At Blandford Street, Marylebone, commencing in centre of road four yards West of foot-crossing of Manchester Street, and extending Westward as far as necessary; horses' heads Eastward.

Four Carriages.

In the centre of Great Cumberland Place commencing opposite No. 62, and extending Southwards as far as necessary; horses' heads to the North.

Six Carriages.

In the centre of York Place, commencing North of Refuge by Crawford Street, extending Northwards as far as necessary; horses' heads to the South.

Six Carriages.

On North side of Bradgate Road, Catford, commencing at its junction with Rushey Green, and extending as far as necessary. A space of fifteen feet to be left between the fourth and fifth carriages; horses facing East.

Six Carriages.

On the South side of Bell Street, commencing at the foot-crossing in Edgware Road. and extending Eastwards as far as necessary; horses' heads Westward.

Twe!ve Carriages.

In Kensington Park Road, to commence six yards from thcrossing at Ladbroke Road and extend as far as necessary in centre of same; horses' heads facing the South.

In the centre of Montago Place, commencing East of the crossing at Bryanston Square, and extending Eastwards as far as necessary; horses' heads to the West.

In the centre of Herbert Crescent, Chelsea, South of the lumo-post at the junction of Hans Crescent; horses' heads toward: North-East.

Six Carriages.

In the centre of Devenshire Street, commencing East side of Beaumont Street, and extending Eastwards as far as necessary towards Upper Wimpole Street; horses' heads to the West.

Five Carriages.

On the North side of Langham Street, commencing at the crossing in Great Portland Street, and extending Westward by the South side of St. Paul's Church as far as necessary; horses' heads Eastward.

Four Carriages.

On the South side of Seymour Street, commencing at Edgware Road, and extending Eastwards as far as n-cessury; ho ses' heads to the West.

Six Carriages.

In two portions, viz.:-

First portion.-Four carriages in centre of Station Road, South -Norwood, commencing opposite the Alliance Public house, and extending towards the Railway Station; horses' heads towards Selhurst Park.

Second portion.—Two carriages on West side of Cargreen Road, commencing two yards from Station Road, South Norwood; horses facing Station Road.

The first portion to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.

Twelve Carriages.

By the kerb in front of the Workhouse Railings on South side of Marylebone Road, commencing 25 yards East of the Refuge, . and extending Eastwards as far as necessary, a d keeping clear of the Registrar's Office door at East end of rank; horses facing Westwards.

Twelve Carriages.

At Golden Lane, commencing ten yards from the junction of Old . Street, at East side of Golden Lane, extending Southwards far enough for twelve hackney carriages to stand; horses' heads turned Northwards.

Three Carriages.

In the centre of Queen Anne Street, commencing at the East side. . of Wimpole-street, and extending Eastwards as far as necessary; horses' heads to the West.
