THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Notice respecting quarantine issued by the Governor of Malta, viz. :—

Government Notice.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to modify Government Notice No. 304 of 14th November, 1899, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz. :—

1. The importation is forbidden of :

(a.) Cattle (except horses, mules, and asses) from Egypt, the Province of Naples, Calabria, and Salonica ;

(b.) Wool, hides, skins, horns, bones, and hoofs from the above places and from countries where epidemic diseases are reported ;

(c.) Cattle arriving from any place, if affected with any disease in view of which, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, their admission into the lazaretto might prove detrimental to other cattle already in the Island.

2. Cattle which may be allowed to be landed under the conditions hereinafter specified, and subject to their being kept isolated and under observation in such of the enclosures at the lazaretto as may be assigned or approved for that purpose for the period hereinafter stated.

(a.) Cattle from the Black Sea, Sea of Azov, Syria and Roumelia (unless the importation is otherwise prohibited)—subjected to three months' observation.

(b.) Cattle from Sardinia (unless the importation is otherwise prohibited)—subjected to 15 days' observation.

(c.) Cattle from Sicily (unless the importation is otherwise prohibited)—subjected to 10 days' observation.

(d.) Cattle from the Regency of Tunis (unless the importation is otherwise prohibited)—subjected to five days' observation.

(e.) Horses, mules, and asses from Egypt, the Province of Naples, Calabria, and Salonica, subjected to three days' observation, provided that such horses, mules, and asses shall be released, after inspection at the lazaretto, if the owner undertake to keep the animals in a place approved of by the Collector of Customs, and to cause them to be inspected by a Government medical officer or veterinary surgeon twice a week for nine weeks.

The cattle referred to in this paragraph shall not be allowed to be landed, unless the consignee shall have in each case and before shipment, made a written application, stating the approximate number of animals intended to be imported, and obtained the necessary permission after having agreed to abide by any regulations which may be established. Such application shall imply that the consignee has bound himself to abide by any regulations which may be in force on the day of importation, or which may be issued during the time in which the cattle may have to remain in quarantine, and also to pay the entrance fees, fees for guards, and other fees for ordinary or extraordinary expenses usually levied on cattle at the lazaretto.

3. Swine.

Swine arriving from Albania and Greece may be imported subject to 40 days' quarantine at the lazaretto or in private enclosures, and to any restrictions which the Chief Government Medical Officer may consider necessary.

4. General Provisions.

All cattle intended for importation into these Islands, must be accompanied by a certificate from the British Consular Authority, or, in default, of the Local Government Authority of the places of origin and embarkation, stating that cattle disease has not been officially reported in those places during the three months previous to the date of embarkation.

The term cattle in this paragraph includes horses, mules, asses, animals of the bovine species, sheep, goats, and swine.

5. Vessels with Cattle on Board.

Vessels arriving in this Island, having on board more than 250 head of cattle (bovine) are to go into the quarantine harbour, and the cattle are to be inspected in the cattle enclosures of the lazaretto.

6. Dogs.

The importation of dogs is subjected to three months' quarantine.

Diario Oficial, 30th January, 1900.

The Minister of State for Justice and Interior, in the name of the President of the Republic, having in view the appearance of cases of bubonic plague in the city of Rosario, in the Argentine Republic, decides :

1. To declare the port of Rosario infected, and the other Argentine ports, including Martin Garcia, suspected :

2. To order the submission to the prescribed quarantine at the Ilha Grande Lazaret or at the sanitary stations of Tamandaré and Tatuoca, of ships proceeding from the said ports.

3. To permit, in the ports of Rio Janeiro, Bahia, Pernambuco, and Belém, ships proceeding from Argentine ports, and which have not undergone quarantine in the lazaret or stations named, to effect the embarkation of passengers and cargoes in "incommunicability."

4. To order that for the purposes of free practice in national ports for ships proceeding from Argentina, the quarantine in Uruguay shall be considered supplementary to that of twenty days fixed by the Regulations in force.

5. To prohibit the entry into Brazilian ports of the susceptible articles mentioned in Article 30 of the Sanitary Regulations and further of onions, potatoes, sprouts, straw, cereals, and fodder.

6. To order that these provisions be applicable to ships proceeding from infected and suspected ports, leaving after the 9th of the current month.

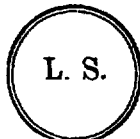

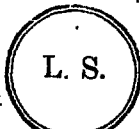

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREAS.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Revocation of Order.

1. The Order described in the First Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the First Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

Declaration of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

2.—(1.) The Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896.

(2.) The said Area, so long as it continues to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area, shall not be subject to the Swine-Fever (Movement) Order of 1898.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand nine hundred.

NORFOLK AND SUFFOLK SALES AND MOVEMENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

PART I.

PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO WHOLE SCHEDULED DISTRICT.

Prohibition of Markets &c. in Scheduled District.

1. The holding of a market, or of a public sale or exhibition of cattle, sheep, or swine, within the District described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District) is hereby prohibited.

