WHEREAS by the twentieth section of "The Finance Act, 1894," it is enacted that Her Majesty the Queen may, by Order in Council, apply that section to any British Possession, where Her Majesty is satisfied that, by the law of such possession, no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in the United Kingdom when passing on death.

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied that by the law of the Province of Quebec in the Dominion of Canada; no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in the United Kingdom when passing on death.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power by the aforesaid Act in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the twentieth section of "The Finance Act, 1894," shall apply to the aforesaid Province of Quebec in the Dominion of Canada.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the seventeenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership

of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to a certain benefice namely, the church and cure (being a vicarage) of Saint Clement (Truro) in the county of Cornwall and in the diocese of Truro, by way of exchange for the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to a certain other benefice namely the church and cure (being a vicarage) of Manaccan in the said county of Cornwall and in the said diocese of Truro.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Clement (Truro) is vested in Your Majesty Your heirs and successors in right of the Crown and such right of patronage and presentation is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Manaccan is vested in the Bishop of Truro and his successors in right of his See.

"And whereas the Right Honourable Hardinge Stanley Baron Halsbury now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain and the Right Reverend John now Bishop of the said diocese of Truro have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said two benefices may be assigned and transferred by way of exchange in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said benefices and patronage and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty that the circumstances and present values of the said benefices respectively are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Hardinge Stanley Baron Halsbury acting on behalf of Your Majesty as aforesaid (in testimony whereof he the said Baron Halsbury has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said John Bishop of the said diocese of Truro (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint

Clement (Truro) shall be transferred from Your Majesty Your heirs and successors to and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and such right of patronage and presentation shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said John Bishop of Truro and his successors for ever and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Manaccan shall in like manner and as from the same date be transferred from the said John Bishop of Truro and his successors to and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty

Your heirs and successors and such right of patronage and presentation shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Hardinge Stanley Baron Halsbury or other the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being acting on behalf of Your Majesty Your heirs and successors in right of the Crown.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the seventeenth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth

years of Your Majesty chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Your Majesty chapter eighty-two, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church situate at Abergorlech within the limits of the parish of Llanybyther in the county of Carmarthen and in the diocese of Saint David's.

“Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Llanybyther of the parish or parochial chapelry of Llansawel in the said county and diocese and of the parish of Llanfynydd in the same county and diocese which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parishes and of such parish or parochial chapelry as aforesaid.

“And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said parish of Llanybyther of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Llansawel and of the said parish of Llanfynydd should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church situate at Abergorlech as aforesaid:

“Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Basil, Bishop of the said diocese

of Saint David's as such Bishop and also as the patron in right of his See of the vicarage of the said parish of Llanfynydd in testimony whereof he has signed this representation and caused his Episcopal seal to be affixed hereto and with the consent of the Right Honourable Hardinge Stanley Baron Halsbury Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain and as such the patron (on behalf of Your Majesty in right of the Crown) both of the vicarage of the said parish of Llanybyther and of the vicarage of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Llansawel (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Llanybyther of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Llansawel and of the said parish of Llanfynydd which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church situate at Abergorlech as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Abergorlech.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto, as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Abergorlech comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the parish of Llanybyther in the county of Carmarthen and in the diocese of Saint David's which is bounded upon the north-east and upon the east by the hereinafter described portion of the parish or parochial chapelry of Llansawel upon the south and upon the south-east by the River Cothi or in other words by the parish of Llanfynydd (including the hereinafter described portion thereof) upon the west by the parish of Llanfihangel-Rhôs-y-Corn all which said parishes are situate in the county and diocese aforesaid and upon the remaining side that is to say upon the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Llanfihangel-Rhôs-y-Corn from the parish of Llanybyther aforesaid at the point where the river called or known as Nant y Ffin is joined by the stream or watercourse which flows from a well a little to the west of the house called or known as Hendergini along the south-eastern side of the wood called or known as Allt-Esgair-onen-fawr and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said stream or watercourse for a distance of fifty-seven chains or thereabouts to the said well which well is situate within a few feet of the road which leads from the house called or known as Esgair-onen-fawr past the northern side of the said house called or known as Hendergini into the road which leads from Pont Nant y Ffin to Lliidiart-Nenog and extending thence first northward to, and then eastward along, the middle of the said roadway for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction with the said road leading from Pont Nant y Ffin to Lliidiart-Nenog and extending thence northward along the middle of the said road for a distance of forty-four chains or thereabouts to the point where it is joined by the road or footpath leading from the house called or known as Esgair-onen-fâch and extending thence north-eastward and in a straight line for a distance of fifty-four chains or there-

