# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 29th OCTOBER 1895.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area declared by Order of the Board dated the seventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four to be an Area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1834, No. 3 (namely),—the county of Salop, and the boroughs of Shrewsbury, and Wenlock,—is, except such portion thereof as is included in the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall as from the commencement of this Order cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

- 2. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order shall as from the commencement of this Order continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1894, No. 3.
- 3. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to interfere with or affect the operation of the Shropshire Prohibited District (Swine Fever) Order of 1895.
- 4. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.
