The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by the eleventh section of "The Volunteer Act, 1863," it is amongst other things enacted that "Her Majesty in Council "may from time to time declare what is requi-"site to entitle a Volunteer to be deemed an "efficient Volunteer by an Order in Council "defining for that purpose the extent of attend-"ance at drill to be given by the Volunteer, and "the course of instruction to be gone through by "him, and the degree of proficiency in drill and "instruction to be attained by him and his Corps, "such proficiency to be judged of by the Inspect-"ing Officer at the Annual Inspection of the "Corps, or otherwise, as by Order in Council is "from time to time directed," and that "the "draft of any scheme to be from time to time "submitted to Her Majesty in Council for "approval under the present section shall have "been laid before both Houses of Parliament for " one lunar month at least, either before or after, "or partly before and partly after, the passing of "this Act during the present, or for the like "period during any subsequent Session of Parlia-"ment before such scheme receives the approval "of Her Majesty in Council."

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the Order in Council bearing date the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, declaring what is requisite to entitle a Volunteer to be deemed an efficient Volunteer, be amended as regards the efficiency of Volunteers belonging to Rifle Corps.

And whereas a draft of the proposed amendment was on the thirteenth day of July last laid before both Houses of Parliament in the words mentioned and set forth in the Schedule to this Order annexed, and one lunar month having elapsed since that time, the said amendment of the said Order hath this day been submitted to Her Majesty in Council for Her approval thereof:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty having this day taken the proposed amendment into consideration, doth, in pursuance and exercise of the power in Her Majesty by the said Act of Parliament in that behalf vested, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, hereby amend, in the words of the draft scheme of amendment forming the Schedule to this Order annexed the aforesaid

Order in Council of the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and doth declare Her Royal approval of such amendment. *C. L. Peel.*

SCHEDULE.

AMENDMENT, under the provisions of the Volunteer Act, 1863, of the Scheme relative to the Efficiency of Volunteers in force under Her Majesty's Order in Council, dated thirty-first July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, or subsequent amending Orders.

To substitute for the existing Certificate of Efficiency for Volunteers of Rifle Corps a Certificate in the form and words hereinafter shown.

EFFICIENCY CERTIFICATE FOR VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

(1.) That A B No. was duly enrolled in the muster roll of the Volunteer Rifle Corps on the one thousand eight hundred and , and is actually a member of the Corps on this date.

(2.) That he does not belong to the Regular, Militia, Yeomanry, or Army Reserve (including enrolled pensioner) Forces; and that he is not enrolled in any other Volunteer Corps.

(3.) That he attended during the twelve months ending the thirty-first October one thousand eight hundred and ,* drills of this Corps, ordered by the Commanding Officer ; each of such drills being of not less than

one hour's duration. (4.)-(a) (For the thirty-five shillings Grant for the trained Volunteer.) That he fired**

rounds of ball ammunition in Class Firing during the year, and passed into the Second Class.

 $\dagger(b)$ (For the ten shillings Grant for the trained Volunteer.) That he fired three times in the Third Class during the year, firing each time twenty-one rounds of ball ammunition, and that in one of those trials he made twenty points.

‡(5.) That he attended the lessons and drills referred to in Table A, Appendix VIII, Volunteer Regulations.

(6.)-(a) (For the thirty-five shillings Grant for the Recruit.) That he fired forty-two rounds of ball ammunition in Class Firing during the year, and passed into the Second Class.

 $\dagger(b)$ (For the ten shillings Grant for the Recruit.) That he fired forty-two rounds of ball ammunition in Class Firing during the year, and made thirty points.

(7.) That he possesses a competent knowledge of the drill and manœuvring of a Company, as laid down in Infantry Drill, and the Manual Exercises.

(8.) That he was§	the last Annual

Second year.—If present at inspection, thirty squad, company, battalion (including the inspection), or musketry instruction drills, or such number, not less than twelve of company and battalion drills (including the inspection), three of which shall have been battalion drills, as will, with the number performed in the previous year, amount to sixty. If re-enrolled since the inspection, or absent from inspection with leave of the Commanding Officer, or through sickness duly certified, thirty-two such drills, or such number, not less than fourteen, of company and battalion drills, three of which shall have been battalion drills, as will, with the number performed in the previous year, amount to sixty-two.

