the territories thereof (save and except any vessels to which His Majesty's licence has been granted, or which have been directed to be released from the embargo, and have not terminated the original voyage on which they were detained and released), so that as well His Majesty's fleets and ships, as also all other ships and vessels that shall be commissioned by Letters of Marque or General Reprisals, or otherwise by His Majesty's Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, shall and may lawfully seize all ships, vessels, and goods belonging to the Government of the United States of America, or the citizens thereof, or others inhabiting within the territories thereof, and bring the same to judgment in any of the Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's dominions; and to that end His Majesty's Advocate-General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are forthwith to prepare the draught of a commission, and present the same to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent at this Board, authorising the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, or any person or persons by them empowered and appointed, to issue forth and grant Letters of Marque and Reprisals to any of His Majesty's subjects, or others whom the said Commissioners shall deem fitly qualified in that behalf, for the apprehending, seizing, and taking the ships, vessels, and goods belonging to the Government of the United States of America, or the citizens thereof, or others inhabiting within the countries, territories, or dominions thereof (except as aforesaid), and that such powers and clauses be inserted in the said Commission as have been usual, and are according to former precedents; and His Majesty's Advocate-General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are also forthwith to prepare the draught of a Commission, and present the same to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent at this Board, authorising the said Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral to will and require the High Court of Admiralty of Great Britain, and the Lieutenant and Judge of the said Court, the Surrogate or Surrogates, as also the several Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's dominions, to take cognizance of, and judicially proceed upon all and all

manner of captures, seizures, prizes, and reprisals of all ships and goods that are or shall be taken, and to hear and determine the same, and, according to the course of Admiralty and the laws of nations, to adjudge and condemn all such ships, vessels, and goods as shall belong to the Government of the United States of America, or the citizens thereof, or to others inhabiting within the countries, territories, and dominions thereof (except as aforesaid); and that such powers and clauses be inserted in the said Commission as have been usual, and are according to former precedents; and they are likewise to prepare and lay before His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, at this Board, a draught of such instructions as may be proper to be sent to the Courts of Admiralty in His Majesty's Foreign Governments and plantations, for their guidance herein, as also another draught of instructions for such ships as shall be commissioned for the purpose above-mentioned.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is nevertheless pleased hereby to declare, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, that nothing in this Order contained shall be understood to recall or affect the Declaration which His Majesty's Naval Commander on the American station has been authorised to make to the Government of the United States of America—namely, that His Royal Highness, animated by a sincere desire to arrest the calamities of war, has authorised the said Commander to sign a Convention, recalling and annulling, from a day to be named, all hostile Orders issued by the respective Governments, with a view of restoring without delay the relations of amity and commerce between His Majesty and the United States of America.

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifty-second year of His Majesty, intituled "An Act to repeal so much of an Act of the forty-third of His present Majesty, as permits the importation of goods and commodities from Turkey, Egypt, or the Levant Seas, in foreign ships;" it is enacted that the said Act of the forty-third of His present Majesty shall, from and after the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and twelve, be repealed, and such goods and commodities as were thereby allowed to be imported, shall not, after the first day of November aforesaid, be imported into any part of the United Kingdom in any

other than British-built ships or vessels, owned, navigated, and registered according to law; provided nevertheless, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by His Order in Council, to permit during the present hostilities, and until six months after the ratification of a definitive treaty of peace, any goods or commodities heretofore usually imported from Turkey or Egypt, or from any place within the dominions of the Grand Seigneur, within the Levant Seas, to be imported in any ship or vessel whatever, navigated with foreign seamen.

And whereas it is found that certain neutral ships or vessels, which had proceeded under the provisions of the before mentioned Acts, for the purpose of importing goods and commodities as permitted by the said Acts, into the ports of the United Kingdom, will not be able to arrive in the said ports, previous to the first day of November next:

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the goods and commodities aforesaid, permitted to be imported by the aforesaid Acts, shall be permitted and are hereby permitted to be imported in neutral vessels, into any port or ports of the United Kingdom, until the first day of January next; subject to all duties of Customs and Excise, and to all rules and regulations and conditions, and to all penalties and forfeitures, as prescribed by the aforesaid Act passed in the fifty-second year of His present Majesty.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the necessary measures herein as to them shall respectively appertain.

