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THE following Address was presented to His Majesty at St. James's Palace on the 20th instant:—

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty,

WE, Your Majesty's loyal subjects, the Chancellor, Rector, Principal, and Professors and University Court of the University of Edinburgh, desire to tender to Your Majesty an expression of the profound sorrow with which in common with all institutions and individuals throughout the Empire, we mourn the death of our late revered Sovereign Queen Victoria. And we would humbly submit to Your Majesty our respectful sympathy in the irreparable bereavement which has befallen the Royal Family.

We recall with devout gratitude that the reign which has closed, while it exceeded in duration that of any previous occupant of the Throne, has, under the blessing of Providence, been productive of unexampled benefits in every degree of life and in every sphere of human interest, and that Her Majesty our late Queen has bequeathed to Her people an imperishable memory of nobility, purity, and wisdom.

Especially are we thankful for those marks of signal favour bestowed by our late Sovereign upon this University, which, since Her Majesty's accession, has advanced from the position of a municipal dependency to that of an autonomous Corporation, while the number of its members has greatly multiplied, so that within its precincts are congregated students not only from all parts of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, but also from our Colonies and our Indian Empire.

And now, may it please Your Majesty, we would beg in a spirit of dutiful loyalty to offer to Your Majesty our congratulations on Your accession to an historic and illustrious Throne, and to assure Your Majesty of our unswerving fidelity and devotion.

We would avail ourselves of the august occasion to recall with pride that Your Majesty was in 1859-60 a matriculated Student of the University of Edinburgh, which may thus claim to have had a share in preparing Your Majesty for the high destiny to which Your Majesty has now been called.

It is also a source of satisfaction to us to reflect that upon the last occasion of Your Majesty's presence in Edinburgh it was within the precincts

of the University that Your Majesty was admitted a Burgess of the City of Edinburgh.

It is our humble and hearty prayer that Your Majesty, following in the steps of Your August Predecessor, may long be spared to rule over a prosperous and united people.

WHEREAS by section sixteen of "The Pluralities Act, 1838," as amended by "The Pluralities Act, 1850," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or

“benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, may with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to Her Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only; and it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to give directions for regulating the course and succession in which the patrons, if there be more than one patron, shall present or nominate to such united benefice, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant.”

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the fifth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and one, in the words following, that is to say:—

“We the undersigned Frederick, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council,

“That the Right Reverend John James Stewart Lord Bishop of Worcester as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the rectory of Morton Bagot and the rectory of Oldberrow both in the county of Warwick having represented unto us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed one thousand five hundred persons may with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice we enquired into the circumstances of the case.

“That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might usefully be made and is not of inconvenient extent and that the Reverend Samuel Peshall, M.A., being the patron or person entitled to present to the rectory of Oldberrow and Constance Peshall wife of the said Samuel Peshall the patroness or person entitled to present to the rectory of Morton Bagot consent to the proposed union.

“That six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown.

“The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Worcester, our enquiry into the circumstances of the case, the statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consent in writing of the said patrons and the copies of the representation and notice before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

“And we do hereby certify the enquiry and consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council, may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes and for declaring that the course and succession in which the respective patrons for the time being shall present to the said benefices after the same shall be united into one benefice from time to time as the same becomes vacant shall be as follows: the first and every alternate right to present to the said united benefice shall belong to and be exercised by the said Samuel Peshall his heirs and assigns and the second and every alternate right to present to the said united benefice after the union thereof shall belong to and be exercised by the said Constance Peshall her heirs and assigns.

“As witness our hand this fifth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and one.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased to order as it is hereby ordered that the rectory of Morton Bagot in the county of Warwick and diocese of Worcester and the rectory of Oldberrow in the same county and diocese shall be united into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only under the style or title of the united rectories of Oldberrow and Morton Bagot.

And His Majesty in Council by and with the advice of His said Council is further pleased to order and direct that the course and succession in which the respective patrons for the time being shall present or nominate to such united benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say: the right of presentation shall be exercised alternately, the patron of Oldberrow having the first turn or right of presentation

WHEREAS by section twenty-six of “The Pluralities Act, 1838,” after reciting that “Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate

"parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend John Lord Bishop of Saint Davids hath pursuant to the enactment aforesaid represented in a writing dated the fifth day of February one thousand nine hundred and one to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Frederick Lord Archbishop of Canterbury as follows:—

"I the Right Reverend John Lord Bishop of Saint Davids do in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and six hereby represent to your Grace that there is in the county of Glamorgan and my diocese of Saint Davids the vicarage or perpetual curacy of Penrice having a population that by the census of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one amounted to two hundred and seventy.

"That there is also in the same county of Glamorgan and my diocese of Saint Davids the Rectory of Porteynon having a population that that by the census of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one amounted to two hundred and two.

"That the benefice of Penrice is now held by the Reverend Richard Henry Talbot and has no vicarage house or residence.

"That the benefice of Porteynon is now held by the Reverend David Price and has a vicarage house or residence.

"That the patronage or right of presentation or nomination to the said vicarage or perpetual curacy of Penrice is vested in Miss Emily

Charlotte Talbot of Margam Park and Penrice Castle in the county of Glamorgan and the patronage or right of presentation to the said rectory of Porteynon is vested in the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain.

"That the net annual value of the said vicarage or perpetual curacy of Penrice is eighty-three pounds ten shillings and of the said rectory of Porteynon one hundred and two pounds.

"That it appears to me that a portion of the parish of Penrice including a certain village or hamlet called Horton may under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament of the first and second years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and six and the second and third years of Her said Majesty chapter forty-nine be with advantage separated from the said parish of Penrice and annexed to the said parish of Porteynon.

