Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harto :r . Department), London, May 11, 1899.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy and translation of a Royal Decree of the Queen of the Netherlands, dated 25th March, 1899, amending the Police Regulations hitherto affecting the Fishing Harbour at Ymuiden.

The translation of the Decree is subjoined :-Laws, Appointments, Decrees, &c. (Staatsblad No. 85) Decree of the 25th March, 1899, amending the Police Regulations for the Fishing Harbour at Ymuider.

We, Wilhelmina, by the Grace of God, Queen of the Netherlands, Princess of Orange Nassau, &c., &c., &c.

On the proposal of Our Minister of Water-staat Trade and Industry of 25th May, 1898, No. 147, section Waterstaat;

Having regard to the law of 28th February, 1891 (Staatsblad No. 69), enacting provisions relating to Waterstaat Works;

Having consulted the Council of State (advices of 21st June, 1898, No. 25, and of 7th March, 1899, No. 17);

Having regard to the further proposals of Our Minister aforesaid of 13th February, 1899, No. 164, section Waterstaat, and of 22nd March, 1899, No. 126, section Waterstaat:

Have approved and sanctioned beginning from 1st July, 1819, while repealing the police regulations for the fishermen's harbour at Ymniden enacted by Royal Decree of 15th June, 1836 (Staatsblad No. 96), the enactment of the following Police Regulations for the fishermen's harbour at Ymuiden :-

ART. 1. Fishing boa's with the boats which have them in tow, as also boats which have to load or unload in the service of the fishery or of the fish trade, are the only craft allowed to enter the harbour.

The greatest draught of water allowed to the vessel is 4 metres.

It is prohibited to enter the harbour with other vessels than those mentioned in the first paragraph or with vessels with a desper draught.

ART. 2. The having and keeping at hand fish cars, bumbeats, or other storing places for live fish, unless, under conditions to be assigned, the Director has given his permission, are prohibited.

ART. 3. It is prohib ted to make the harbour whenever during the day a red flug or red globular signal, or whenever at night a red light is placed on the east side of the harbour mouth.

ART. 4. On entering the harbour mouth the

speed must be reduced by the shutting off of steam or by the taking in of sails, and so regulated that the vessel may be brought up to the berth assigned, without hindrance to the vessels at their moorings.

The jib-booms must be taken in and anchors

and hooks must be drawn on board.

ART. 5. The Captain with his vessel must take the berth assigned to him by or on the part of the Harbour Master, which may be changed by him as often as he considers it necessary. As a general rule the following instructions apply to uch cases:—

Vessels must lie at the quay wall to unload only. As soon as they have discharged their lading they must be removed to the footbridge. Taking in ice and provisions, but only during the time of discharging lading, is not counted as loading. Vessels must lie at the loading stage to load only. As soon as they are loaded they must be removed to the footbridge.

Vessels moored in the direction of the axis line of the harbour must be turned with their bows

towards the harbour mouth.

ART. 6. When the Captain leaves his vessel he must leave a competent person in charge, who takes the place of the Captain, and is responsible for the due observance of the instructions in these Regulations.

ART. 7. The Captain must allow another versel to lie aside of his own and to have communication across with the quay, but this versel must not

load or unload.

ART. 8. The Captain must take the necessary measures that at the turning of the tide his vessel may not swing round against another vessel, or against the harbour works, and give special attention to the tightening or loosening of the mooring ropes in connection with the tide.

ART. 9. Unless absolutely compelled in the judgment of the harbour authorities, it is prohibited to anchor in the harbour or to drop cat anchors, whilst an anchor that has served its turn

must be weighed at once.

ART. 10. It is prohibited to have trimmed sails in the harbour.

ART. 11. It is prohibited to load or unload at other places than those assigned for that object by or on the part of the Harbour Master.

ART. 12. It is prohibited to deposit on the loading and unloading places other articles or merchandise than those which have been unloaded or which have to be shipped, or to let merchandise remain there after the termination of the period fixed by or on the part of the Harbour Master for the shipping or the removal.

ART. 13. It is prohibited to bring or unload any article on the footbridge or on the banks of

the harbour.

ART. 14. It is prohibited to have projecting irons or points along the wales, at the stopcleats, or before the side boards of the vessels.

ART. 15. It is prohibited to throw or allow to be thrown fish, offal, or other refuse into the harbour, including the land or establishments belonging to it.