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, was pleased, by His Order in Council, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, bearing date the twenty-eighth of February one thousand eight hundred and eleven, to direct that certain questions, in addition to the preliminary questions directed by His Majesty's general Order in Council of the fifth of April one thousand eight hundred and five, touching the performance of quarantine, should be put to the commander, master, or other person having the charge of any ships or vessels coming from or having touched at any port or place on the continent of America, or the islands adjacent thereto, or coming from, or having touched at, any of the ports in the West Indies; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the following question should be placed at the head of the several questions so directed to be put by the Order in

Council of the twenty-eighth of February one thousand eight hundred and eleven, viz.

“ In the course of your voyage have any persons
“ on board suffered from sickness of any kind;
“ what was the nature of such sickness; and when
“ did it prevail? How many persons were affected
“ by it? And have any of them died in the course
“ of the voyage?”

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is thereupon pleased to order, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that the question above set forth be placed at the head of the several questions directed to be put by the aforementioned Order in Council of the twenty-eighth of February one thousand eight hundred and eleven, to the commanders, masters, or other persons having charge of ships or vessels coming from, or having touched at any port or place on the Continent of America, or the islands adjacent thereto, or coming from, or having touched at, any of the ports in the West Indies; and His Royal Highness is further pleased to order, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice aforesaid, that such commanders, masters, or other persons having charge of such ships or vessels, shall, upon such question being put by the Superintendent of Quarantine, or his assistant, or principal officer or other officer of the Customs, authorized by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, or any four or more of them, to act in that behalf, give a true answer to the same in writing, or otherwise; and upon oath, or not upon oath, according as he shall be required by such superintendent or his assistant, or principal officer or other officer of the Customs, authorized as aforesaid, under such pains and penalties as are inflicted by an Act passed in the forty-fifth year of His Majesty's reign, intitled “ An Act for making further Provision for the effectual Performance of Quarantine;” and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General, and the rest of the principal officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief for the time being of the isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

A PROCLAMATION,

For Dissolving this present Parliament, and Declaring the calling of another.

GEORGE, P. R.

WHEREAS We, acting in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, think fit, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Coun-

cil, to dissolve this present Parliament, which stands prorogued to Friday the second day of October next; We do therefore, acting as aforesaid, publish this Proclamation, and do hereby dissolve the said Parliament accordingly; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are discharged from their meeting and attendance on the said Friday the second day of October next: And We being desirous and resolved, as soon as may be, to meet His Majesty's people, and to have their advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all His Majesty's loving subjects Our will and pleasure to call a new Parliament; and do hereby further declare, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, that, with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, We have this day given order that the Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain, and the Chancellor of Ireland, do respectively forthwith issue out writs, in due form and according to law, for calling a new Parliament: And We do hereby also, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, by this Proclamation under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, require writs forthwith to be issued accordingly by the said Chancellors respectively, for causing the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons who are to serve in the said Parliament, to be duly returned to, and give their attendance in, the said Parliament; which writs are to be returnable on Tuesday the twenty-fourth day of November next.

GOD SAVE THE KING.

A PROCLAMATION,

In order to the electing and summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland.

GEORGE, P. R.

