The accession to the Throne of Your Majesty, the eldest son of our late revered Sovereign, fills us with hope and confidence that the Institutions of our Empire will be upheld and maintained in all their integrity by Your Majesty, and we earnestly pray that, in the performance of Your Majesty's exalted duties, the blessing of the Almighty may be abundantly bestowed upon Your Majesty, and upon Your Amiable and Illustrious Consort, Queen Alexandra, and that Your Majesty's Reign may be long and prosperous, and in every way conduce to the continued happiness of a free, contented, and united people.

WE, Your Majesty's loyal and dutiful subjects, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled, approach the Throne with feelings of the most devoted attachment to Your Majesty's Person and Government, and with deep and respectful sympathy, to express our heartfelt grief and sincere condolence with Your Majesty, in the death of Her late Most Gracious Majesty, our beloved Sovereign Queen Victoria, Whose many virtues and lofty patriotism caused Her Majesty to be venerated by Her subjects throughout a Reign unexampled in length, and distinguished beyond all others for National progress and prosperity.

While we bow with humble submission to the will of Divine Providence, we hail with heartfelt gratification Your Majesty's auspicious Accession

to the Throne of Your Ancestors, and have received with the liveliest satisfaction the expression of Your Majesty's gracious intentions as set out in Your Majesty's Royal Address to Your Privy Council. To the KING'S Most Excellent Majesty.
The Dutiful and Loyal Address of the Chairman, Aldermen, and Councillors of the Council of the Administrative County of London.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, the Chairman, Aldermen, and Councillors of the County Council of London, the representative authority of the inhabitants of the capital of Your Majesty's Empire, humbly approach Your Majesty in order to lay before Your Majesty this the expression of our feelings on the occasion of the death of our late much-loved Queen and of the accession of Your Majesty to the Throne.

We may be permitted to express our recognition of the high privilege we deem it to have lived under the virtuous and careful rule of the great Monarch who, over so long a period, held the sceptre of this realm; but the sense of this privilege is at the moment clouded by sadness, for to us, as indeed to all Her late Majesty's subjects, the national bereavement appears to be almost personal, and it is with these feelings that we venture not only to sympathize with, but also to share in the grief of Your Majesty and Your Majesty's Royal House.

We call to mind that the condition of the great community which we now represent has ever been a matter of concern to Your Majesty's predecessors on the Throne, and in particular, that Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth expressed Her royal anxiety at the difficulties of preserving the citizens of London in health under the conditions of "such great multitudes of people brought to inhabit in small rooms," except by "devise of more new jurisdictions and officers for that purpose." It was, however, reserved for Her late Majesty to witness, and, as we humbly believe, to help and foster the better government of her capital by the institution of new jurisdictions, and by the establishment of representative authorities charged with preserving the health and providing for the ever-increasing requirements of its inhabitants, with the result that the growth of our great City during Her late Majesty's Reign, whilst unprecedented in rapidity and magnitude, has been accompanied by a continuous improvement in the health and comfort of its population.

We venture to attribute the notable development of public opinion in favour of ameliorating the social condition of the nation which has taken place during Her late Majesty's Reign, in no small degree to the high example of Your Majesty's Father, whose noble influence, during a lifetime that was all too brief, was ever directed towards the physical and intellectual uplifting of the People. We rejoice to think that with the memory of our Late Sovereign, a name will ever be associated which is already dear to the British Race as that of a Prince whose life was devoted to the social being of His fellow-men, and we are confident, from Your Majesty's often expressed interest in problems affecting the health and happiness of all classes, that Your Majesty will be guided by a like spirit of entire devotion to the public weal.

We pray Your Majesty to believe that it is with feelings of the greatest trustfulness that we contemplate Your Majesty's accession to the Throne. The gracious message which Your Majesty has already addressed to the nation, has inspired it with confidence that the great inheritance which has descended to Your Majesty will be preserved, consolidated, and strengthened in Your Majesty's experienced hands, and watched over with fond and proud traditions.

We humbly assure Your Majesty of our entirely devoted loyalty, of our affection for Your Majesty's person, and of our proud regard for Your Majesty's gracious and royal Consort, Her Majesty Queen Alexandra.

We humbly pray that Your Majesty may

long be spared to reign over these realms, and to ever receive the love, respect, and willing obedience of a free people.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

"I RECEIVE with much satisfaction this expression of your loyalty and good will to Myself and My Consort; and the tribute which you justly pay to the virtues and excellencies of My dearly-beloved Parents, is very grateful to My feelings and to those of My Family.

"The developments made in the Government of London constitute one of the most important features of the reign of Her late Majesty. The good work done by you and your predecessors and coadjutors in municipal administration has resulted in an improvement in the health and conditions of a vastly increased population which testifies to your well-directed zeal.

"In the discharge of your onerous duties, which closely concern the welfare of millions of My people, I am confident that you will not slacken in the efforts which you have made and are making for dealing satisfactorily with the many difficult questions which await your consideration, and especially with that of the proper housing of the working classes, which is one in which I have always felt the deepest personal interest."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England did in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her late Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen duly prepare for the purpose of being laid before Her late Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the tenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and one, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-nine and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Manea, in the county of Cambridge and in the diocese of Ely.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Manea is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Honourable Magdalen Wellesley of Number 7 Lower Berkeley-street, Manchester-square, in the county of Middlesex, and her heirs and assigns.

"And whereas the said Magdalen Wellesley is

desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Manea now vested in her as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Ely.

