The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS Charles Neve Cresswell Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, duly appointed in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882, as Commissioner for determining the boundaries of the new wards of the County Borough of Hanley and for apportioning the Councillors thereto, has transmitted to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State his scheme in the following terms:—

“MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT 1882.
“COUNTY BOROUGH OF HANLEY.

“WHEREAS a Petition from the County Borough of Hanley praying for the alteration of the number and boundaries of the wards of the said County Borough has been presented to Her Majesty.

“And whereas Her Majesty has been pleased by Order in Council to refer the said Petition to the Lords of the Council for consideration; and upon their report by Order dated the twentieth day of June one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in Her Majesty by the Municipal Corporations Act 1882, and of every other power enabling Her in that behalf, fixed the number of Wards into which the said county borough shall be thenceforth divided, and ordered and directed that the number of the said Wards shall be eight.

“And whereas on the eighth day of August one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did in pursuance of the thirtieth section of the above-mentioned Act warrant and appoint Charles Neve Cresswell Esquire, Barrister-at-Law to be a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of the wards of the county borough of Hanley, and for apportioning the Councillors among them, the number of such wards having been already fixed as aforesaid.

“Now I the said Charles Neve Cresswell do hereby, in pursuance of the said warrant of appointment determine the boundaries of the eight wards into which the said county borough shall be divided which wards are hereinafter numbered and named as follows, that is to say:—

- “Ward No. 1 otherwise ‘Etruria’ Ward.
- “Ward No. 2 otherwise ‘Hope’ Ward.

- “Ward No. 3 otherwise ‘Providence’ Ward.
 - “Ward No. 4 otherwise ‘Northwood’ Ward.
 - “Ward No. 5 otherwise ‘Wellington’ Ward.
 - “Ward No. 6 otherwise ‘Eastwood’ Ward.
 - “Ward No. 7 otherwise ‘Park’ Ward.
 - “Ward No. 8 otherwise ‘Cauldon’ Ward.
- “And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 1 otherwise ‘Etruria’ Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the county borough of Hanley as is contained within a line commencing from the point of intersection of the western boundary of the borough with the Newcastle-road thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of the said road to the centre of the bridge over the Trent and Mersey Canal thence by a vertical line to the centre of the said canal thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the said canal to a point beneath the centre of the ‘Gas Works Canal Bridge’ thence by a vertical line to the centre of Lower Bedford-street, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Lower Bedford-street to the centre of Bedford-street canal bridge, thence by a vertical line to the centre of the ‘Cauldon Canal,’ thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the said canal to a point in the centre of the basin known as the ‘Anderton Company’ Basin, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of the said basin to a point distant sixty-four linear feet from the centre of ‘Etruria Vale’ as measured on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ scale ordnance map, thence by a straight line from this point to the centre of ‘Etruria Vale,’ thence for a distance of one hundred and twelve linear feet in a north-westerly direction along the centre of ‘Etruria Vale’ to a point opposite to the centre of Sun-street, thence in a north-easterly direction to and along the centre of Sun-street to a point in the centre of Broad-street, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Broad-street to the centre of Piccadilly, thence along the centre of Piccadilly to a point in Fountain-square opposite to the base of the ‘Fountain,’ thence in a westerly direction to a point in the centre of Miles Bank, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Miles Bank to the centre of Stafford-street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Stafford-street to the centre of New Hall-street thence in a westerly direction along the centre of New Hall-street to the centre of Marsh-street, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Marsh-street to the centre of Brook-street, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Brook-street to a point in the centre of Cobridge-road, thence in a southerly direction

along the centre of Cobridge-road to a point in the centre of Etruria-road Bridge over the loop line of the North Staffordshire Railway; thence by a vertical line to the centre of the said railway, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of the said railway to the boundary of the borough, thence in a southerly direction along the boundary of the borough to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 2 otherwise 'Hope' Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the county borough of Hanley as is contained within a line commencing from the point of intersection of the loop line of the North Staffordshire Railway aforesaid with the boundary of the borough, thence in a northerly, north-easterly, south-easterly, and north-easterly direction along the boundary of the borough to the centre of the 'Old Road' leading from Sneyd Green to Bryan-street thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the said Old Road to the centre of Bryan-street thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Bryan-street to the centre of Union-street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Union-street to the centre of Abbey-street, thence in a southerly and easterly direction along the centre of Abbey-street to the centre of High-street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of High-street to a point opposite to the centre of Market-square, thence in a south-westerly direction through the Market-square to the boundary of Ward No. 1 in Fountain-square aforesaid, thence in a westerly, north-westerly, southerly and westerly direction along the said boundary of Ward No. 1 to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 3 otherwise 'Providence' Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the county borough of Hanley as is contained within a line commencing from the point of intersection of the boundary of the borough with the 'Old Road' aforesaid thence in a north-easterly and south-easterly direction along the boundary of the borough to a point opposite to the centre of Turner-street thence in a south-westerly direction to and along the centre of Turner-street to the centre of Oak-street thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Oak-street to a point opposite to the centre of Mount-street thence in a south-westerly direction to and along the centre of Mount-street to the centre of Keelings-lane thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Keelings-lane to a point opposite to the centre of Lower Mayer street thence in a south-westerly direction to and along the centre of Lower Mayer street to a point in the centre of Saint John-street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Saint John-street to a point opposite to the centre of Church-street thence in a westerly direction to and along the centre of Church-street to a point opposite to the centre of Bath-street thence in a southerly direction to and along the centre of Bath-street to a point in the centre of Market-street thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Market-street to a point in the centre of Upper Market square thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Upper Market square to the boundary of Ward No. 2 thence in a northerly, westerly, and northerly direction along the said boundary of Ward No. 2 to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 4 otherwise 'Northwood' Ward shall comprise so much area of the county borough of Hanley as is contained within a line commencing from the

