THE Queen has been graciously pleased to signify Her intention to confer the decoration of the Victoria Cross upon the undermentioned Officer of the Royal Marine Forces and Midshipman of the Royal Navy, whose claims have been submitted for Her Majesty's approval, for acts of gallantry performed by them during the recent disturbances in China, as recorded against their names:—

Rank and Name.

Act of conspicuous Bravery for which recommended.

On the 24th June, 1900, the enemy, consisting of Boxers and Imperial troops, made a fierce attack on the west wall of the British Legation, setting fire to the West Gate of the south stable quarters, and taking cover in the buildings which adjoined the wall.

The fire, which spread to part of the stables, and through which and the smoke a galling fire was kept up by the Imperial troops, was with difficulty extinguished, and as the presence of the enemy in the adjoining buildings was a grave danger to the Legation, a sortie was organized to drive them out. A hole was made in the Legation Wall, and Captain Halliday, in command of twenty Marines, led the way into the buildings and almost immediately engaged a party of the enemy.

Before he could use his revolver, however, he was shot through the left shoulder, at point blank range, the bullet fracturing the shoulder and carrying away part of the lung. Notwithstanding the extremely severe nature of his wound, Captain Halliday killed three of his assailants, and telling his men to "carry on and not mind him," walked back unaided to the hospital, refusing escort and aid so as not to diminish the number of men engaged in the sortie.

On 13th July, 1900, during the attack on Tientsin City, a very heavy cross-fire was brought to bear on the Naval Brigade, and there were several casualties. Among those who fell was one A.B., I. McCarthy, shot about 50 yards short of cover.

Mr. Guy stopped with him, and, after seeing what the injury was, attempted to lift him up and carry him in, but was not strong enough, so after binding up the wound Mr. Guy ran to get assistance. In the mean time the remainder of the company had passed in under cover, and the entire fire from the city wall was concentrated on Mr. Guy and McCarthy. Shortly after Mr. Guy had got in under cover the stretchers came up, and again Mr. Guy dashed out and assisted in placing McCarthy on the stretcher and carrying him in.

The wounded man was however shot dead just as he was being carried into safety.

During the whole time a very heavy fire had been brought to bear upon Mr. Guy, and the ground around him was absolutely ploughed up.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1878. 41 and 42 Vict., c. 16, sec. 26.

ORDER of Secretary of State prescribing, with the consent of the Board of Education, Standards of Proficiency and of Previous Due Attendance (England and Wales).

WHEREAS by the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, it is enacted as follows:—

Section 26. When a child of the age of thirteen years has obtained from a person authorized by the Education Department a certificate of having attained such standard of proficiency in reading, writing, and arithmetic, or such standard of previous due attendance at a certified efficient school, as hereinafter mentioned, that child shall be deemed to be a young person for the purposes of this Act.

The standards of proficiency and due attendance for the purposes of this section shall be such as may be from time to time fixed for the purposes of this Act by a Secretary of State, with the consent of the Education Department, and the standards so fixed shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall not have effect until the expiration of at least six months after such publication.

Attendance at a certified day industrial school shall be deemed for the purposes of this section to be attendance at a certified efficient school.

Section 95. The expression "certified efficient cechool" in this Act means a public elementary

school within the meaning of the Elementary Education Acts, 1870 and 1873, and any workhouse school in England, certified to be efficient by the Local Government Board, and also any elementary school which is not conducted for private profit and is open at all reasonable times to the inspection of Her Majesty's inspectors of schools, and requires the like attendance from its scholars as is required in a public elementary school, and keeps such registers of those attendances as may be for the time being required by the Education Department, and is certified by the Education Department to be an efficient school.

And whereas on the 7th August, 1893, an Order was made by the Secretary of State fixing standards of proficiency and standards of previous due attendance, for the purposes of the above recited enactments so far as they relate to England and Wales.

Now I, the Right Honourable Charles Thomson Ritchie, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, with the consent of the Board of Education, hereby for the purpose of the said enactments, and so far as the same relate to England and Wales, order that, from and after the 1st day of July, 1901, the aforesaid Order of the 7th August. 1893, shall be revoked, and instead thereof the following provisions shall take effect, that is to say:—

(a.) The standard of proficiency for the purpose of a certificate of proficiency to be given to any child, shall be the Fifth Standard of reading, writing, and arithmetic, as fixed by the Code in force for the time being, or any higher standard which may be attained by the child.

Certificates of proficiency may be granted in the manner prescribed by sections 4 to 8 of the Regulations of the Board of Education, dated 23rd April, 1900.

(b.) The standard of previous due attendance at a certified efficient school for the purpose of a certificate of previous due attendance shall, in the case of any child, be 350 attendances after such child has attained five years of age in not more than two schools during each year for five years, whether consecutive or not.