Movement out of into or within Scheduled District.

2.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the Scheduled District.

(2.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into, or along a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District except as expressly authorized by this Order.

Movement within Scheduled District for Slaughter.

3.—(1.) An animal may be moved from any premises in the Scheduled District (not being in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place) to a slaughter-house within such District provided that the animal is accompanied by a Movement Licence and marked as required by this Article.

(2.) The Licence shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the animal or his agent authorized in writing for this purpose to the effect:

- (i.) that the animal is not affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease and has not during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; and
- (ii.) that the movement of the animal is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board;

and every such Declaration shall be annexed to the Licence granted thereon.

(3.) The Licence, in the case of an animal within a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area, may be granted by an Inspector of the Board for movement to the nearest available slaughter-house, and in the case of any other animal may be granted either by such Inspector or by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place from which the animal is to be moved.

(4.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the slaughter-house to which the animals are to be moved.

(5.) Every animal shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow \blacktriangle about six inches long on the left hind quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow \blacktriangle on the forehead of each of the sheep, and by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely:—Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm: or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above-mentioned.

(6.) Every animal shall be moved by the nearest available route and be accompanied by the Licence and shall be slaughtered after its arrival at the slaughter-house without unnecessary delay.

Movement within Scheduled District of Animals across a highway between different parts of a Farm in the same occupation.

4. An animal may be moved by the nearest available route along or across a highway or thoroughfare in the Scheduled District from one part of a farm to another part of the same farm being in the same occupation, provided that the animal to be moved is not affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and that the animal is not in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place or Area, and that the movement of such animal is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Movement for Slaughter into Boroughs of Lowestoft, Norwich, and Yarmouth.

5. An animal may be moved by railway into the borough of Lowestoft, the borough of Norwich, or the borough of Yarmouth from any place outside the Scheduled District, provided that the animal is so moved without being untrucked within the said District; and an animal so moved into a borough may be moved from the railway premises by the nearest available route to a slaughter-house within the borough, and shall be there detained and be slaughtered within four days from the date of its arrival in the borough.

PART II.

PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO PART OF SCHEDULED DISTRICT.

Movement within Part of Scheduled District for purposes other than Slaughter.

6.—(1.) An animal (not being in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place or Area) may be moved from any premises in that part of the Scheduled District which is described in the Second Schedule to this Order to any other premises in such part of the Scheduled District for

purposes of feeding, isolation, or lambing, provided that the animal is accompanied by a Movement Licence as required by this Article.

(2.) The Licence shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the animal or of his agent authorized in writing for this purpose to the effect:

- (i.) that the animal to be moved has been on the premises from which it is to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence, and that no other cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have been brought on to those premises within such period; and
- (ii.) that the animal is not affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease and has not during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; and
- (iii.) that the movement of the animal is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board;

and every such Declaration shall be annexed to the Licence granted thereon.

(3.) The Licence may be granted either by an Inspector of the Board or by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place from which the animal is to be moved.

(4.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the place or premises to which the animals are to be moved.

(5.) Every animal shall be moved by the nearest available route and be accompanied by the Licence.

Movement into Part of Scheduled District between different Farms in the same occupation.

7. Where a person occupying a farm or premises within that part of the Scheduled District which is described in the Second Schedule to this Order also occupies another farm or premises outside the Scheduled District an animal may be moved from the last-mentioned farm or premises to the farm or premises of such person within the Scheduled District with a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Board upon such a Declaration, and subject to such other conditions, as are prescribed by the preceding Article of this Order.

PART III.

GENERAL.

[Movement of Animals by Railway through Scheduled District.

8. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of an animal out of or into the Scheduled District where it is moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Saving for Regulations of Local Authority.

9. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board relating to any Disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals, but nothing in any such Regulation shall permit the movement of animals in contravention of this Order.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

10.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

11. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

12.—(1.) If a market or a public sale or exhibition of cattle, sheep, or swine is held in contravention of this Order, the person or company holding the same, and the occupier of the place or premises where the market or sale is held, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Licence thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person, with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a head of cattle or a sheep or goat or pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

13. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture:
“Animal” includes cattle, sheep, goats, and swine.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Revocation of Orders.

14. The Orders described in the Third Schedule to this Order are hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make un-

lawful anything done under the Orders hereby revoked, or affect any licence or authority granted, or any right, title, obligation, or liability accrued thereunder before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Orders hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

15. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred.

Short Title.

16. This Order may be cited as the NORFOLK AND SUFFOLK SALES AND MOVEMENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. Notwithstanding the existence of any foot-paths or right of way across or through any field, shed, or other place in the Infected Area declared by this Order, no person shall enter such field, shed, or other place while any cattle, sheep, or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:—

- (i) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.
 - (ii) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture.
3. No dog shall be allowed to be at large within the Infected Area declared by this Order.
- 4.—(1.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
- (2.) If the owner or person in charge of any dog permits such dog to be at large in contravention of this Order, such owner or person shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
