MY LORD,
WITH reference to my Despatch of the 12th instant, and since despatching the registered mail yesterday, I have received the inclosed communication from the Honduran Envoy here, by which your Lordship will observe that, owing to the rebellion in Honduras, the Government have closed the ports of Truxillo and La Ceiba, on the Atlantic coast, to external commerce.

MONSIEUR LE MINISTRE,
I RECEIVED yesterday the following telegram, addressed to me, dated Comayaqua, 16th July, 1892, from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs:—

"Instructed by the President, and in order that you may kindly notify the Diplomatic Body resident in the capital, I transmit to you the following Decree:—

*"Ministry of Finance, Comayaqua,
July 14, 1892.*

"In view of the ports of Truxillo and La Ceiba on the Atlantic coast being occupied by the force commanded by Colonel Leonardo Viula, and as a means for protecting commerce from the depredations by the rebels, and to prevent the latter from carrying into effect their illegal intentions, the Government decrees:

"1. To close for the present the ports of Truxillo and La Ceiba to exterior commerce and coasting trade. In consequence, no class of merchandise will be received in the above-named custom-houses, and in case there is

"already merchandise in the national depôts it will remain there without its certificate of entry being verified.

"2. The fiscal employés named by the Head of the Faction will answer personally for the national funds seized after the 22nd of last June.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of the following Notices, issued by Her Majesty's Representative at Malta. The Notice marked A is substituted for paragraph 13 of Government Notice No. 119, issued on the 30th July, 1892 :—

Valletta, August 6, 1892.

13. The importation of susceptible goods as hereunder specified from any of the ports subjected to quarantine is prohibited, viz :—

Rags, cotton and cotton seed, raw silk, hair, and feathers.

Other susceptible goods arriving from any of the ports subjected to quarantine are to be thoroughly disinfected.

Susceptible goods imported by vessels coming from, or touching at, ports subjected to quarantine, even when such vessels have been admitted to pratique at intermediate ports, shall be considered as having been imported from such ports subjected to quarantine, for the purposes of the provisions of this article, unless satisfactory proof be produced showing that such goods have been imported from other ports which are not subjected to quarantine in these islands.

Government Notice No. 123.

The Honourable the Deputy Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to direct that Government Notice No. 44 of the 8th March, 1892, is to be modified with reference to paragraph 4, respecting the importation of cattle from Roumelia and Thessaly, and that the other provisions therein contained remaining in force, the following regulations are to be observed, viz. :

1. The importation of cattle of any kind from Egypt, the province of Naples, Calabria, and Sicily is prohibited, with the exception of horses from the latter island; and the introduction into these islands of wool, hides, skins, horns, bones, and hoofs from the above places and from countries where epidemic diseases are prevailing, is likewise prohibited.

2. Cattle intended for importation into these

islands must, unless they are the produce of Barbary, and come from the Barbary ports, be accompanied by a certificate stating the place of their origin and the fact that cattle disease has not prevailed in that place (with as far as can be ascertained the route followed from any inland station to the port of embarkation) during the three months previous to the date of embarkation. Such certificate shall be given by the British Consular Authority at the places of origin and embarkation, or if there be no such British Consular Authority, by the Local Government Authority of the places of origin and embarkation.

3. Vessels arriving in this island, under 50 tons register, having on board more than 5 head of cattle (horses excepted) are to go into the quarantine harbour, in order that the cattle may be inspected in the "Bovile." All vessels exceeding 50 tons register having more than 20 head of cattle on board, horses excepted, are subjected to the same measure.

4. The importation of cattle from the Black Sea or Sea of Azov not otherwise prohibited, may be permitted, subject to the undermentioned conditions, provided that in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer such cattle are not affected with disease so that they may be admitted in the lazaretto without detriment to cattle already in the island:—

(a.) Such cattle shall only be admitted to the enclosures which may be assigned or approved for that purpose at the lazaretto or at such place as the Government may select, and they shall be subjected to isolation and observation for three months.

(b.) Application must be made for leave to import and permission is to be obtained in writing from Government in each case before shipment stating the number of the animals intended to be shipped. No cattle shall be allowed to be landed unless the consignee has obtained such leave from Government and agreed to abide by any regulations which may be established.

(c.) The application referred to in the preceding article shall imply that the applicant has consented to pay the usual fees for entrance into the lazaretto and for guards and extraordinary expenses on each head of cattle, besides 2s. 6d. on each head of cattle per month, or part thereof, in cases in which it is found necessary to keep cattle in the lazaretto for a longer period than fifteen days.

