PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty's reign intituled "An Act to amend the law respecting the Office of County Coroner" it is (amongst other things) enacted that when and as often as it shall seem expedient to the Justices of any County that such County should be divided into two or more districts for the purposes of that Act, or that any alteration should be made of any division theretofore made under that Act it shall be lawful for the said Justices in General or Quarter Session assembled to resolve that a petition shall be presented to Her Majesty praying that such division or alteration be made and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such petition until notice thereof shall be given to the Coroner or Coroners of such County as in that Act thereafter provided, and that the Clerk of the Peace shall give notice of any such resolution to every Coroner for such County, and of the time when the petition will be taken by the said Justices into consideration, and the Justices shall confer with every such Coroner who shall attend the meeting of the Justices for that purpose touching such petition having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed district, the number of the inhabitants, the nature of their employments and such other circumstances as shall appear to the Justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of the said Act. And such petition with a description of the several proposed districts and of the boundaries thereof with the reasons upon which the petition is founded shall be certified to Her Majesty under the hands and seals of two or more of the Justices present when such petition shall be agreed to, and the Clerk of the Peace for such County shall forthwith give or send a true copy of such petition certified under his hand to every Coroner for such County. And that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty if She shall think fit with the advice of Her Privy Council after taking into consideration any such petition and also any petition which may be presented to Her by any Coroner of the same County concerning such proposed division or alteration or whenever it shall seem fit to Her Majesty to direct the issue of a Writ de Coronatore Eligendo for the purpose of authorizing the

election of an additional Coroner above the number of those who have been theretofore customarily elected in such County to order that such County shall be divided into such and so many districts for the purposes of the said Act as to Her Majesty with the advice aforesaid shall seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such districts and every such Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

And whereas by "The Local Government Act, 1898," the powers and business of the said Justices in respect of the matters aforesaid in each County were transferred to the Council of such County.

And whereas by "The Yorkshire Coroners Act, 1897," it is enacted that for all the purposes of the Coroners Acts 1844, 1860, 1887 and 1892 the Ridings of Yorkshire shall respectively be separate counties and the County Council of each Riding shall, to the exclusion of any other authority, be the County Authority for all the purposes of those Acts.

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the twenty-sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two under the provisions of the hereinbefore first-recited Act such parts of the county of York as were not excepted by the operation of the twenty-seventh section of the hereinbefore first-recited Act were divided into ten Districts for Coroners' purposes and for the purposes of the said Act, which said Districts were named respectively the York District, the Selby District, the Doncaster District, the Rotherham District, the Wakefield District, the Halifax District, the Craven District, the Northern District, the Pickering District, and the East Riding District, and comprised respectively the several places named and set forth in the Schedule to the said Order in Council.

And whereas by a further Order in Council dated the third day of February one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight and made under the same provisions as amended by "The Local Government Act, 1898," and subject to the same exceptions as the said last-mentioned Order of the twenty-sixth day of April one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two the county of York was divided into fifteen districts for Coroners' purposes and for the purposes of the said first-recited Act, which said districts were named respectively the York Coroner's District, and (in the West Riding of the said county) the Selby Coroner's District, the Bishopthorpe Coroner's District, the Doncaster Coroner's District, the Rotherham Coroner's

District, the Wakefield Coroner's District, the Halifax Coroner's District, the Craven Coroner's District, the Kirby Malzeard Coroner's District, and (in the North Riding of the said county) the Northern Coroner's District, the Flaxton Coroner's District, the Pickering Coroner's District, and (in the East Riding of the said county) the East Riding Coroner's District, the Escrick Coroner's District, and the Bubwith Coroner's District, which said districts respectively comprised the places set forth in the Schedule to the said Order in Council.