Third and fourth years : also subsequent years in the case of Volunteers who have failed to complete the sixty or sixty-two drills during their first two years of service.--If present at inspection, twelve company and battalion drills (including the inspection), of which three at least shall have been battalion drills. If reenrolled since the inspection, or absent from inspection with leave of the Commanding Officer, or through sick-ness duly certified, fourteen company and battalion drills, of which three at least shall have been battalion drills.

Subsequent years, in the case of Volunteers who have completed the sixty or sixty-two drills during their first two years of service, and have been returned four times as efficient.—If present at inspection, seven company and battalion drills, including the inspection, of which three at least shall have been battalion drills. If reenrolled since the inspection, or absent from inspection with leave of the Commanding Officer, or through sickness duly certified, nine company and battalion drills, of which three at least shall have been battalion drills.

Squad drills, at which not less than four rank-and-file are present, may be reckoned when necessary to complete the number of company drills; but, when so reckoned, they can only be counted in the proportion of three squad drills, in lieu of one company drill. When counted, the number of battalion, company, and squad drills respectively attended must be stated on the certificate granted to the Volunteer.

To constitute a battalion drill reckoning towards efficiency, eighty at least of all ranks (exclusive of band) must be present, of whom not less than sixteen must be officers and serjeants.

Attendance at a brigade drill or a review may be counted as a battalion drill.

To constitute a company drill reckoning towards efficiency, sixteen at least of all ranks (exclusive of band) must be present, of whom not less than two must

bé officers and serjeants, or officers or serjeants. In cases where the Volunteer belongs to an organized cyclist section, cycling drills ordered by the commanding officers, and of not less than one hour's duration, may be counted as follows towards the total number of drills

(a) For Recruits and Volunteers in their second year of service

Ten cycling drills of any kind. (b) Volunteers in their third and subsequent year's service

Three cycling battalion drills, or three cycling company drills.

THEREAS by the six hundred and fortyfourth section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," it is enacted that on the completion of any lighthouse, buoy, or beacon, Her Majesty may by Order in Council fix dues to be paid in respect thereof in the case of any ship which passes the same or derives benefit therefrom, and the dues so fixed shall for the purposes of the said Act be deemed to be light dues:

And whereas the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses have established or are about to establish a lighthouse and fog signal on the Island of Stroma, off the north coast of Scotland:

And whereas it is fit and proper that in respect of the said lighthouse and fog signal light dues should be levied as hereinafter mentioned :

And whereas the provisions of section one of The Rules Publication Act, 1893," have been complied with:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that from and after the date of the exhibition of the said light, or from and after the time of the receipt of notice of the present Order, if that be later, by the officers authorized to collect light dues, the following rates shall be paid, that is to say :

On all vessels, whether British or foreign, which may pass or derive benefit from the said light, that is to say, on all vessels which shall pass through the Pentland Firth, or across it between lines drawn from Duncansbay Head to Old Head in South Ronaldshay on the east, and Dunnethead and Brimsness-in-Hoy on the west, eight-sixteenths of a penny per ton of the burden of every such ship if on an oversea voyage, and one-sixteenth of a penny per ton if on a coasting voyage for

each time of passing or deriving benefit. The said tolls shall be levied subject to the regulations and exemptions contained in the Consolidated Tables of Light Duties, sanctioned by an Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninetyone, or to such other regulations and exemptions as may from time to time be duly sanctioned, and subject also to the gross abatement or discount of sixty-five per centum, mentioned in the said Order in Council, dated the twenty-fourth day of November one thousand eight hundred and ninetyone, or to such other abatement or discount as may for the time being be in force.

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Her Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, and the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-nine and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, in the words following, that is to say :—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for * Eugland, in pursuance of the Act of the thirtythird and thirty-fourth years of Your Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Your Majesty, chapter thirtynine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirtysecond years of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Saint Luke Torquay, in the county of Devon and in the diocese of Excter.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Luke, Torquay is vested in the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the parish of Tormohun in the said county of Devon and in the said diocese of Exeter.

"And whereas the Reverend Henry William Majendie, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the said parish of Tormohun is desirous that the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Luke Torquay now vested in the vicar or incumbent for the time being of the said parish of Tormohun should from and a'ter the next avoidance of the vicarage of the same parish be transferred to and be vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Peter at Exeter and their successors for ever.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Henry now Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter and as such Bishop the patron of the said vicarage of the parish of Tormohun is willing that such transfer should be made and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Edward Henry Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas a sum of one hundred pounds sterling has been paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in favour of the said benefice of Saint Luke Torquay upon condition that the transfer of the advowson of the same benefice which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter proposed shall be effected.

