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**A**T the Court at *Osborne House, Isle of Wight*, the 16th day of *August*, 1886.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Report of the Right Honourable the Lords of a Committee of Council, dated the sixth of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, in the words following, viz. :—

“ Your Majesty having been pleased by Your Order in Council of the twenty-sixth June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, to refer unto this Committee the humble petition of the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Bolton, in the county of Lancaster, in Council assembled, the thirteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, setting forth :—

“ That by an Act of Parliament passed in the thirty-second year of the reign of Your Majesty (thirty-one and thirty-two Vict. c. one hundred and thirty), known by the short title of ‘ The Salford Hundred Court of Record Act, 1868,’ a Court of Record was constituted to be called ‘ The Court of Record for the Hundred of Salford, in the county of Lancaster.’

“ That the said Hundred of Salford, as in the said Act defined, includes the whole of the Municipal Borough of Bolton, and the said Court has and exercises its jurisdiction within that borough.

“ That by the said Act the said Court has authority, to try—

- “ 1. Personal actions, if the cause of action arose within the Hundred, and the debt or damages sought to be recovered do not exceed fifty pounds.
- “ 2. Certain actions of ejectment between landlord and tenant.
3. “ Any action whatsoever (except for libel, slander, or seduction, when the damages claimed exceed fifty pounds), provided a consent to the jurisdiction of the Court be signed by the parties, and filed as in the Act mentioned.

“ That by the preamble of the Statute made and passed in the session of Parliament holden in the ninth and tenth years of Your Majesty's reign, chap. ninety-five (‘ The County Court Act, 1846’) it is declared that it is expedient that one rule and manner of proceeding for the recovery of small debts and demands should prevail throughout England, and under the said Act the County Court of Lancashire, holden at Bolton,

has been established, and has jurisdiction throughout the whole of the borough of Bolton.

“ That the said County Court has cognizance of all actions in respect of which the Salford Hundred Court has jurisdiction within the said borough.

“ That it is provided by an Act passed in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Your Majesty, ‘ The County Court Act, 1852,’ that, upon the petition of the Council of any city or borough within the limits of which a Court of Local Jurisdiction other than a County Court is established, or into the limits of which the jurisdiction of such Court of Local Jurisdiction shall extend, shall petition Your Majesty in Council that the jurisdiction of such Court of Local Jurisdiction may be excluded in any cause whereof the County Court hath cognizance, Your Majesty may by Order in Council declare such exclusion of the jurisdiction of such Court of Local Jurisdiction throughout the whole or any part of the district assigned to such County Court.

“ That the procedure of the said Hundred Court is dilatory, complicated and expensive, as compared with the procedure of the County Court, which is prompt, simple, inexpensive, and effective.

“ That the office of the Registrar of the Salford Hundred Court is at the Townhall, in the city of Manchester, and the sittings of the Court are held in that city, which is distant ten miles from the borough of Bolton.

“ That by reason of the technical nature of the procedure of the said Hundred Court, and the distance from the borough of the place where the office of the said Court is situate, and its sittings held, the inhabitants of Bolton, when sued in such Court, are obliged to employ professional assistance, and are otherwise put to great expense and inconvenience in insignificant actions, and the process of the said Court in such actions becomes oppressive, particularly to Defendants of the operative classes.

“ That upon Judgment obtained in a County Court for a sum not exceeding twenty pounds the Judge of the Court may order the payment thereof by instalments, but upon Judgment obtained in the Salford Hundred Court the plaintiff is at liberty to have execution issued forthwith for the whole amount recovered, whereby the process of the latter Court is productive in many cases of great hardship and distress.

“ That in the opinion of your petitioners it is highly desirable in the interests of the poorer classes that the jurisdiction of the Salford Hundred Court within the limits of the borough of

Bolton should be excluded with respect to all actions cognizable by the County Court wherein the debt or damages sought to be recovered does not exceed the sum of five pounds.

"That the County Court is more suitable and convenient and less costly in process to suitors than the Salford Hundred Court for actions within the limit last mentioned, so far as the borough of Bolton is concerned, and the jurisdictions of the said Hundred Court in such actions within the said borough is unnecessary, and its continuance is not conducive to the proper administration of justice within the borough; and humbly praying that it may please Your Majesty, by and with the advice of Your Majesty's Privy Council, by an Order in Council, to declare that the jurisdiction of the Salford Hundred Court shall, from and after the date of such Order, be excluded in all causes whereof, by reason of the cause of action arising or the dwelling of any defendant within the municipal limits of the borough of Bolton, the County Court of Lancashire, holden at Bolton, hath cognizance, and wherein the debt or damages sought to be recovered shall not exceed the sum of five pounds.

