PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations is limited to 200. It is not expected that Gentlemen will present

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Bucharest, enclosing the following copy of a

Notice issued by the Roumanian Government, viz. :—

(Translation.)

1. The Mussulmans in Roumania are advised to abstain this year from the pilgrimage to Mecca, and they are informed that, should they go thither, they will be submitted on their return, at the place where they re-enter the country, to a sanitary inspection.

2. The port of Constantza will be closed to vessels arriving directly from India, unless they have previously undergone quarantine in an Ottoman port or lazaretto, those which have undergone quarantine in a foreign lazaretto shall be submitted at Constantza to a sanitary inspection and shall only be admitted to free pratique by a special order from the general administration of the sanitary board, delivered on the basis of the telegraphic report of the captain of the port and of the doctor charged with the inspection of the vessel.

3. All vessels arriving from ports attacked by the plague shall only be admitted at the port of Sulina, where they shall be submitted to the sanitary measures prescribed in each special case on the telegraphic report of the Official Sanitary Director at Sulina.

4. Worn or used and unwashed, body and bed linen, clothes that have been worn and rags as articles of commerce which have come from places infected by the plague shall not be admitted into the country, but dirty clothes forming part of the passengers' luggage, as well as used and empty bags, shall be disinfected.

Commercial.—Marseilles Quarantine.

Ministry for Foreign Affairs state awaiting final decision Sanitary Authorities. Meanwhile rigid measures sanctioned by Cabinet must be enforced, but hoped before long may be considerably mitigated. Advisable for present, at all events, ships from plague infected localities should proceed straight to England without touching at French ports.

No. 71.—SOUTH PACIFIC OCEAN.

Reported Reefs North-West of Fiji Islands.

THE following information respecting certain dangers, reported to exist in the vicinity of the Fiji Islands, has been received from Commander J. W. Combe, Her Majesty's surveying vessel "Waterwitch":—

1. Balmoral Reef, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles in length in a north-west and south-east direction and $1\frac{3}{4}$ miles in breadth, has a least depth of 4 fathoms near its eastern edge, with general depths of 5 to 7 fathoms.

Approximate position, 4 fathoms, latitude $15^{\circ} 40' 15''$ S., longitude $175^{\circ} 52' 15''$ E.

2. Hamond Reef, reported as being in latitude $15^{\circ} 32' S.$, longitude $175^{\circ} 20' E.$, was searched for without success, the depths in the neighbourhood being 1,600 to 1,700 fathoms.

As this danger is believed to be identical with Balmoral Reef it has been expunged from the Admiralty Charts.

3. Carter Reef, reported as being in latitude $15^{\circ} 42' S.$, longitude $176^{\circ} 28' E.$, was also searched for without success, the depths being 1,600 to 1,800 fathoms around its position. This danger has also been expunged from the Admiralty Charts as it is believed to be merely another position given of the Balmoral Reef.

4. The reef reported to lie $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles S.W. from Navala Passage in approximately latitude $17^{\circ} 57\frac{1}{4}' S.$, longitude $177^{\circ} 10\frac{1}{2}' E.$, was also searched for unsuccessfully, and this danger has been expunged from the Admiralty Charts.
