#### TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Warrant, dated the 2nd day of April, 1886, and

relating to Inland Postal Packets.

2. On and as from the day upon which this Warrant comes into operation, Article 64, of the said Warrant of the 2nd day of April, 1886, shall

be repealed.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Warrant, and of the said Warrant of the 2nd day of April, 1886, if any article of pecuniary value, enclosed in, or forming part of a registered postal packet, be lost or damaged whilst in the custody of the Postmaster-General, the Postmaster-General may pay to any person or persons who may, in the opinion of the Postmaster-General, establish a reasonable claim to compensation (having regard to the nature of the article, the care with which it was packed, and other circumstances), such sum as he may think just, provided that

(a.) If only the postage and registration fee payable in respect of the said Postal Packet have been paid by the sender, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed the

sum of £5.

(b.) If, in addition to the postage and registration fee as aforesaid, the sum of two pence has been paid by the sender in respect of such Postal Packet, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed the sum of £10.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 15th day of December, 1887.
