THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Buenos Ayres, enclosing the following copy of Quarantine Regulations, viz.:-

It having been proved that the bubonic plague

has broken out in the city of Oporto, the National Department of Health, in conformity with the Sanitary Agreement come to with the National Board of Health of the Republic of Uruguay, and authorized by the Supreme Government, resolves as follows :

ART. 1. To declare the port of Oporto infected, and as suspected all the other Portuguese ports, including the Islands of Madeira and the Azores, as also all the countries which do not protect

themselves sufficiently.

ART. 2. All vessels arriving from said ports which carry a Sanitary Inspector, and which have a clean bill of health, shall be disinfected and admitted to "free pratique" The passengers shall disembark in the lazaretto of Martin Garcia, where they shall be detained for the time required to disinfect their luggage.

ART. 3. Vessels arriving from the "suspected" ports without a Sanitary Inspector on board, and with a clean bill of health, shall undergo a sanitary observation of five days. Vessels arriving under the same conditions from an infected port, shall have ten days' observation. In either case the vessel shall be disinfected.

ART. 4. Vessels which may have had on board one or more suspected cases of bubonic plague, fifteen days or more previous to their arrival in port, shall undergo ten days' observation.

ART. 5. Vessels which may have had one or more suspected or proved cases of bubonic plague within fifteen days of their arrival at port, shall undergo fifteen days' observation. In such cases, as well as in the above-mentioned cases, the observation of the passengers shall commence to count as soon as the disinfection of their luggage has been completed.

ART. 6. Cargo shall be disinfected or not according to its place of origin, and that which comes from suspected or infected ports shall be disinfected. All other cargo shall be given free pratique.

ART. 7. Correspondence from infected ports shall be subjected to disinfection, and that which comes from suspected ports shall be landed without this formality.

ART. 8. The National Health I)epartment shall communicate by telegraph to the Uruguayan Board of Health any fresh event which occurs on the vessels undergoing sanitary treatment in the outer roads.

ART. 9. The Sanitary Inspectors will make statements of similar purport to the Argentine and to the Uruguayan authorities.

ART. 10. No vessel shall be refused admittance

to Argentine ports.

ART. 11. In the event of the bubonic plague breaking out epidemically on any vessel, the National Department of Health, in concert with the Uruguayan Board of Health, shall decide upon the treatment to be accorded.

ART. 12. The regulations set forth in the foregoing Articles may be modified in agreement with the Uruguayan Board of Health as the plague increases or decreases.

ART. 13. The present regulations will come into force from the present date (August 25th, 1899).

Decree respecting quarantine, viz. :-

Laws, Decrees, Appointments, &c. (Staatsblad No. 207). Decree of the 14th September, 1899, for applying the law of 26th April, 1884 (Staatsblad No. 80), supplemented by the law of 20th July, 1884 (Staatsblad No. 164), for enacting extraordinary measures for warding off certain infectious diseases, and for preventing the spreading and consequences of the same.

We, Wilhelmina, by the Grace of God, Queen of the Netherlands, Princess of Orange-

Nassau, &c., &c., &c.

Taking into consideration, that the application of the law of 26th April, 1884 (Staatsblad No. 80), supplemented by the law of 20th July, 1884 (Staatsblad No. 164), for enacting extraordinary measures for warding off certain infectious discases, and for preventing the spreading and consequences of the same, is necessary on account of the appearance of plague and other diseases as aforesaid at certain places in foreign countries:

On the proposal of Our Minister of the Interior of 18th August, 1899, No. 1710, section Medical Police, and of Our Minister of Finance of 21st August, 1899, No. 55, Import and Excise duties;

Having regard to the Royal Decree of 24th August, 1898 (Staatsblad No. 203); Having consulted the Council of State (advice

of 5th September, 1899, No. 15);

Having regard to the further report of Our Minister of the Interior of 9th September, 1899, No. 1855, section Medical Police, and of Our Minister of Finance of 11th September, 1899, No. 81, Import and Excise duties

Have approved and sanctioned the following

Articlés :

ART. 1. The importation, transit, and convey-

ance of rags, second-hand clothes, and unwashed underclothing and bedding from countries or places to be indicated by Our Ministers of the Interior and of Finance, are prohibited.

The indications shall always be made public, one day at least before they come into operation,

by inserting them in the Official Gazette.

Our Ministers aforesaid are authorized to alter those indications, as often as circumstances allow of it or make it necessary, as also to decide whether and to what extent passengers' luggage is included in the probibition.

The decisions on these subjects shall also be

inserted in the Official Gazette.

ART. 2. If the object of the prohibition is the warding off of Asiatic cholera, in the case of instructions relating to importation or transit from countries which are parties to the International Convention concluded at Dresden on 15th April, 1893, and approved by the law of 9th July, 1894 Staatshlad No. 94), for the warding off of cholera, Our Ministers aforesaid shall conform to the provisions of that Convention.

