THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following information respecting quarantine in Austria-Hungary, viz. :

The precautions adopted by the Sanitary Authorities in Austria-Hungary last owing to the appearance of plague in Glasgow have now been relaxed, and all arrivals from the United Kingdom whether of passengers or merchandise are to be granted free pratique.

The Official Gazette of the 30th instant publishes a Ministerial Decree on the subject to the following effect :- "The extinction of the bubonic plague in Glasgow having been officially confirmed, the Imperial and Royal Government has seen fit to repeal the regulations contained in the Ministerial Decree of September 27th last, prohibiting the importation into or transit through Austria-Hungary of certain articles proceeding from Glasgow. Further, inasmuch as the plague no longer exists in Great Britain, direct arrivals from that country will no longer be subjected to the medical inspection prescribed by the Ministerial Decree of September 3rd last."

The Decree takes effect from the day on which it is made known to the Imperial Customs and Sanitary Authorities.