"The Lords of the Committee, in obedience to Your Majesty's said Order of Reference, have taken the said petition into consideration, and their Lordships do agree humbly to report to Your Majesty as their opinion that from and after the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, the jurisdiction of the Salford Hundred Court shall be excluded in all causes whereof, by reason of the cause of action arising, or the dwelling of any defendant within the municipal limits of the borough of Bolton, the County Court of Lancashire holden at Bolton hath cognizance, and wherein the debt or damages sought to be recovered shall not exceed the sum of five pounds."

Her Majesty, having taken the said report into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice aforesaid, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, the jurisdiction of the Salford Hundred Court shall be excluded in all causes whereof, by reason of the cause of action arising, or of any defendant dwelling or carrying on business within the municipal limits of the borough of Bolton, the County Court of Lancashire holden at Bolton, hath cognizance; and wherein the debt or damages sought to be recovered shall not exceed the sum of five pounds. Whereof the Judge and Officers of the said Salford Hundred Court, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-second day of July, in the year one

thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, in the words following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Your Majesty, chapter eighty-two, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint James situate at Rhosddu in the parish of Wrexham in the county of Denbigh and in the diocese of Saint Asaph.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Wrexham and of the parish of Gresford in the said county and diocese and of the parish of Gwersyllt in the same county and diocese which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parishes respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of Wrexham, of the said parish of Gresford, and of the said parish of Gwersyllt should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint James situate at Rhosddu as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Joshua Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Asaph as such Bishop and also as the patron in right of his See both of the vicarage of the said parish of Wrexham and of the vicarage of the said parish of Gresford and with the consent of the Reverend Edward Braithwaite Smith the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Gresford aforesaid and as such vicar or incumbent the patron of the vicarage of the parish of Gwersyllt aforesaid (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would, in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Wrexham of the said parish of Gresford and of the said parish of Gwersyllt which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint James situate at Rhosddu as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint James Rhosddu.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet."

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint James Rhosddu being:—

"All those several contiguous portions of the parish of Wrexham, of the parish of Gresford and of the parish of Gwersyllt all situate in the county of Denbigh and in the diocese of Saint Asaph wherein the present incumbents of such parishes now respectively possess the exclusive

cure of souls which said portions of such parishes are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Gwersyllt from the parish of Wrexham aforesaid at a point in the middle of the main road leading from Mold to Wrexham opposite to the milestone situate upon the south-western side of the said road and indicating a distance of ten miles from Mold and of one mile from Wrexham and extending thence that is from the said boundary south-eastward along the middle of the said main road for a distance of forty-four and a half chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge at the Wrexham Railway Station which bridge carries the same main road over the line of the Great Western Railway and extending thence north-eastward and in a direct line for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to the point where Rhosddu-road is joined by Lorne-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said Rhosddu-road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Grove-road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of sixteen and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Chester-road and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of fourteen and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road which leads along the southern side of Acton Park to Rhosnesney, and extending thence first eastward then north-eastward and then again eastward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of fifty-six chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from the Rhosnesney National Schools past the site of the old Pwll-yr-wydd Turnpike Gate towards Wrexham and extending thence first south-westward then westward and then again south-westward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of thirty-six and a-half chains or thereabouts to its junction at the site of the old Pwll-yr-wydd Turnpike Gate aforesaid with the high road leading from Wrexham aforesaid to Holt, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of forty-four chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Rhosnesney aforesaid, past the houses called or known respectively as Bryn-Estyn and as Clays, to Spring Grove, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of ten and a-half chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the township of Erlas from the township of Bieston both which townships are now for ecclesiastical purposes within the parish of Wrexham aforesaid and extending thence first eastward and then south-eastward along the said township boundary for a distance of one mile and sixty-eight chains or thereabouts (thereby at first continuing to follow the course of the said last-described road and then passing to the south of the house called or known as Bryn Estyn aforesaid) to the point where the same township boundary joins the boundary which divides the said parish of Wrexham from the parochial chapelry of Holt in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence generally northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of one mile and thirty-five chains or thereabouts to its junction at the south-western angle of Borras Wood, with the boundary which divides the said parish of Gresford from the parochial chapelry of Holt aforesaid and continuing thence still northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of forty-four chains or thereabouts

