THE SWINE-FEVER ORDER OF 1890.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1873 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Slaughter of Suspected Swine by Special Authority of Board of Agriculture.

1.—(1.) Where a Veterinary Inspector has certified to a Local Authority to the effect that a pig is suspected by him to be affected with swine-fever, that Local Authority, if authorized by the Board of Agriculture to put in operation this Order, but not otherwise, may, if they think fit, cause that pig to be slaughtered.

(2.) Where a pig has been slaughtered by order of a Local Authority under this Order, the Local Authority shall in the case of each pig so slaughtered, previous to the disposal of the carcase, cause a post-mortem examination to be made thereof, which examination shall be conducted by a Veterinary Inspector specially appointed in that

behalf who shall forthwith report to the Local Authority, for the purposes of this Order, the result of such examination.

(3.) The Local Authority shall out of the local rate pay compensation as follows for swine slaughtered under the authority of this Order :

(a.) Where the Veterinary Inspector so specially appointed as aforesaid reports to the Local Authority that the pig was affected with swine-fever, the compensation shall be one-half of its value immediately before it became so affected, but so that the compensation do not in any such case exceed forty shillings.

(b.) In every other case the compensation shall be the value of the pig immediately before it was slaughtered, but so that the compensation do not in any case exceed four pounds.

(4.) The following provisions of the Act of 1878 and of The Animals Order of 1886 and of The Animals (Amendment) Order of 1887, No. 3, shall, so far as the same are applicable, apply to the case of swine slaughtered under the provisions of this Order :

(i.) Section 30 (*General provisions relative to slaughter and compensation*) of the Act of 1878 :

(ii.) Article 179 (*Withholding of compensation*) of The Animals Order of 1886 :

(iii.) Article 180 (*Ascertainment of value for compensation*) of The Animals Order of 1886 as amended by Article 2 of The Animals (Amendment) Order of 1887, No. 3 :

(iv.) Article 181 (*Record of slaughter*) of The Animals Order of 1886.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Movement of Swine within their District on Account of Swine-Fever.

2.—(1.) Any Local Authority may, with the view of preventing the spreading of swine-fever, make, from time to time, such Regulations as they think fit for prohibiting or regulating the movement by land or by water of swine in the whole of their District or in any part or parts thereof : Provided that the power to make Regulations under this Article shall be exercised only by a Local Authority or their Executive Committee, and shall not be deputed to any other Committee nor to a Sub-Committee.

(2.) No Regulation made by a Local Authority under this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of—

(a.) Swine in or into or out of a Cattle-Plague Infected Place ; or

(b.) Swine in or into or out of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place or Circle or Area ; or

(c.) Swine in or into or out of a Swine-Fever Infected Place or Circle or Area ; or

(d.) Swine affected with swine-fever ; or

(e.) Swine by Railway through the District of that Local Authority, without untrucking ; which movement is regulated by the Acts of 1878 to 1886 and Orders issued thereunder.

Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

3.—(1.) Every Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board of Agriculture a copy of every Regulation made by them under the provisions of this Order.

(2.) If the Board of Agriculture are satisfied on inquiry with respect to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under the provisions of this Order that the same is of too restrictive a character, or otherwise objectionable, and direct

the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Production of Licences: Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Every person in charge of swine being moved, where, under any Regulation made by a Local Authority under the provisions of this Order, a Movement Licence may be necessary, shall, on demand of a justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Movement Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

(3.) If a person in charge of swine being moved, where under any Regulation made by a Local Authority under the provisions of this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

Offences.

5.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of any Regulation made by a Local Authority under the provisions of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(2.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of a Regulation made by a Local Authority under the provisions of this Order allows a pig to stray he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

Extent.

6. This Order extends to England and Wales and Scotland.

Interpretation.

7. In this Order—

The Act of 1878 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878 :

Other terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1886.

Short Title.

8. This Order may be cited as THE SWINE-FEVER ORDER OF 1890.

1. The following Area (namely),—in the borough of Warrington, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, from the centre of the bridge known as Bewsey Bridge in Bewsey-road near to the offices of the Pearson and Knowles Coal and Iron Company Limited to the south side of the bridge carrying the Railway of the Cheshire Lines Committee over the said road at the northerly end thereof, thence in an easterly direction along such Railway to a point where such Railway crosses the Railway of the London and North Western Railway Company, and thence in a southerly direction along such last-mentioned Railway to Bewsey Bridge aforesaid,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the thirtieth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS respecting Competitive Examinations for Men Clerkships in the Second Division of the Civil Service.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

1. Competitive examinations of candidates for Clerkships in the Second Division of the Civil Service will be held from time to time at such places as may be deemed expedient.