WHEREAS We have, acting in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, thought fit to declare Our pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, on Tuesday the twenty-fourth day of November next ensuing the date hereof: In order therefore to the electing and summoning the sixteen Peers of Scotland, who are to sit in the House of Peers in the said Parliament; We do, acting as aforesaid, by the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, issue forth this Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holyrood-House, in Edinburgh, on Friday the thirteenth day of November next ensuing, between the hours of twelve and two in the afternoon, to nominate and choose the six-

teen Peers to sit and vote in the House of Peers, in the said ensuing Parliament, by open election and plurality of voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the proxies of such as shall be absent (such proxies being Peers, and producing a mandate in writing, duly signed before witnesses, and both the constituent and proxy being qualified according to law). And the Lord Clerk Register, or such two of the principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such meeting, and to administer the oaths required by law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their votes; and immediately after such election made and duly examined, to certify the names of the sixteen Peers so elected, and sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the electors, and return such certificate into the High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: And We do, by this Proclamation, strictly command and require the Provost of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the said City, to take especial care to preserve the peace thereof during the time of the said election, and to prevent all manner of riots, tumults, disorders, and violence whatsoever. And We strictly charge and command, that this Proclamation be duly published at the Market-Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the county towns of Scotland, twenty-five days at least before the time hereby appointed for the meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such election.

VICE-ADMIRAL SIR SAMUEL HOOD, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's ships and vessels in the East Indies, has transmitted to John Wilson Croker, Esq. two letters from Captain Crawford, of His Majesty's ship the Hussar, dated in Macassar Road, the 10th of March, and off Sidayo, the 20th of April last; the former stating the occupation of Macassar by the detachment sent for that purpose, under Captain Phillips of the Madras army, the French Commandant having surrendered without opposition; and the latter giving an account of the conclusion of a Treaty of Peace and Alliance with the Rajah of Boni, the most powerful Prince in that country, and of a perfect good understanding subsisting between the English and all the other powers; as also of the quiet possession of the small forts and places formerly occupied by the Dutch.

Sir Samuel Hood has also transmitted a letter from Captain Thurston, of His Majesty's sloop Hesper, stating, that the British flag had been established at Coepang, in the island of Timor.

Extract of a Letter from Captain Huskisson, of His Majesty's Ship the Barbadoes, to John Wilson Croker, Esq. dated at Sea, August 22, 1812.

I BEG you will be pleased to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that in latitude 31 deg. N. longitude 75 deg. W. His Majesty's ship under my command, after a chase of seven hours, this day captured the United States revenue schooner James Madison, commanded by George Brooks, pierced for fourteen guns, and had ten mounted, two of which were thrown overboard in the chase, with a complement of sixty-five men; out from Savannah seven days, and has made no captures. She is coppered and copper-fastened, is two years old, and sails remarkably fast.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the forty-
third year of His present Majesty's reign,
intituled "An Act for permitting certain Goods
imported into Great Britain to be secured in
Warehouses without Payment of Duty," it is
enacted, that it should be lawful for the importer
or importers, proprietor or proprietors, consignee
or consignees of any of the goods, wares, or
merchandize enumerated or described in the table
thereunto annexed, marked (B); and which shall
be legally imported and brought into the port
of London, to lodge and secure the same under the
joint locks of the Crown and the London Dock
Company, in any warehouse or warehouses, erected
or to be erected, situate within the premises
of the London Dock Company, without pay-
ment at the time of the first entry of such goods,
wares, and merchandize, of the duties of Customs
or Excise due on the importation thereof; subject
nevertheless to the rules, regulations, and restric-
tions therein contained; provided that no such
goods, wares, or merchandize should be so lodged
or secured, unless and until such warehouses or
other works belonging or to belong thereto, should
be so far completed that in the judgement of the
Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His
Majesty's Treasury for the time being, or any
three or more of them, the same shall be fit and
proper in every respect for the reception of such
goods, wares, and merchandize, and wherein the
same might respectively be safely and securely
lodged, and remain under the regulations and di-
rections in the said act contained; and the said
Lord High Treasurer, or Commissioners of His
Majesty's Treasury for the time being, or any three
or more of them, were thereby authorized and em-
powered, in writing under his or their hand or hands,
to certify and make known his or their approba-
tion of such warehouses, which certificate should be
published three times at least in the London Ga-
zette, and in two or more public morning news-

papers usually circulated in London : And whereas the table marked (B) above referred to, is in the words following ; viz.
