(Port of Bristol (Cumberland Tidal Basin)— Definition of Foreign Animals Wharf.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Bristol as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space situate between Merchant's Dock and Cumberland Basin, in the county borough of Bristol, commencing at a point at the water's edge of the north side of the Junction Lock between the Floating Harbour and Cumberland Basin thirty-three feet or thereabouts west of the Inner Gate, thence in a northerly direction for a distance of thirty feet or thereabouts bounded by
