And those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Gentleman who is to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office, on Tuesday the 26th instant, before twelve o'clock, in order that they may be submitted for the King's approbation, it being His Majesty's command, that no presentations at the Levee shall hereafter be made but in conformity with the above regulations.

The State Apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court until one o'clock.

A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, R.

**W**HEREAS Alexander Earl of Balcarres was duly elected and returned to be one of the sixteen Peers of Scotland, to sit in the House of Peers in the present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and is since deceased; in order to the electing another Peer of Scotland to sit in his room, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holyrood-House, in Edinburgh, on Thursday the second day of June next, between the hours of twelve and two in the afternoon, to nominate and choose another Peer of Scotland, to sit and vote in the House of Peers of this present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in the room of the said Alexander Earl of Balcarres, deceased, by open election and plurality of voices of the Peers that shall then be present, and of the proxies of such as shall be absent (such proxies being Peers, and producing a mandate in writing, duly signed before witnesses, and both constituent and proxy being qualified according to law), and the Lord Clerk Register, or such two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such

meeting, and to administer the oaths required by law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their votes; and immediately after such election made and duly examined, to certify the name of the Peer so elected, and sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the electors, and return such certificate into the High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And We strictly charge and command that this Proclamation be duly published at the Market-Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the county towns in Scotland, twenty-five days, at least, before the time hereby appointed for the meeting of the said Peers to proceed on such election.

Given at Our Court at Carlton-House, the twentieth day of April one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, and in the sixth year of Our reign.

**H**IS Majesty having been pleased to appoint Henry Viscount Maynard to be Lord Lieutenant of the county of Essex, his Lordship this day took the oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

VICE-ADMIRAL Sir Harry Neale has transmitted to this Office a letter from Captain Hamilton, of the *Cambrian*, stating that two piratical vessels, carrying one gun and about thirty men each, were captured on the 31st of January last, in the Channel of Negropont, by the boats of His Majesty's ships *Cambrian* and *Seringapatam*, under the orders of Lieutenant Marsham, First of the *Cambrian*.

When these pirates were first discovered, they were in chase of an Ionian vessel; and there being reason to suspect (as was afterwards found to be the fact), that they had shortly before plundered another vessel under the same flag, Captain Hamilton sent Lieutenant Marsham in one of the *Cambrian's* boats, with a Greek interpreter, to desire that they would come down to His Majesty's ships for examination; but the pirates having refused to comply with this desire, Lieutenant Marsham was joined by the other boats of the *Cambrian*, and by those of the *Seringapatam*, sent by Captain Hamilton's orders to his support.

On the approach of the boats, the pirates com-

menced firing upon them from their guns, and with musketry, and persevered in so doing, notwithstanding the endeavour of Lieutenant Marsham to prevail upon them to desist, who, after exhausting, even under their fire, every means of persuasion, was obliged at last to attack them, and the pirate vessels were then, in the most gallant manner, boarded and carried, after a desperate resistance on the part of their crews, of whom few only could be taken prisoners, the greater number being killed or wounded.

The Officers and men of His Majesty's ships, employed in the boats, acquitted themselves on this occasion with the utmost gallantry, and the whole of their conduct is noticed by Captain Hamilton in terms of high commendation.

**WHEREAS** it has been humbly represented to the King, that, some evil disposed person or persons did, on the night of Thursday the 24th of March last, and again on the night of Monday the 4th of April instant, feloniously set fire to the White Horse public house, in North-street, in the parish of Bishop's-Stortford, in the

occupation of Mrs. Mary Bium, and also did on the night of Tuesday the 5th of April instant, feloniously set fire to a barn, used as a carpenter's shop, in Hockerill, in the parish of Bishop's-Stortford aforesaid, in the occupation of Samuel Warner, which communicated to an adjoining barn, in the occupation of Mr. Robert Cole; subsequent to which an anonymous letter has been addressed to "The Committee at the Vestry," threatening that the said town of Bishop's-Stortford shall be laid in ashes, if two persons therein named are not released from prison, and alluding to a reward which had been offered for the discovery of the offenders in the above-mentioned felonies. And whereas it hath been further represented unto the King that in the night of the 16th, or early in the morning of the 17th instant, the house of Mr. William Francis, of North-street, in Bishop Stortford aforesaid, was burglariously entered and set fire to in two different places, and that at the same time a barn, or outhouse adjoining thereto, was also set on fire;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the felonies above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually set fire to the said respective premises, and except the writer and sender of the said threatening letter), who shall discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

ONE HUNDRED GUINEAS for the discovery of the offender or offenders in the case of the two fires at the White Horse public house, on the 24th of March and 4th of April above-mentioned. **THE** Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed money for the payment of half-pay to Sea Officers, from the 1st January to the 31st March 1825, according to His Majesty's establishment in that behalf; these are to give notice, that the several payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office, by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at ten o'clock in the morning, on the following days, viz.

On the 2d, 3d, and 4th of May, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

On the 5th, 6th, 9th, 10th, and 11th of May, to Lieutenants and Chaplains, and their Attornies.

On the 12th and 13th of May, to Masters, Surgeons, and Pursers, and their Attornies.

After which the lists will be recalled the first and third Wednesday in every month, that all persons may then and there attend, to receive what may become payable to them, and bring with them an affidavit as required by Order in Council of 30th July 1819, the forms of which were published in an advertisement from this Office, dated 16th September 1819, and may be procured at the Office of the Treasurer of the Navy; and in case any of the said Officers should not be able to attend themselves, but employ Attornies for that purpose, the said Attornies are to produce similar affidavits from the persons they are employed by.

Where Officers are abroad on leave, their agents are to produce attested copies of such leave, before the half-pay can be paid.

And as by Act of Parliament, passed in the thirty-fifth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious method for the payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the twentieth clause of the said Act, "that if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive half-pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near the place of his residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, in London, to have such half-pay paid at or near the place of his residence, &c. in the manner pointed out by the said Act;" and by a further Act, passed in the fifty-sixth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for enabling the Officers in His Majesty's Navy, and their representatives, to draw for and receive their half-pay," it is enacted by the first and third clauses of the said Act, "that if any Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be entitled to receive any sum of money for or on account of his half-pay, shall be desirous of drawing a bill of exchange for the same upon the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, instead of receiving the same by remittance bill, he shall signify such desire, by letter, to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy; and that if any Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be entitled to receive any sum of money for or on account of half-pay, shall be desirous of having his half-pay paid to him by extract at any of His Majesty's Dock-Yards where Clerks for the payment of wages for the Navy shall reside, instead of receiving the same by remittance bill or bill of exchange, he is to apply either to the proper Clerk, at the Navy Pay-Office, in London, or at the Pay-Office at such Dock-Yard, signifying such his desire;" notice is hereby further given, that the half-pay ending the 31st of March last, will commence paying on the 2d of May; and all persons desirous of drawing for or of having their half-pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed.