2. These examinations are open, under such general restrictions as may be laid down, to all natural-born subjects of Her Majesty, being of the prescribed age, and of good health and character. The under-mentioned restrictions are at present in force :

(i.) The following classes of persons are ineligible ; viz.,

Persons actually serving in the Army and Navy, and Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of less than five years' service.

(ii.) The following classes of persons will not be eligible unless they produce to the Civil Service Commissioners the written permission of the authorities of their department to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, viz. :—

(a) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service. (b) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary, of more than 5 years' service. (c) Apprentices and Engineer Students in Her Majesty's Dockyards.

(iii.) Persons who have been trained in Normal Schools at the public expense will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Committee of Council on Education, Great Britain, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

(iv.) In reckoning age for competition and for removal from the list under Clause 8 of the Order in Council of the 12th February, 1876, the following allowances will be made, viz., (1) members of the Military and Naval services (whether commissioned or non-commissioned) may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have served towards pension ; (2) persons who have served for two full consecutive years, (a) in any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, (b) in the Royal Irish Constabulary, or (c) as Registered Copyists in connection with the Civil Service, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

3. A fee of 10s. will be required from every candidate attending a Preliminary Examination, and a further fee of £1 from every candidate admitted to the Competitive Examination.

4. Candidates must be over 17 and under 20 years of age on the first day of the Competitive Examination.

5. The subjects of examination will be as follows :—

1. Handwriting.
2. Orthography.
3. Arithmetic.
4. Copying MS. (to test accuracy).
5. English Composition.
6. Geography.
7. Indexing or Docketing.
8. Digesting Returns into Summaries.
9. English History.
10. Book-keeping.

No candidate can be admitted to the competition who has not previously satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners that he possesses the requisite amount of proficiency in Handwriting, Orthography, and Arithmetic (including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions). With this view, Preliminary Examinations in these subjects will be held at such times and places as the Commissioners may appoint. Application for permission to attend one of these Preliminary Examinations must be made in the writing of the candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.

6. The number of persons to be selected for the Second Division at each examination will be published as part of the notice of every such examination.

7. Each competitor placed on the list for the Second Division of the Civil Service will remain thereon until he attains the age of 25 years, unless in the meantime he has been appointed to a situation in some public office.

Candidates on completing their 25th year, or on receiving appointments, will be removed from the list.

8. From this list the Civil Service Commissioners, on the application of Departments having vacancies, will supply, on probation, the requisite Clerks, whether for permanent or temporary duty. Selections will, as a general rule, be made by the Civil Service Commissioners according to the order of the names on the list; but the Civil Service Commissioners may select any Clerk who, in his examination, has shown special qualifications in any particular subject, if special application for such a Clerk be made by any Department.

9. No Clerk will remain more than one year in any Department unless at the end of that time the Head of the Department shall signify in writing to the Civil Service Commissioners that the Clerk is accepted by the Department. If he is not accepted, the Department will report to the said Commissioners the reasons for not accepting him; and such Commissioners will thereon supply another Clerk in his room, and will decide whether the name of the rejected Clerk shall be struck off the list, as unfit for the Service generally, or whether he shall be allowed a trial in another Department.

distance of about 12 miles south-eastward of Leong Soi Point. Mariners therefore navigating in the vicinity should use caution.

GERMANY.

Storm Signals, and Signal Stations.

THE following alteration has been made in the storm signals in use on the coasts of Germany:—

The drums hitherto used at the storm signal stations have been discontinued, and storm signals are the only ones now used.

One flag indicates that the wind will probably shift; from north, through east, and south, to westerly directions.

Two flags indicate that the wind will probably shift; from north, through west, and south, to easterly directions.

A ball indicates that an atmospheric disturbance is present.

Storm Signal Stations.

The following storm signal stations have been established on the coasts of Germany. They are divided into two classes; those of the first class having a signal staff, with a yard, to which the signals are hoisted; and those of the second class, a post, to which a ball is hoisted, as a signal that a storm is approaching, of which information may be obtained at the signal station.

Every station is provided with a box, in which the telegram, containing the reasons for hoisting the signal, is deposited for inspection by the public. Further information may be obtained from the Signal Officer if required.

A signal signifies that in the neighbourhood of the locality where it is shown, within a circle of about 100 miles radius, a storm from the direction indicated is probable.