, "And whereas it appears to us that the transfer of the patronago of the said benefice of Saint Luke Torquay which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say in the new parish of Saint Luke Torquay.

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"Now therefore with the consent of the said Henry William Majendie vicar or incumbent of the said parish of Tormohun acting as such vicar or incumbent (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Edward Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the next avoidance of the vicarage of the said parish of Tormohun the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Luke Torquay now vested in the vicar or incumbent for the time being of the said parish of Tormohun as aforesaid shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be transferred from the vicar or incumbent for the time being of the said parish of Tormohun to the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Peter at Exeter and their successors and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church of Saint Peter at Exeter and by their successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Exeter. *C. HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and haid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thi tieth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:--

say:--"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Peter South End (Croydon) situate within the borough of Croydon in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Canterbury and partly out of the consolidated chapelry of Saint Augustine Croydon in the same borough, county and diocese. "Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said new parish of Saint Peter South End (Croydon) and of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Augustine Croydon which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas Emily Watney, Spinster, and Alice Watney, Spinster, both of Sunny Nook, Selsdon-road South Croydon have together contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of five thousand pounds sterling as and for the endowment of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, then of the said new parish and of the maintenance of the minister or incumbent thereof for the time being and we have in respect of such sum agreed and have undertaken to provide and pay by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year to such minister or incumbent as aforesaid when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the said Act the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands.

"And whereas the said sum of five thousand pounds sterling has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner hereinafter set forth.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward White Lord Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said new parish of Saint Peter South End (Croydon) and of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Augustine Croydon which are described in the Schedule hereunder written (all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed) shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Emmanuel, South Croydon.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and (when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then) of the said new parish, and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised jointly by the said Emily Watney and the said Alice Watney their heirs and assigns for ever. "And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

" The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing

Scheme has reference. "The District of Emmanuel, South Croydon comprising :---

"I. All that portion of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Peter South End (Croydon) situate within the borough of Croydon in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Canterbury which is bounded upon the north by the new parish of Saint Matthew Croydon Common in the said county and diocese upon the south-east partly by the parish of Addington in the same county and diocese and partly by the parish of Sanderstead in the said county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester upon the south by the last-named parish upon the south-west by the hereinafter described portion of the consolidated chapelry of Saint Augustine Croydon in the said county of Surrey and in the diocese of Canterbury aforesaid and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the west and upon the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Augustine Croydon from the new parish of Saint Peter South End (Croydon) aforesaid at the point where the Brighton-road is joined by the southern branch of Haling-road and extending thence northward along the middle of the said Brighton-road for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Junction-road and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nine chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Selsdonroad and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sussex-road and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of eight and a quarter chains or thereabouts (thereby passing under the main line of the London Brighton and South Coast Railway and also under the line of railway connecting Selsdon-road Station with South Croydon Station) to the junction of the said Sussex-road with Moretonroad and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward along the middle of the lastnamed road for a distance of fifteen and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Crohamroad and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to its junction with Birdhurst - road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-two and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Coomberoad upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Peter South End (Croydon) from the new parish of Saint Matthew Croydon Common aforesaid.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Augustine Croydon which is bounded upon the east, upon the north-east, upon the north, and upon part of the west, by the said new parish of Saint Peter South End (Croydon) (including the abovedescribed portion thereof). And upon all other sides that is to say upon the remaining part of the west and upon the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Peter South End (Croydon) from the consolidated chapelry of Saint Augustine Croydon aforesaid at the junction of Haling Park-road with the Brighton-road aforesaid and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Crunden-road and extending thence first eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of eleven and a half chains or thereabouts to its present south-eastern end and extending thence south-eastward and in a straight line for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing the main line of the London Brighton and South Coast Railway aforesaid) to a point in the middle of the Croydon and Oxted line of railway where the boundaries of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Augustine Croydon the said parish of Sanderstead and the said new parish of Saint Peter South End (Croydon) all meet."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Canterbury. in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Paul Mill Hill, is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Reverend Elford Copland Lethbridge, Clerk in Holy Orders, now Vicar or Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Paul Mill Hill, and his heirs and assigns.

"And whereas the said Elford Copland Lethbridge is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Paul, Mill Hill, now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of London.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London. 