abouts to a point where the River Gorlech is joined by the stream or watercourse which flows from near the house called or known as Llain Farc upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Llanybyther from the parish or parochial chapelry of Llansawel aforesaid.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Llansawel which is bounded upon the south partly by the parish of Talley in the county and diocese aforesaid and partly by the hereinafter described portion of the said parish of Llanfynydd upon the west and upon the south-west by the above described portion of the parish of Llanybyther and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the north and upon the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Llanybyther from the parish or parochial chapelry of Llansawel aforesaid at the hereinbefore described point where the River Gorlech is joined by the stream or watercourse flowing from the house called or known as Llain Farc as aforesaid and extending thence eastward and in a straight line for a distance of one mile and eleven chains or thereabouts to the point a little to the east of the house called or known as Acheth-ganol where the footpath leading from the house called or known as Acheth-uchaf divides into two branches the northern branch leading past the northern side of the said house called or known as Acheth-ganol and the southern branch leading past the southern side of the same house towards the house called or known as Acheth-isaf and extending thence south-eastward and in a straight line for a distance of thirty-nine chains or thereabouts to the point where the footpath leading from the house called or known as Esgair-Gorlech joins the road leading from Abergorlech to Llansawel and extending thence still south-eastward and in a straight line for a distance of sixty-two chains or thereabouts to the point where the River Cothi is joined by the stream flowing from the wood called or known as Allt-Cwm-seiri upon the boundary which divides the said parish or parochial chapelry of Llansawel from the parish of Talley aforesaid.

"III. And also all that contiguous portion of the said parish of Llanfynydd which is bounded upon the north-west and upon the north by the hereinbefore described portion of the parish of Llanybyther upon the north-east partly by the hereinbefore described portion of the parish or parochial chapelry of Llansawel aforesaid and partly by the parish of Talley aforesaid and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the south-east upon the south and upon the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Talley from the parish of Llanfynydd aforesaid at the centre of the bridge which carries the road leading from the house called or known as Blaen-waun past the houses called or known respectively as Blaendyffryn and Blaen-dulas towards Llanfynydd over the stream called or known as Nant Ffraine and extending thence generally south-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of one mile and eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road which leads past the houses called or known as Dolau-gleision, Macs-Ifan, and Pant-y-dderwen, respectively and extending thence first generally westward and then generally northward along the middle of the last described road for a distance of one mile and seventy-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Abergorlech to Llanfynydd and extending thence south-westward

along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading towards and past the house called or known as Bryn-Dafydd and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to the point on the north of the last-named house where such road is joined by the cartway leading towards the house called or known as Pant-y-Cerig and extending thence that is to say from the last described point north-westward and in a straight line for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to the point where the footpath which leads from the last-named house to the house called or known as Bwlch-y-rhyd abuts upon the source of the stream or watercourse which flows past the western side of the last-named house into the River Cothi aforesaid and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-described stream or watercourse for a distance of forty-six chains or thereabouts to the point where the same stream or watercourse joins the River Cothi aforesaid at or near to the ford called or known as Rhyd-y-Gwial upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Llanfynydd from the parish of Llanybyther aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint David's.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-seven sections six and eight duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the seventh day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven sections six and eight have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the parish of Willesden in the county of Middlesex and now vested in us.

"Whereas under and by virtue of a certain indenture bearing date the fourth day of December one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six and made or expressed to be made between Dame Elizabeth Mary Salusbury of Offley Place in the county of Hertford Widow of the one part and us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the other part the lands and hereditaments described in the schedule hereto situate in the said parish of Willesden became and are now vested in us.

"And whereas the lands and hereditaments aforesaid are not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but are now in possession but

some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said lands and hereditaments or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit should be sold or disposed of and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands and hereditaments or in any part or parts thereof in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.
