THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act for carrying into " effect the reports of the Commissioners ap-" pointed to consider the state of the Established " Church in England and Wales, with reference " to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as " they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and " patronage;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, tituled " An Act to alter and amend the law "relating to ecclesiastical houses of residence," duly prepared and laid before Her Mjesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of April, in the year one thousand eight "hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect the "reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in "England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they "relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act

" to alter and amond the law relating to eccle
" siastical houses of residence," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for improving the demesnes adjoining to the episcopal house of residence of the see of Oxford.

"Whereas it is by the first recited Act enacted, that, for the purpose of providing the bishop of any diocese with a more suitable residence than that which at the time of the passing the said Act belonged to his see, sanction be given where it may be necessary for the borrowing by any bishop of a sum not exceeding two years income of his see, upon such terms as shall appear to be proper:

"And whereas it is by the said secondly recited Act enacted, that whenever it shall appear to be expedient to improve the demesnes of any episcopal house of residence, it shall be lawful, by the authority provided in the first recited Act, with the consent under the hand and episcopal seal of the bishop, to make such arrangements as may by such authority be deemed most expedient for improving the demesnes adjoining to such house, by the purchase of any land, tenement, or hereditament in the immediate neighbourhood or within the view thereof, and that so much of the said first recited Act, as relates to the providing of any bishop with a more suitable and convenient residence, shall be extended so as to include and apply to the purposes of the said secondly recited Act; and that in case such a deficiency would be created in the average annual income of any bishop appointed after the passing of the said first recited Act, by the effecting of any mortgage or other arrangement under either of the said recited Acts, so as to reduce such income below the average annual income of such bishop named in the said first recited Act, it shall be lawful by the authority aforesaid, out of any monies from time to time standing to the credit and account of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, being part of payments from the larger sees, respectively, towards the augmentation of the incomes of the bishops of the smaller sees, if it shall be deemed fit, and if such monies, after duly considering all the claims thereon, shall appear to be sufficient for such purposes, to make any arrangements for preventing such deficiency which by the like authority shall be deemed expedient:

in And whereas it has been deemed expedient, with the consent of the Right Reverend Samuel Bishop of Oxford, in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand and episcopal seal, to effect certain improvements in the demesnes adjoining to the episcopal house of residence belonging to the see of Oxford, situate at Cuddesden, in the county of Oxford, partly by the exchange of certain lands, under the provisions of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled " An Act for " facilitating the enclosure of open and arable " fields in England and Wales;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of the reign of your Majesty, intituled " An Act to extend the powers " and provisions of the several Acts of Parlia-" ment relating to the enclosure of open and " arable fields in England and Wales," and partly by the purchase and pulling down of a certain public-house and certain cottages in the immediate neighbourhood, and within view of such house of residence, and by turning certain roads and paths, and making certain walls, gates, and fences, and providing certain out-buildings, so as to render the said house of residence more suitable and convenient, according to a plan which has been approved by us under our common seal, and the expense of which improvements has been estimated at the sum of one thousand three hundred pounds:

"And whereas a deficiency would be created in the average annual income of the Bishop of Oxford if a sum sufficient to defray such expense were to be raised by mortgage of the lands belonging to the said see under the power for that purpose contained in the said first recited Act:

"And whereas we deem it fit that, out of the monies standing to our credit and account, being part of payments from the larger sees, respectively, towards the augmentation of the incomes of the bishops of the smaller sees, provision should be made for preventing such deficiency, and that, after duly considering all the claims on the said monies, we find that they will be sufficient for the purpose:

"And whereas it has been agreed between us and the said Samuel Bishop of Oxford, that all the costs; charges, and expenses in and about the completion of such improvements and incidental

thereto, over and above the said sum of one thousand three hundred pounds, shall be defrayed by the said Samuel Bishop of Oxford, his executors or administrators:

Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that, upon an agreement in writing, to the effect hereinbefore mentioned, with such conditions and covenants as may appear necessary for fully carrying into effect the arrangement aforesaid, being executed by the said Samuel. Bishop of Oxford and by us, there shall be applied and paid, out of such monies so standing as aforesaid to our credit and account, to such persons, at such time, and in such manner, as in and by the said agreement shall be provided, such sum or sums of money, not exceeding the sum of one thousand three hundred pounds in the whole, as may be necessary for completing the said additions, alterations, and improvements.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or any of them."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Oxford.

HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed

in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act "to amend and render more effectual an Act, "passed in the last session of Parliament, for "building, and promoting the building, of ad-"ditional churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of April one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, viz.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration: all the circumstances of the parish of Wolverton, in the county of Buckingham, and within the diocese of Oxford, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act to amend and render " more effectual an Act, passed in the last session " of Parliament, for building, and promoting the " building, of additional churches in populous " parishes," be assigned to the church, called Saint George's Church, recently erected and consecrated, and situate upon the confines of the station belonging to the London and Birmingham Railway Company, in the said parish of Wolverton, and that such district should comprize all the land, houses, and ground constituting such station, and situate within the limits thereof, and also the said church, and the burial ground and parsonagehouse and grounds belonging to the Minister of that church; and that such district should be named, " The Chapelry District of Saint George, Wolverton," with boundaries as follow:

"On or towards the north and east by the Grand Junction Canal; and on or towards the south and west by land belonging to the Trustees of the Radcliffe Charity Estate, as such district is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink:

"That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized and performed in the said church, called Saint George's Church; and that all the fees arising therefrom should be paid and should belong to the Minister for the time being of such church:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Samuel Bishop of Oxford has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Samuel Bishop of Oxford has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, one month at least before such petition shall be so considered:

And whereas the inhabitant householders of the boroughs of Honiton, in the county of Devon, and Yeovil, in the county of Somerset, have presented petitions to Her Majesty in Council, praying, that charters of incorporation may be granted to the said boroughs respectively; Her Majesty was this day pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said petitions be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on Wednesday the twenty-fourth day of June next.

HEREAS in pursuance of notices duly published in the months of October and November last, in accordance with the Standing Orders of Parliament, a Bill has been introduced, and is now pending in the Honourable the House of Commons, for the purpose of extending the line of the Ipswich and Bury St. Edmund's Railway to Ely, and for making a branch therefrom to Newmarket; and whereas since the deposit of the plans and sections, and books of reference relating to the said extension and branch, with the several Clerks of the Peace for the counties of Suffolk, Cambridge, and the isle of Ely, in the county of Cambridge, in accordance with such notices, a deviation or alteration in the line of the said proposed branch to Newmarket, as hereinafter defined, has been determined upon, with the consent of the several owners, lessees, and occupiers of the lands in or through which such deviation or alteration is intended to pass;

Notice is hereby, therefore, given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present session, for powers to be inserted in the said Bill, so pending as aforesaid, to enable the Ipswich and Bury St. Edmund's Railway Company to make a deviation or alteration in the line of the said branch railway to Newmarket, commencing at or near a certain field, in the parish of Kentford, and numbered 5 and 9 on the plans deposited as aforesaid, passing thence from, in, through, or into the several parishes, townships, and extra-parochial places of Kentford and Moulton, in the county of Suffolk, and Ashley-cum-Sylverley, Cheveley, and Wood Ditton, in the county of Cambridge, and terminating by a junction with the line-of-a proposed railway from Chesterford to Newmarket, in or near a certain field, in the parish of Wood Ditton, numbered 44 and 45, or one of them, on the said plans; and to abandon so much of the line of the said branch, as delineated upon the said plans, as by reason of the said proposed deviation and alteration will be rendered useless.

And notice is also given, that, on or before the twentieth day of May instant, plans and sections, shewing the line and levels of the said proposed deviation or alteration, together with a book of reference to such plan, containing the names of the owners or reputed owners, lessees or reputed lessees, and occupiers of the lands through which such deviations or alterations will pass, will be deposited, for public inspection, with the several Clerks of the Peace for the counties of Suffolk and Cambrige, and the isle of Ely, in the said county of Cambridge; and that a copy of so much of the said plan, section, and book of reference, as relates to each parish in or through which such deviation or alteration is intended to pass, will be deposited, for public inspection, on or before the same period, with the clerk of each such parish.