point in the boundary of the borough opposite to the centre of Turner-street aforesaid, thence in a southerly direction along the boundary of the borough to a point beneath the centre of the bridge over the River Trent known as 'Bucknall Bridge,' thence by a vertical line to the centre of Bucknall-road, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Bucknall-road to a point opposite to the centre of Bucknall Old-road, thence to and along the centre of Bucknall Old-road to a point in the centre of Hill-street, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Hill-street to Old Hall-street, thence in a south-westerly direction to and along the centre of Old Hall-street to a point opposite to the centre of Charles-street, thence in a northerly direction to and along the centre of Parliament-row to the boundary of Ward No. 3, thence in a north-easterly direction along the boundary of Ward No. 3 to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 5 otherwise 'Wellington' Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the county borough of Hanley as is contained within a line commencing from the point in the boundary of the borough in the centre of 'Bucknall' Bridge, thence in a south-westerly direction along the boundary of the borough to a point in the centre of the Foot Bridge over the River Trent near Upper Botteslow Mill, thence in a north-westerly direction to and along the centre of an ancient roadway (known as Botteslow-lane), across the high-road leading to Leek, to the centre of Botteslow-road thence along the centre of Botteslow-road to a point in the centre of Nelson-road upon the bridge over the Cauldon Canal, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Nelson-road to the centre of Charles-street thence along the centre of Charles-street to the boundary of Ward No. 4, thence in an easterly direction along the southern boundary of Ward No. 4 to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 6 otherwise 'Eastwood' Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the county borough of Hanley as is contained within a line commencing from the point in the centre of the Footbridge at Upper Botteslow Mill aforesaid, thence in a north-westerly direction along the western boundary of Ward No. 5 to the boundary of Ward No. 4 thence in a northerly direction along the said boundary to the boundary of Ward No. 3, thence in a northerly direction along the boundary of Ward No. 3 to the boundary of Ward No. 2 thence in a south-westerly direction along the said boundary to the boundary of Ward No. 1, thence in a south-westerly direction along the said boundary to a point opposite to the centre of Cheapside, thence in a south-easterly direction to and along the centre of Cheapside to a point in the centre of Albion-street, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Albion-street to a point opposite to the centre of Bagnall-street, thence in a south-easterly direction to and along the centre of Bagnall-street to a point in the centre of Vine-street, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Vine-street to a point in the centre of Bethesda-street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Bethesda-street to a point distant six hundred and ninety-five linear feet (as measured on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ scale Ordnance Map) from the centre of Clifford-street, thence by a straight line to the centre of Clifford-street, thence in a southerly direction by a straight line to a point distant three hundred and thirteen linear feet from the centre of Clifford-street (as measured on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ scale Ordnance Map), thence along the centre of Bethesda-road in a southerly direction

to and along the centre of Park-road North to the centre of Park-road South, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Park-road South to a point distant two hundred and five linear feet from the centre of Leek-road (as measured on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ scale Ordnance Map), thence in a south-easterly direction by a straight line to the centre of Leek-road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the boundary fence of the borough sewage works to a point in the boundary of the borough distant five hundred and ninety-five linear feet as measured on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ scale Ordnance Map, thence in a north-easterly direction along the boundary of the borough to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 7 otherwise 'Park' Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the county borough of Hanley as is contained within a line commencing from the point of intersection of the boundary of the borough with the Shelton Old-road thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Shelton Old-road to the centre of Stoke-road, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Stoke-road to a point opposite to the boundary fence of the New Park (near Caudon-place) thence in an easterly direction along the line of the said fence to the centre of Victoria-road, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Victoria-road to the centre of Broad-street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Broad-street to the boundary of Ward No. 1 thence in a north-easterly direction along the said boundary to the boundary of Ward No. 6 thence in a southerly direction along the western boundary of Ward No. 6 to the boundary of the borough and thence in a south-westerly and westerly direction along the said boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 8 otherwise 'Caudon' Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the county borough of Hanley as is contained within a line commencing from the point of intersection of the boundary of the borough with the Newcastle-road as aforesaid thence in a north-easterly direction along the southern boundary of Ward No. 1 to the boundary of Ward No. 7 thence in a southerly direction along the western boundary of Ward No. 7 to the boundary of the borough, and thence in a north-westerly direction along the said boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Furthermore I the said Charles Neve Cresswell by virtue of the powers given to me by the said warrant of appointment and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 do hereby assign and apportion to each of the said eight wards three Councillors in due order of rotation or in the event of a casual or other vacancy in any of the said wards before this my scheme has been published in the London Gazette the successor of each of them duly elected that is to say:—