Certificates of previous due attendance at school may be granted in the manner prescribed by sections 9 to 11 of the Regulations of the Board of Education, dated 23rd April, 1900.

(1.) Every mortgage or charge created by a Company after the commencement of this Act and being either-

(a.) a mortgage or charge for the purpose of securing any issue of debentures; or

(b.) a mortgage or charge on uncalled capital of the Company; or

(c.) a mortgage or charge created or evidenced by an instrument which, if executed by an individual, would require registration as a bill of sale; or

(d.) a floating charge on the Undertaking or property of the Company, shall, so far as any security on the Company's property or Undertaking is thereby conferred, be void against the Liquidator and any creditor of the Company, unless filed with the Registrar for registration in manner required by this Act within twenty-one days after the date of its creation, but without prejudice to any contract or obligation for repayment of the money thereby secured.

(4.) Provided that where a series of debentures containing any charge to the benefit of which the debenture holders of that series are entitled pari passu is created by a Company, it shall be sufficient to

enter on the register-

(a.) the total amount secured by the whole series; and

(b.) the dates of the resolutions creating the series and of the covering deed, if any, by which the security is created or defined; and

(c.) a general description of the property charged; and

(d.) the names of the Trustees, if any, for the debenture holders.

(5.) Where more than one issue is made of debentures in the same series, the Company may require the Registrar to enter on the register the date and amount of any particular issue, but an

omission to do this shall not affect the validity of the debentures issued.

(6.) ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 29TH DECEMBER 1900.)

ESSEX AND HERTFORDSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1900 (No. 3).

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

Modification of former Order.

1.—(1.) The Essex and Hertfordshire (Footand-Mouth Disease) Order of 1900 is hereby modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

(2.) This Order applies to the District described in the Essex and Hertfordshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1900 (No. 2), hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District.

Movement within Scheduled District with Licence for Slaughter.

2.—(1.) An animal may be moved from any premises in the Scheduled District (not being in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place) to a slaughter-house within such District provided that the animal is marked as required by this Article and accompanied by a Movement Licence (in the form set forth in the Schedule to this Order or to the like effect) granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place from which the animal is to be moved.

- (2.) The Licence shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the animal or his agent authorized in writing for this purpose to the effect:
 - (i.) that the animal is not affected with Footand-Mouth Disease and has not during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; and
 - (ii.) that the movement of the animal is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board:

and every such Declaration shall be annexed to

the Licence granted thereon.

(3.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the slaughter-house to which the animals are to be moved.

(4.) Every animal shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense

of the owner in manner following:

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow 1 about six inches long on the left hind quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow \(\ \) on the forehead of each of the sheep, and by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition namely:-Rosin, five parts; oil of turpen-

tine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long on both sides of cach of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(5.) Every animal shall be moved by the nearest available route and shall be slaughtered after its arrival at the slaughter-house without unnecessary delay.

Movement within Scheduled District with Licence between different parts of a Farm.

3.—(1.) Where it is impossible to move animals from one part of a farm to another part of the same farm otherwise than along, over, or across a bighway or thoroughfare, and the Local Authority of the district in which such animals are, consider that it is necessary or expedient that movement of the animals should be permitted-

(a.) To a particular part of the farm, and on a

particular eccasion; or,

(b.) Between the several parts of the farm as

often as occasion may require;

such movement may be authorized by a licence (in the form set forth in the Schedule to this Order or to the like effect) granted by an Inspector of such Local Authority to the occupier of the farm, provided the animals are not in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place and that their movement is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(2.) Where the movement authorized by the Licence is movement between the several parts of the farm as often as occasion may require, the Licence shall be marked with the words " Occupation Licence" and shall be in force until it is revoked by the Local Authority by a Notice to the occupier of the farm. In other cases the Licence shall be in force for not more than four

days inclusive of the day of issue.

(3.) The Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorized to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorized to be moved.

(4.) The animals shall be moved between the several parts of the farm by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and shall be accompanied by the Licence authorizing the move-

(5.) The expression "farm" means any premises occupied by the same person as one farm whether all the premises are held of the same landlord or not, but does not include any common or other land occupied by such person together with other persons.

Saving for Orders of the Board and Regulations of Local Authority.

4. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board relating to any disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease and to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals, but nothing in any such Regulation shall permit the movement of animals in contravention of any Order of the

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

5.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Move-

ment Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

(3.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fail to give his true name and address, or give a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Offences.

6.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of the conditions of a Licence under this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the persons causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person sodoing, and the person causing, directing, or permitting him so to do, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in chargethereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act,

1894.

Interpretation.

7. In this Order-

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture: "Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats, and

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of January, one thousand nine hundred and one.

Short Title, &c.

9. This Order may be cited as the Essex AND (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) HERTFORDSHIRE ORDER OF 1900 (No. 3), and shall be read with the Orders mentioned in Article 1 of this Order.
