T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 6th day of October, 1888.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered,

1. The limits of the following Place which is declared by order of the Local Authority acting in and for the county of Fife, dated the eleventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),—the whole farm steading of Bogie Parks in the parish of Abbotshall and occupation of Robert Elder, the pasturefield in front or south of the steading and farm house on Bogic Parks, also the field on the farm of Bogic Mains in the parish of Abbotshall and occupation of David Ross and adjoining or lying contiguous to said pasture-field on Bogie Parks and the whole farm steading of Bogic Mains aforesaid and the land lying between said field and steading on Bogie Mains aforesaid, as also the field on the farm of Sauchenbush in the parish of Abbotshall and occupation of David Carstairs and adjoining or lying contiguous to said pasture-field on the farm of Bogie Parks aforesaid,—are hereby contracted or altered so as only to include the Place as described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place so described in the Schedule to this Order shall from and after the commencement of this Order be deemed to be the Place declared by the said order of the Local Authority to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch, dated 30th ultimo, from Her Majesty's Representative at Rome, enclosing the following translation of an Ordinance of Maritime

1888.—Ordinance of Maritime Health.
THE Minister of Marine decrees that from to-day (September 26th) the treatment of ships entering the ports of the Kingdom with a foul bill of health from yellow fever, is as follows:—

ART. 1. Shall be admitted to free intercourse, vessels recognized after a medical visit as being in good hygienic condition provided that the medical officer on board explicitly declares

(a.) That there have not been loaded thereon dirty effects for personal or domestic use, or at least that such effects came on board washed and properly disinfected.
(b.) That during the voyage there have been

no proved or suspected cases of yellow fever.

ART. 2. Shall be admitted to free intercourse, after a rigorous medical visit and a regular disinfection of dirty effects for personal or domestic use, such ships as do not fulfil the conditions of Article 1 always, be it understood, provided it appears on the declaration of the medical officer on board, or in default of such, of the Captain, that no case of the above-mentioned malady has been detected on the voyage.

ART 3. Shall be admitted to free intercourse, with the precautions stated in the preceding although having had cases of yellow fever during the voyage, have been free therefrom for at least twelve days from the complete restoration or death of the person affected. In such cases it will, moreover, be necessary that the medical officer should make an attestation declaring that the most rigorous disinfection of the effects belonging to the sick persons, and of the place in which they were treated, have been effected.

ART. 4. Shall be directed to the Maritime Sanitary Station, which shall be named in each case by the Ministry, such ships as after having had cases of yellow fever on board shall arrive in a port of the kingdom, and shall not be in the condition mentioned in the preceding Article.

These vessels can also proceed directly to the station of Asinara before touching at any Italian port, in order to undergo the treatment which the Ministry shall have ordained.

ART. 5. It shall in every case be forbidden to ships coming from an infected region to discharge their ballast in port if it consists of earth or sand. Such an operation must be carried out on the high seas at a distance of at least five kilometres from the shore.

ART. 6. It is to be understood that by the present Decree the preceding Ordinance of May 29, 1878, No. 9, is in all respects cancelled.

ARTICLE II.—Article 172 of the said Order of the 24th day of July, 1817, relating to the remuneration of Officers or Assistants, and Article 188 of that Order and Article 1 of the said Order of the 12th day of February, 1879, relating to the continuance in office of Officers or Assistants, are hereby suspended with respect to the said Establishment.