ART. 16. It is prohibited to break up vessels in the harbour without the permission of the

Minister

ART. 17. It is prohibited without the permission of the Harbour Master to smelt, to dry, or to warm on board of any vessel easily inflammable substances, or such as when ignited burn fiercely, to fire guns, to burn gunpowder, or let off any fireworks.

ART. 18. The Captain on whose vessel fire has broken out must have the bell rung at once or give

a corresponding alarm signal, and remove his vessel from the neighbourhood of other vessels.

ART. 19. No bell must be rung at night on board of a vessel, unless in case of fire or some other disaster.

ART. 20. Floating articles or articles recovered from the water, the owner of which is unknown, must be given up by the finder to the Harbour Master.

ART. 21. Captains who wish to leave the harbour must give notice of it to the Harbour Master or to his representative, who if necessary shall direct the order in which the vessels have to leave.

ART. 22. The sale of fish takes place in public in the fish market, and is conducted by the officials appointed for that object by the proper authority. In this regulation shell fish and crustaceaus shall be treated as identical with fish.

In the fishermen's harbour it is prohibite!, without the permission of the Director:

(a.) to buy or sell fish in any other way;

(b.) to convey fish for sale otherwise than from the vessels to the fish market or to the buyers after the sale.

Instructions relating to the sale of the fish and to the use of the fish market shall be drawn up by the Minister.

It is prohibited to act at variance with those instructions.

ART. 23. It is prohibited, without the permission of the Minister, to carry out any work, in, on, &c., the harbour and the land and buildings belonging to the harbour.

ART. 24. The following authorities are charged with the maintenance of these regulations:

The Director of the fishermen's harbour, the officials and constables of the Government and Communal Police, the Clerks of the Waterstaat, those of the Pilot Service, those of the ambulante water inspection, who are charged with the supervision of the fishery and the harbour officials.

The officials and constables mentioned in the first paragraph are authorized to take such action as is described in Art. 6 of the law of 28th February, 1891. (Staatsblad No. 69.)

The proces-verbaux drawn up by them shall be sent to the official of the department of the Public Prosecutor, and a copy thereof to the Director.

ART. 25. The Director, the officials of the Waterstaat, and the Harbour Master are authorized to take such measures as are described in Art. 3 of the law of 28th February, 1891. (Staatsblad No. 69.)

ART. 26. Captains must obey the orders given them by or on the part of the Director or the Harbour Master in the interest of the use of the harbour or of that of the works.

There is an appeal to the Civil Governor of the province from the orders, mentioned in the first paragraph, without predjudice to the obligation of immediate obedience to those orders.

ART. 27. A proces-verbal shall be drawn up of all damage done to the works by the official of the Waterstaat, or by the harbour official who has noticed it or become aware of it.

This proces-verbal shall contain the condition in which the damaged part was before the damage was done, the circumstances under which the damage took place, the probable cost of the repairs, the person who is considered liable for the expense, and the amount that he has to pay.

For the fixing of this amount attention shall be directed to the condition of the works before the damage was done.

This proces-verbal shall be sent in to the

Director, and a copy of it be transmitted as soon as possible to the Captain.

In accordance with Article 4 of the law of 28th February, 1891 (Staatsblad No. 69), an appeal is allowed to the Director from the decision of the officials mentioned in the first paragraph.

ART. 28. In these Regulations are understood by the term fishermen's harbour or harbour, the harbour with all the quays, stages, buildings, &c., belonging thereto, included in the boundaries indicated on the land by distinguishing marks; by the term Captain, every officer in command or his representative; by the term day, the time between sunrise and sunset; by the term night, the time between sunset and sunrise; by the term Minister, the Minister charged with the execution of this Decree; by the term Civil Governor, the Civil Governor of the Queen in the Province of North Holland; by the term officials of the Waterstaat, the Inspectors, Head Engineers, Engineers, Candidate Engineers, and Supervisors of the Waterstaat; by the term Director, the Director of the fishermen's harbour; by the term harbour officials, the harbour master, the under harbour master, the auctioneers, the harbour hands, and market hands.

ART. 29. All Captains making use of the harbour must be provided with a copy of these Regulations.

They must exhibit it if required to the officials,

&c., mentioned in Article 24.

These Regulations shall be printed in the Netherlands, English, German, French, and Norwegian languages, and be everywhere obtainable.

ART. 30. Violation of the provisions of these Regulations, so far as the law does not apply to the case, shall be punished as follows :-

(a.) The violation of the second paragraph of Article 1 and Articles 2 and 3, with imprisonment

not exceeding sixty days, or a fine not exceeding three hundred florins.