And whereas a petition bearing date the thirtieth day of July one thousand nine hundred was presented to Her late Majesty Queen Victoria by the County Council of the East Riding of Yorkshire whereby after reciting that by a deed of surrender dated the twenty-third day of February one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England as Lords of the Manor of Howden in the East Riding of the said county and as such entitled to exercise the franchise annexed to the said manor of appointing the Coroner for the district comprised within the said manor and the liberty of the town of Howden thereby granted, surrendered and released to Her late Majesty Her heirs and successors the power, right or franchise of appointing a Coroner for the district comprising the aforesaid manor and liberty to the intent that the said power, right or franchise might thenceforth be extinguished and cease, and that the Coroner for the said district might thenceforth be appointed by the Local Authority who by the Statute had power to appoint a Coroner having jurisdiction within the said district, and after further reciting that the Coroner for the Bubwith District had died on the sixth day of January one thousand nine hundred the petitioners prayed, for the purposes of the several Acts of Parliament therein referred to, that from and after the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and one such parts of the East Riding of the county of York as were not excepted by the first hereinbefore mentioned Act should be divided into three districts to be called respectively "The East Riding Coroner's District" "The Howden shire Coroner's District" and "The York Coroner's District."

And whereas on the twenty-ninth day of October one thousand nine hundred the said petition was amended by the substitution of "The Escrick Coroner's District" for "The York Coroner's District," and by certain amendments in the Schedule to the said original petition, and the said petition as amended was duly presented to Her late Majesty.

And whereas the said petitions with a description of the said proposed districts and of the boundaries thereof with the reasons upon which the petitions were founded were duly certified to Her late Majesty.

And whereas all the provisions of the hereinbefore first-recited Act in that behalf have been complied with.

And whereas the Coroners for the said County have not presented any petition to Her late Majesty.

And whereas Her Majesty Queen Victoria departed this life on the twenty-second day of January one thousand nine hundred and one.

And whereas His Majesty King Edward the VII has with the advice of His Privy Council taken into consideration the said petitions, and is minded to make such alteration and division as aforesaid.

Now, therefore His Majesty in Council by and

with the advice of His Privy Council is pleased to order, direct and declare, as it is hereby ordered, directed and declared, that from and after the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and one:—

1. The East Riding of Yorkshire shall be divided for Coroners purposes and for the purposes of the said first-recited Act.

2. The said three districts shall be named respectively—

The East Riding Coroner's District, the Howdenshire Coroner's District, and the Escrick Coroner's District, and the said districts shall respectively comprise the places set forth in the Schedule hereto.

3. This Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

And whereas a petition was on the nineteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred, presented to Her late Majesty Queen Victoria by the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire which said petition prayed for the alteration in manner provided by law of the several Coroners' districts within the said West Riding so that the county of the said West Riding should be divided into nine districts for Coroners' purposes and for the purposes of the said hereinbefore first-recited Act.

And whereas the said petition with a description of the said proposed districts and of the boundaries

thereof with the reasons upon which the said petition was founded was duly certified to Her late Majesty.

And whereas all the provisions of the hereinbefore first-recited Act in that behalf have been complied with.

And whereas the Coroners for the said County have not presented any petition to Her late Majesty.

And whereas Her Majesty Queen Victoria departed this life on the twenty-second day of January, one thousand nine hundred and one.

And whereas His Majesty King Edward the Seventh with the advice of His Privy Council has taken into consideration the said petition and is minded to make such alteration and division as aforesaid.

Now therefore His Majesty by and with the advice of His Privy Council is pleased to order direct and declare, as it is hereby ordered, directed, and declared that from and after the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and one:—

1. The County of the West Riding of York, shall, save as is hereinafter provided, be divided into nine Districts for Coroners' purposes and for the purposes of the said first recited Act.

2. The said nine Districts shall be named respectively:—

- (1.) The Craven Coroner's District.
- (2.) The Halifax Coroner's District.
- (3.) The Wakefield Coroner's District.
- (4.) The Rotherham Coroner's District.
- (5.) The Doncaster Coroner's District.
- (6.) The Pontefract Coroner's District.
- (7.) The Bishopthorpe Coroner's District.
- (8.) The Kirkby Malzeard Coroner's District.
- (9.) The Ripon Coroner's District.

And that the said Districts shall respectively comprise the several parishes and places named and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

3. And His Majesty in Council by and with the like advice is further pleased to order, direct, and declare, as it hereby ordered directed and declared that upon the next avoidance of the office of Coroner of the Rotherham Coroner's District the following places shall be detached from such district viz.:—Adwick-upon-Dearne, Bolton - upon - Dearne, Denaby, Mexborough, Darfield, Wombwell, and Hoyland Nether, and thereupon such places shall be added to and comprised in the Wakefield Coroner's District and the Doncaster Coroner's District as follows:—to the Wakefield Coroner's District: Darfield, Wombwell, Hoyland Nether. To the Doncaster Coroner's District: Adwick - upon - Dearne, Bolton - upon - Dearne, Denaby, and Mexborough.

