AT the Council-Chamber, Whitehall, the 30th day of November, 1854,

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords of the Council, having taken into consideration the expediency of prohibiting the exportation of certain additional articles capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of Military and Naval Stores (in pursuance of Her Majesty's Proclamation of the eighteenth February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four), are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Officers of Her Majesty's Customs do hereafter prevent the exportation of Lead and of Nitrate of Soda, and likewise of Blue Lias, Portland Cement, or any article commonly used in the manufacture of Marine Cement, to any place in Europe north of Dunkirk, and that the Officers of Her Majesty's Customs do permit the export of the articles herein mentioned to any other part of the world upon taking from the persons exporting the same, a bond that they shall be landed and entered at the port of destination :

Whereof the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury and the Commissioners of Customs, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly. *C. C. Greville.*

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament, held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for rendering more easy the taking the poll at county elections," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time, on petition from the justices of any county, riding, parts, or division in England or Wales, in quarter sessions assembled, representing that the number of polling places for such county, riding, parts, or division is insufficient, and praying that the place or places mentioned in the said petition may be a polling place or polling places for the county, riding,

parts, or division, of the county within which such place or places is or are situate, to declare that any place or places mentioned in the said petition shall be a polling place or polling places for that county, riding, parts, or division, and that the justices of the peace for such county, riding, parts, or division, in quarter sessions or some special sessions assembled, as mentioned in the Act, passed in the third year of the reign of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act to settle and determine the divisions of counties and the limits of cities and boroughs in England and Wales, in so far as respects the election of Members to serve in Parliament," shall, conformably to the said last-mentioned Act, divide such county, riding, parts, or division, into convenient polling districts, and assign one of such districts to each polling place ;

And whereas the justices of the peace for the county of Stafford, in quarter sessions assembled, have presented a petition to Her Majesty in Council, representing that the number of polling places for the southern division of the said county is insufficient, and praying that Old Hill, in the parish of Rowley Regis, and Brierley Hill, in the parish of Kingswinford, may be polling places for the said southern division, within which such places are situate ;

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, having taken the said petition into consideration, is pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to declare, order, and direct, that the Old Hill, in the parish of Rowley Regis, and Brierley Hill, in the parish of Kingswinford, shall be polling places for the southern division of the county of Stafford ; and that the justices of the peace for the said county, in quarter sessions or some special sessions assembled, as mentioned in the said Act, passed in the third year of His late Majesty's reign, shall, conformably to the said last-mentioned Act, divide such southern division into convenient polling districts, and assign one of such districts to each polling place.
