EARL Bathurst, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has this day notified, by command of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, to the Ministers of Friendly Powers resident at this Court, that the restrictions heretofore imposed on the ports of Italy shall immediately cease, and be suspended; and that it shall be lawful for His Majesty's subjects to trade in the same manner as they had before traded in times of Peace, between His Majesty's dominions, and the ports of Italy from which the British flag is not excluded.

AT the Court at *Carlton-House*, the 21st of April 1814,

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

HIS Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the restrictions heretofore imposed on the ports of Italy shall immediately cease, and be suspended, and that it shall be lawful for His Majesty's subjects to trade in the same manner as they had before traded in times of peace, between His Majesty's dominions, and the ports of Italy from which the British flag is not excluded:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Judge of the High

Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice Admiralty, are to take the necessary measures herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS, by virtue of the powers vested in His Majesty, by sundry Acts of Parliament, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent was pleased, by His Order in Council of the twentieth of February one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to allow, and did thereby allow, until the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, the importation into any port or place of Great Britain, of certain articles of provisions, in the manner and under the conditions therein mentioned; and whereas by an Act passed