4. And His Majesty in Council by and with the like advice is hereby further pleased to order direct and declare that upon the next avoidance of the office of Coroner in the Coroners' Districts of Kirkby Malzeard or Ripon whichever shall first happen the area of the district so first avoided shall be added to and become merged in the other of such districts so that as from the date of such avoidance the county of the West Riding of York shall be divided into eight districts only, for Coroners' purposes and for the purposes of the said first-recited Act whereupon such united district shall be called the Ripon and Kirkby Malzeard Coroner's District.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE.**

(DATED 26TH FEBRUARY 1901.)

**KENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF
1901 (No. 3).**

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Declaration of Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected

with foot-and-mouth disease, and is in this Order referred to as the Infected Area.

Restriction of Movement of Persons.

2. Notwithstanding the existence of any foot-path or right of way, no person shall enter any field, shed, or other place in the Infected Area while any cattle, sheep, or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:—

- (i.) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.
- (ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture.

Restriction of Movement of Dogs.

3. No dog shall be allowed to be at large within the Infected Area.

Restriction of Movement of Animals.

4.—(1.) No licence under the Kent (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1901 (No. 2) authorizing movement of any animal to or from any premises in the Infected Area shall be granted after the date of this Order, and a licence granted before the date of this Order authorizing any such movement shall cease to operate and be revoked as from the date of this Order.

(2.) Notwithstanding any licence under the said Order no cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved along a highway or thoroughfare within the Infected Area.

Offences.

5.—(1.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If the owner or person in charge of any dog permits such dog to be at large in contravention of this Order, such owner or person shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of

his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(4.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a head of cattle or a sheep or goat or pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the KENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1901 (No. 3).

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Movement into out of or within Scheduled District.

1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be landed in, or moved into or out of, the District described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District).

(2.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

Movement within Scheduled District with Licence between different parts of a Farm.

2.—(1.) Where it is impossible to move animals from one part of a farm to another part of the same farm otherwise than along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare, and the Local Authority of the district in which such animals are considered that it is necessary or expedient that movement of the animals should be permitted within the Scheduled District—

(i.) to a particular part of the farm, and on a particular occasion ; or

(ii.) between the several parts of the farm as often as occasion may require ;

such movement may be authorized by a licence (in the form set forth in the Third Schedule to this Order or to the like effect) granted by an Inspec-

tor of such Local Authority to the occupier of the farm, provided that the animals are not in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place and their movement is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(2.) Where the movement authorized by the Licence is movement between the several parts of the farm as often as occasion may require, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence" and shall be in force until it is revoked by the Local Authority by a Notice to the occupier of the farm. In other cases the Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.

(3.) The Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorized to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorized to be moved.

(4.) The animals shall be moved between the several parts of the farm by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and shall be accompanied by the Licence authorizing the movement.

(5.) The expression "farm" means any premises occupied by the same person as one farm whether all the premises are held of the same landlord or not, but does not include any common or other land occupied by such person together with other persons.

Movement of Animals by Railway through Scheduled District.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of an animal into or out of the Scheduled District where it is moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Saving for Orders of the Board and Regulations of Local Authority.

4. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board relating to any disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease and to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals, but nothing in any such Regulation shall permit the movement of animals in contravention of any Order of the Board.

Production of Licences ; Names and Addresses.

5.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

(3.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

6. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

7.—(1.) If an animal is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Licence thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a head of cattle, or a sheep, or goat, or pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

8. In this Order—
“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture:
“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats, and swine:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Revocation of Orders.

9. The Orders described in the Second Schedule to this Order are hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under either of the Orders hereby revoked, or affect any licence or authority granted, or any right, title, obligation, or liability accrued thereunder before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, either of the Orders hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order; Provided also that a licence granted under an Order hereby revoked shall have effect as if it had been granted under this Order.

Commencement.

10. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and one.

Short Title.

11. This Order may be cited as the SUFFOLK (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1901 (No. 3).