(d.) The importation of cattle from Syria, Roumelia, and Thessaly may be permitted under the following conditions:—that, on arrival, such cattle be not found suffering from idiopathic fever; that such cattle be exclusively imported for public consumption and slaughtered at the lazaretto, subject to the regulations which may from time to time be made by the port authorities.

(e.) The owners of cattle in the lazaretto shall be subjected to such regulations as to slaughtering of cattle, disposal of offal, blood, &c., as may from time to time be made by the port authority.

5. Swine arriving from Albania and Greece may be imported subject to twenty days' quarantine at the lazaretto or in private pens, and to any restrictions the Chief Government Medical Officer may consider necessary.

6. The importation of dogs is subjected to three months' quarantine.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 11th August, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Stockholm, reporting that a notification of the Swedish Board of Trade was published in the "Post och Turikes" Tidning of the 10th instant, stating that observation stations for ships coming from places infected with cholera are to be established at the following places, viz.:—

1. Island of Inlångan, near Karlskrona
2. Enholmen, outside Slite, in the province of Gotland.

3. Juniskäven, outside Sundsvall.

4. Bredvik, outside Umeå.

5. The channel between Härö and Hasselö near Sandhamn at the entrance to Stockholm.

6. Island of Fejan, near Ijockö, outside Fårusund, on the northern channel to Stockholm.

This last observation station is also to be prepared as a quarantine station.

7. Käsö, outside Gothenburg, is to be used both as an observation station and a quarantine station for cholera.

Of the abovenamed observation and quarantine stations, the one at Käsö will at once come into use, and the others are to do so if cases of cholera occur at or in the neighbourhood of any port on the Baltic.

THE ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1892, No. 7.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under

the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1892, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Revocation.

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order, to the extent described in that Schedule, is hereby, from and after the commencement of this Order, revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the part of the said Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the part of the said Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

The United States of America declared a Free Country as regards Sheep.

2. From and after the commencement of this Order, unless and until the Board of Agriculture otherwise order, sheep brought from the United States of America are allowed to be landed without being subject under the Fifth Schedule to the Act of 1878, or under the Animals Order of 1886, to slaughter or to quarantine, and, subject to the provisions of this Order, Chapter 32 and Part I of the Fifth Schedule of that Order shall be read and have effect as if the United States of America were as regards sheep included in the list of Free Countries named in that part of that Schedule.

Amendment of Article 151 of the Animals Order of 1886.

3. The following provisions of this Article shall be read in the place of Article 151 of the Animals Order of 1886, and shall be deemed to be Article 151 of that Order (namely):

Conditions of Landing.

151.—(1.) The landing of foreign animals at a Landing-Place for foreign animals under the provisions of this Chapter is subject to the following conditions:

First. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-eight days before taking them on board, had on board any animal exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in any country other than Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or Iceland, or New Zealand, or the Channel Islands, or the United States of America (provision as to which country is made by the second condition of this Article), or the Isle of Man.

Second. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-one days before taking them on board, had on board any animal (other than a sheep) exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in the United States of America.

Third. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-one days before taking them on board or at any time since taking on board the animals imported, entered any port or place in any country other than Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or Iceland, or New Zealand, or the Channel Islands, or the United States of America, or the Isle of Man.

Fourth. That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any animal exported or carried coastwise from any port or place in any country other than Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or Iceland, or New Zealand,

or the Channel Islands, or the United States of America (provision as to which country is made by the fifth condition of this Article), or the Isle of Man.

Fifth. That the animals imported have not while on board the vessel been in contact with any animal (other than a sheep) exported or carried coastwise from any port or place in the United States of America.

(2.) And the animals imported shall not be landed at a Landing-Place for foreign animals unless and until—

(a.) The owner or charterer of the vessel in which they are imported, or his agent in England or Wales or Scotland, has entered into a bond to Her Majesty the Queen, in a sum not exceeding one thousand pounds, with or without a surety or sureties, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs, conditioned for the observance of the foregoing conditions; and

(b.) The master of the vessel has on each occasion of importation of foreign animals therein satisfied the Commissioners of Customs, or their proper officer, by declaration made and

signed or otherwise, that all the animals then imported therein are properly imported according to the provisions of this Article.

Interpretation.

4. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in the Animals Order of 1886.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as **THE ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1892, No. 7.**

Commencement.

6. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.