(b.) Violation of the second paragraph of Article 4, of the first paragraph of Article 5, and of the 14th, 17th, and 23rd Articles, with imprisonment not exceeding thirty days, or a fine not exceeding one hundred and fifty florins.

(c.) Violation of the second paragraph of Article 5 and of the first paragraph of Articles 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 15, and 26, with a fine not exceeding one hundred florins.

(d.) Violation of Articles 13 and 16, with a

fine not exceeding seventy-five florins.

(e.) Violation of the first paragraph of Article 4 and Articles 20 and 22, with a fine not exceeding fifty florins.

(f.) Violation of the second paragraph of Articles 12, 18, 19, 21, and 29, with a fine not

exceeding twenty-five florins.

ART. 31. The Minister is empowered to allow or to order a deviation from the provisions of Articles 1, 4, 5, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 17, 19, 20, 22, and 23 of these Regulations.

Our Minister of Waterstaat Trade and Industry is charged with the execution of this Decree, which shall be inserted in the Staatsblad, and a copy of it shall be sent to the Council of State.

#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Somerset) Order, 1899.

Dated 9th May, 1899.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Somerset, I hereby make the following Order:-

This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Somerset) Order, 1899."

> II. BIRDS, Close Time Extended.

(1.) That the time during which the killing and taking of the Shelldrake or Burrow Duck is prohibited within the Administrative County of Somerset, shall be extended so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 1st day of September in each year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880. (2.) That the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880. shall apply within the Administrative County of Somerset as if the following species of birds were included in the Schedule of the said Act:-Blackcap, Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Flycatchers (Pied

Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher), Harriers (Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier), Hobby, Kestrel, Martins (House Martin, Sand Martin), Merlin, Osprey, Ousels (Ring Ousel, Water Ousel or Dipper), Peregrine, Pipits or Titlarks (Meadow Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit), Shrikes (Great Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike), Swallow, Swift, Tits (Blue Tit, Cole Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit), Wagtails (Grey Wagtail, Grey-headed Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail), Warblers (Blue-throated Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler), Wheatear, Whitethroats (Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat), Wrens (Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wood Wren or Wood Warbler), Wryneck.

Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.

(3.) That the taking or killing of any Wild Birds of the following species, during the period from the 1st day of August to the 1st day of March in any year, shall be and the same is hereby prohibited:—Bitterns (Bittern, Little Bittern), Buzzards (Buzzard, Rough-legged Buzzard), Chough, Crossbill, Dotterel, Godwis (Bar-tailed Godwit, Black-tailed Godwit), Goldfinch, Grebes (Dusky Grebe, Great-crested Grebe, Little Grebe), Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Merlin, Nightjar, Osprey, Ousel (Ring Ousel), Owls (Brown Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, White Owl or Barn Owl), Oystercatcher, Peregrine, Raven, Redshanks (Redshank, Spotted Redshank), Redstarts (Redstart, Black Redstart), Siskin, Spoon-bill, Terns or Sea Swallows (Black Tern, Common Tern, Lesser Tern), Wagtails (Grey Wagtail, Grey-headed Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail), Woodpeckers (Greater-spotted Woodpecker, Green Woodpecker, Lesser-spotted Woodpecker), Wrens (Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren).

All Birds Protected during the whole of the Year in certain Areas.

(4.) That the taking or killing of any Wild Bird, from the 1st day of August in any year to the 1st day of March following, on the beach, shore, or foreshore in the parishes of East Quantoxhead, West Quantoxhead, Dunster, and Car-hampton, and on so much of the beach, shore, or foreshore in the parish of Old Cleeve, as lies to the west of a line drawn due north from a rock known as "Grey Rock" at Blue Anchor Point (the total length proposed to be protected being six miles and a half), shall be and the same is hereby prohibited.

#### III. Eggs.

That the taking or destroying of the Egg or Eggs of any Wild Bird on the foreshore, beach, shore, or cliffs within the distance of 50 yards measured inland throughout from the top edge of the cliffs and from the inland edge of the shore or beach where there is no cliff between Sparkhayeslane, in the parish of Luccombe, in the county of Somerset, on the west, and Shurton Bars, in the parish of Stogursey, in the said county, on the east, shall be and the same is hereby prohibited.

: This Order shall not remain in force after the expiration of five years from the date thereof.
The Orders of the 27th July, 1895, and the

19th January, 1897, are hereby repealed.