to its junction with the boundary which divides the township of Borras Riffre from the township of Borras Hovah which townships are now for ecclesiastical purposes within the parish of Gresford aforesaid and extending thence generally westward along the last-mentioned township boundary for a distance of two and a half miles or thereabouts to its junction with the boundary which divides the said parish of Gresford from the parish of Wrexham aforesaid and extending thence first northward and then generally westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of one mile and nineteen chains or thereabouts to its junction at the Chester-road aforesaid with the boundary which divides the said parish of Gresford from the parish of Gwersyllt aforesaid and extending thence first alternately northward and westward and then alternately southward and westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of one mile and twenty-five chains or thereabouts (thereby following in part the course of the said Chester-road and crossing the line of the Great Western Railway aforesaid and finally following the course of the River Alyn) to the point where the same river is joined by the mill stream or tail flowing from Gwersyllt Corn Mill and extending thence south-west and in a direct line for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to the point where the road leading from Llan Llyn to Plas Acton is joined by the road leading to Rhos Robin and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of twenty-three and a half chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the same road over the line of the Wheat Sheaf and Ffrwd Branch of the said Great Western Railway and extending thence south-westward and in a direct line for a distance of fifty chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the line of the Wrexham Mold and Connahs Quay Railway) to the point where the main road leading from Mold to Wrexham as aforesaid is joined by the road which leads past the northern side of the house called or known as Stansty Farm and along the northern side of the park attached to Stansty Hall, to Pool Mouth and Pentre Isaf and continuing thence first south-westward and then generally westward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of forty-seven and a half chains or thereabouts to a point near Pool Mouth aforesaid upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Gwersyllt from the parish of Wrexham aforesaid and extending thence first south-eastward and then generally north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of one mile and sixteen chains or thereabouts to the first-described point in the middle of the main road leading from Mold to Wrexham as aforesaid opposite to the milestone indicating a distance of ten miles from Mold and of one mile from Wrexham as aforesaid at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint Asaph

**W**HEREAS the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis," and to amend the Act concerning the burial "of the dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein with the following modifications, viz. :—

**THATCHAM.**—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Thatcham in the county of Berks and also in the churchyard after the thirty-first December one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six except as follows :—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order viz. :—widows and widowers, as can be buried at or below that depth.

**PENNINGTON.**—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Pennington in the county of Lancaster and also in the churchyard except as follows :—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those interred therein at the date of the

Order, viz. :—widows and widowers as can be buried at or below that depth.

(d.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard (as have never before been buried in, and which when opened are free from water) burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

**BARHAM.**—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Barham in the county of Kent, and also in the churchyard after the thirty-first March one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven except as follows :—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

**NETHER HEYFORD.**—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Nether Heyford in the county of Northampton and in the churchyard within two yards of any dwelling and also in the rest of the churchyard after the thirtieth September one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six except as follows :—

In such wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

**LANGHAM BISHOPS.**—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Langham Bishops in the county of Norfolk and also in the churchyard except as follows :—

In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

**WYKE REGIS.**—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Wyke Regis in the county of Dorset, and also in the old part of the churchyard; and in the part added in one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight except as follows :—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves now existing in this part of the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in this part of the churchyard provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such earthen graves now existing in this part of the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date

of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

**BURTON AGNES.**—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Burton Agnes in the county of York, and also in the churchyard after the first May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven except as follows:—

In such vaults as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; also forthwith and entirely in

Harpham Church in the said parish of Burton Agnes and also in the churchyard after the first May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven except as follows:—

In such vaults as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

**CHARLBURY.**—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Charlbury in the county of Oxford, and in the churchyard within seven feet of any dwelling and in the rest of the churchyard after the first June one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven except as follows:—

(a.) In such wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

**HEYBRIDGE.**—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Heybridge in the county of Essex and also in the churchyard after the first May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard (as have never before been buried in and when opened are free from water) burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

**HASELEY.**—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Haseley in the county of Warwick

and also in the churchyard after the first June one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven except as follows:—

In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

**PHILLACK.**—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Phillack in the county of Cornwall, and that in the churchyard the following regulations shall be observed:—

I. No body shall be buried in any vault or walled grave unless the coffin be separately entombed in an air-tight manner that is by properly cemented stone or brick work which shall never be disturbed.

II. No earthen grave shall be dug within one foot of any other grave.

III. No coffin shall be buried in any un-walled grave within four feet of the ordinary level of the ground.

IV. In no case on opening any grave shall human remains be disturbed or coffins exposed.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the sixth day of October next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before the said sixth day of October. *C. The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intitled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted, that in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order

That burials be discontinued forthwith and entirely in Ingleton Church, in the county of York, and also in the churchyard, except as follows :—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order, viz. :—widows and widowers, parents and children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard (as have never before been buried in, and which when opened are free from water), burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the sixth day of October next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said sixth day of October next.

(c.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order, viz. :—widows and widowers, sons and daughters, as can be buried at or below that depth.

(d.) In the grave space reserved for the use of the Reverend W. C. Safford and his wife at their decease on condition that each coffin is covered by four feet of earth at least.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the sixth day of October next.