"And whereas the Honourable and Right Reverend Alwyne now Bishop of the said diocese of Ely is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Alwyne Bishop of the said diocese of Ely has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas a benefaction of one hundred pounds sterling has been paid to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne for the benefit of the said benefice of Manea upon the understanding that we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall promote the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas having regard to this benefaction the said transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Manea will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Manea.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Magdalen Wellesley (in testimony whereof she has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Alwyne Bishop of the said diocese of Ely (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Manea now vested in her the said Magdalen Wellesley and her heirs and assigns as aforesaid, shall be transferred from her and them to the said Alwyne Bishop of the said diocese of Ely and his successors Bishops of the same diocese, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Alwyne Bishop of the said diocese of Ely and by his successors, Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ely.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 19TH FEBRUARY 1901.)

KENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER
OF 1901 (No. 2).

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in
exercise of the powers in them vested under the
Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of
every other power enabling them in this behalf,
do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of former Order.

1. The Kent (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order
of 1901 is hereby modified in manner hereinafter
appearing.

Movement within Scheduled District with Licence
between different parts of a Farm.

2.—(1.) Where it is impossible to move animals
from one part of a farm to another part of the
same farm otherwise than along, over, or across
a highway or thoroughfare, and the Local

Authority of the district in which such animals
are considered that it is necessary or expedient that
movement of the animals should be permitted
within the Scheduled District—

(i.) To a particular part of the farm, and on a
particular occasion; or

(ii.) Between the several parts of the farm as
often as occasion may require;

such movement may be authorized by a licence
(in the form set forth in the Schedule to this
Order or to the like effect) granted by an Inspec-
tor of such Local Authority to the occupier of the
farm, provided that the animals are not in a Foot-
and-Mouth Disease Infected Place and their
movement is not prohibited by Notice of an Ins-
pector of the Local Authority or of the Board
given under any Order of the Board.

(2.) Where the movement authorized by the
Licence is movement between the several parts of
the farm as often as occasion may require, the
Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation
Licence" and shall be in force until it is
revoked by the Local Authority by a Notice to
the occupier of the farm. In other cases the
Licence shall be in force for not more than four
days inclusive of the day of issue.

(3.) The Licence shall specify the name and
address of the person to whom the Licence is
granted, the number and description of the animals
authorized to be moved, and the name or descrip-
tion of the several premises to and from which the
animals are authorized to be moved.

(4.) The animals shall be moved between the
several parts of the farm by the nearest available
route and without unnecessary delay, and shall be
accompanied by the Licence authorizing the move-
ment.

(5.) The expression "farm" means any
premises occupied by the same person as one
farm whether all the premises are held of the
same landlord or not, but does not include any
common or other land occupied by such person
together with other persons.

Saving for Orders of the Board and Regulations
of Local Authority.

3. Movement of animals under this Order is
subject to any Order of the Board relating to any
disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease and
to any Regulation made by a Local Authority
under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or
regulating the movement of animals, but nothing
in any such Regulation shall permit the movement
of animals in contravention of any Order of the
Board.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal
being moved, where under this Order a Move-
ment Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a
Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or
other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority,
produce and show to him the Licence, if any,
necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to
be read and a copy of or extract from it to be
taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand
as aforesaid, give his name and address to the
Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

(3.) If a person in charge of an animal being
moved, where under this Order a Movement
Licence is necessary, on demand made under this
Order, fails to give his true name and address, or
gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed
guilty of an offence against the Diseases of
Animals Act, 1894.

Offences.

5. If an animal is moved in contravention of the conditions of a Licence under this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Interpretation.

6. In this Order—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture: “Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats, and swine.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and one.

Short Title, &c.

8. This Order may be cited as the **KENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1901 (No. 2)**, and shall be read with the Order mentioned in Article 1 of this Order.

3. Providing for the keeping of separate accounts of receipts and revenue in respect of the use of electrical energy within the district, and for forwarding copies thereof to the Council.
4. Limiting the powers of the Corporation in regard to capital expenditure during two years prior to and during the time when the

Council are authorised to re-purchase the undertaking.

5. Providing that the prices to be charged by the Corporation for the supply of electrical energy in the district shall be the same as are for the time being in force in the City of Manchester.
6. Enabling the Corporation to supply electrical energy from works within or without the district.
7. Prohibiting the Corporation from borrowing money on the security of the undertaking within the district.
8. Prohibiting the Corporation from placing electric lines and street boxes above ground except with the consent of the Council.
9. Requiring the Corporation to serve notices and plans upon the Council prior to breaking up or interfering with any street or public bridge.
10. Providing for restoring public footpaths and roadways necessitated by the laying of electric mains and works in the district of the Council.
11. Enabling the Council to require the Corporation to lay down distributing mains and to supply electrical energy to public lamps.
12. Stipulating the conditions under which the Corporation will lay down distributing mains for the purpose of a general supply throughout any street, or part of a street, in the district of the Council, and supply electrical energy for lighting public lamps.
13. Providing for the determination of the price to be paid by the Council for the supply of electrical energy to the public lamps.
14. Requiring the Corporation to supply the Council with maps of the area of supply, and to correct the same from time to time, and with copies of the Board of Trade regulations.
15. Prohibiting the Corporation from transferring their powers under the Manchester Electric Lighting Order, 1890, or consenting to the revocation of the Manchester Electric Lighting Orders, 1890 and 1896.