If the object of the prohibition is the warding off of the plague, in the case of instructions relating to importation or transit from countries which are parties to the Sanitary Convention concluded at Venice on 19th March, 1897, and approved by the law of 14th July, 1898 (Staatsblad No. 175), Our Ministers aforesaid shall conform to the

provisions of that Convention.

ART. 3. The present Decree, which shall con. tinue in force for one year, shall come into operation on the second day after the date of the Staatsblad and the Staatscourant, in which it was inserted.

Our Ministers of the Interior and of Finance are charged with the execution of this Decree. which shall be inserted in the Staatsblad, and at the same time in the Staatscourant, and a copy of it shall be sent to the Council of State.

The Administrative County of Wilts.

OTICE is hereby given that it is the intention of the Wilts County Council to apply to the Local Government Board for confirmation of the following Bye-laws made at a meeting of the said County Council held at Salisbury on Tuesday the first day of August, 1899.

Bye-laws made by the County Council of the Administrative County of Wilts with respect to Locomotives in the Administrative County of Wilts.

For prohibiting or restricting the use of locomotives on any specified highway in the county on account of the highway being crowded or unfitted for locomotive traffic, or of the inconvenience caused to inhabitants, or of any other reasonable cause; and for regulating the use of locomotives and of waggons drawn by locomotives on any highway.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the expression "the Council" means the County Council of the Administrative County of Wilts; and the expression "the County" means the Administrative County of Wilts, except the city of New Sarum.

2. A person in charge of a locomotive shall not use the locomotive on either of the highways in the town of Bradford-on-Avon, called or known respectively as Mason's-lane and Market-street, the same being highways whereon the use of locomotives is hereby prohibited on account of such highways being unfitted for locomotive traffic.

3. A person in charge of a locomotive on any highway shall not use the locomotive to draw more than four unloaded waggons, with or without any waggon solely used for carrying water for such locomotive.

Provided that this prohibition shall not apply in any case, where, on application to the Council, or so far as regards any highway situated in a municipal borough, to the Council of that borough, for permission to use a locomotive on any specified · journey to draw more than four unloaded waggons, with or without any waggon solely used as aforesaid, such Council may grant such permission.

4. A person in charge of a locomotive shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to remain stationary on any part of a highway for more than twenty minutes at any one time.

Provided that this Bye-law shall not be deemed to apply in any case where the stopping of the locomotive for a longer period than twenty minutes

(a.) is necessary in order to enable the person using the locomotive, or any waggon attached thereto, to comply with the requirements of any statutory provision or Bye-law for the time being in force for the regulation of the use of locomotives; or

(b.) is rendered necessary by accident, or other unavoidable cause.

5. Where for a continuous length exceeding one hundred yards a highway comprises a carriageway or cartway of a width less than sixteen feet, a person in charge of a locomotive shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to enter upon the carriageway or cartway unless and until

(a.) he shall have ascertained that throughout the length aforesaid the carriageway or cart-

way is clear of vehicles; and

(b.) a person accompanying the locomotive shall have preceded the locomotive to a sufficient distance to warn the drivers of vehicles of the approach of the locomotive.

6. A person in charge of a locomotive shall not cause or suffer the locomotive, or any loaded waggon attached thereto, to remain stationary on any highway so that any wheel of the locomotive or waggon rests on any bridge, arch or culvert, or within ten feet from the face of the abutment of any bridge, arch, or culvert.

Provided that this prohibition shall not be

deemed to apply in any case

(a.) where, in pursuance of the statutory provision in that behalf, a locomotive may be required to be instantly stopped; or

(b.) where the stopping of a locomotive may be rendered necessary by accident, or other

unavoidable cause.

7. A person in charge of a locomotive on any highway who may be required by any officer of the Council, police constable, or other person duly authorized in that behalf, to stop the locomotive, for the purpose of enabling such officer, constable, or other person to ascertain by examination whether any provision of any statute or Bye-law applicable to the locomotive, or any waggon attached thereto, has been or is duly complied with, shall forthwith cause the locomotive, if in motion, to stop, and shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to be again set in motion until such time shall have elapsed as may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of such examination.

The person in charge of the locomotive shall in connection with such examination, give all reasonable assistance that may be demanded by the officer, constable, or other person requiring

the locomotive to be stopped.

8. Nothing in these Bye-laws (with the exception of Byc-laws Nos. 5 and 6) shall apply to a steam roller for the time being employed as such by any road authority within its jurisdiction within the county.

9. From and after the date of the confirmation of these Bye-laws, the Bye-laws with respect to locomotives which were made by Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the county of Wilts, in Quarter Sessions assembled, on the sixth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and on the sixteenth day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three respectively, and which were confirmed by the Local Government Board on the twenty-eighth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and on the twelfth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four respectively, shall be repealed.