"That the portion of the parish of Penrice proposed so to be separated from that parish and united to the said parish of Porteynon adjoins the said parish of Porteynon and has a present population of about one hundred and twenty-two and an area of three hundred and ten acres or thereabouts and is more particularly delineated and described in the map or plan annexed to the scheme appended to this representation being thereon coloured pink.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all persons interested. And I do submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of Miss Emily Charlotte Talbot the patron of the said vicarage or perpetual curacy of Penrice and of the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain the patron of the said rectory of Porteynon and of the Reverend Richard Henry Talbot clerk vicar or perpetual curate of the said vicarage or perpetual curacy of Penrice and of the Reverend David Price clerk rector of the said rectory of Porteynon that your Grace may if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with the said scheme certify the same and such consents to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the consents referred to in the said representation are as follows:—

"The SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the parish of Penrice in the county of Glamorgan all that portion of the said parish of Penrice containing three hundred and ten acres or thereabouts and adjoining on its west side the parish of Porteynon in the said county of Glamorgan and more particularly delineated and described in the map or plan attached hereto being thereon coloured pink. And to unite such portion of the said parish of Penrice so separated as aforesaid to the said adjoining parish of Porteynon so as to become hereafter for ecclesiastical purposes a part of such parish of Porteynon of which the parish church for the time being of the said parish of Porteynon shall be the parish church.

"That the said parish of Porteynon so enlarged shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdic-

tion as the said parish was subject to before being so enlarged.

"That the said benefices of Penrice and Porteynon shall respectively retain all the emoluments to which they were respectively entitled.

"That there is no vicarial tithe rent charge charged upon and issuing out of the said portion of the parish of Penrice so to be separated from that parish and united to the said parish of Porteynon and that the rectorial tithe rent charge charged upon and issuing out of such portion of the parish of Penrice shall as heretofore continue to be paid to the lay impropiator for the time being of the said parish of Penrice.

"That marriages in respect of the inhabitants of the said portion of the parish of Penrice so to be separated from that parish and united to the said parish of Porteynon shall hereafter be performed in the parish church of Porteynon and that the fees for all such marriages usually payable to the Incumbent of a benefice shall belong to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Porteynon.

"That baptisms churchings and burials in respect of the inhabitants of the said portion of the parish of Penrice so to be separated from that parish and united to the said parish of Porteynon shall hereafter be performed in the parish church of Porteynon and that the fees for all such offices in relation thereto usually payable to the Incumbent of a benefice shall belong to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Porteynon but that the inhabitants of the said portion of the parish of Penrice shall retain the right of burial in the churchyard of the said parish of Penrice and that the fees for any such burials in Penrice churchyard shall belong to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Penrice.

"That the Incumbent of the said parish of Porteynon shall also have cure of souls within the limits of the said portion so to be united to such parish as part of his parish.

"That the right of patronage or presentation to the said benefice of Porteynon shall remain as heretofore.

"That the inhabitants of the said portion of the parish of Penrice so to be separated therefrom and united to the said parish of Porteynon shall be exonerated from all liability (if any such now exists) to repair the parish church of Penrice or any other church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected in the said parish of Penrice.

" CONSENTS.

" I Emily Charlotte Talbot of Margam Park and Penrice Castle in the county of Glamorgan Spinster as the patron entitled to present or nominate to the vicarage or perpetual curacy of Penrice, in the said county of Glamorgan,

" And I Hardinge Stanley Earl of Halsbury the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain as the patron entitled to present to the rectory of Porteynon in the said county of Glamorgan,

" And I the Reverend Richard Henry Talbot the vicar or perpetual curate of the said vicarage or perpetual curacy of Penrice,

" And I the Reverend David Price the rector of the said rectory of Porteynon,

" Do hereby signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme above proposed for separating the said portion of the parish of Penrice from that parish and uniting the same to the adjoining parish of Porteynon for ecclesiastical purposes.

" As witness our respective hands this twenty-first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and one.

" *Emily C. Talbot.*

" *Richard H. Talbot, Vicar of Penrice.*

" *Halsbury, C.*

" *David Price, Rector of Porteynon.*"

And whereas the said scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration.

And whereas the said Archbishop being satisfied with the said scheme hath certified the same and the consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his report dated the sixth day of March one thousand nine hundred and one which said report is in the words and figures following:—

" We the undersigned Frederick, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council.

" That the Right Reverend John Lord Bishop of Saint David's has represented unto Us (amongst other things):

" That there are in the county of Glamorgan and his diocese of Saint Davids the vicarage or perpetual curacy of Penrice and the rectory of Porteynon.

" That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that a certain district including the hamlet of Horton part of the parish of Penrice and more particularly set out in the map or plan attached to the scheme hereunto annexed may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Penrice and annexed to the contiguous parish of Porteynon for ecclesiastical purposes only under the provisions of 'The Pluralities Act 1838.'

" That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all persons interested which scheme together with the consents in writing of Emily Charlotte Talbot of Margam Park and Penrice Castle in the county of Glamorgan Spinster as the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Penrice if the same were now vacant and of the Reverend Richard Henry Talbot the vicar or perpetual curate of the said parish of Penrice and of the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Porteynon in right of the Crown if the same were now vacant and of the Reverend David Price the rector of Porteynon has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

" The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop of Saint Davids and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

" And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act 1838 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and one, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“WE the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting under the provisions of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter ninety-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Mark Cheetham Hill of the new parish of Saint Mary Crumpsall and of the new parish of Saint Thomas Lower Crumpsall all within the original limits of the parish of Manchester and in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester.

“Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-fourth day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six and published in the London Gazette upon the first day of July following a part of the said parish of Manchester was disannexed therefrom and was constituted and annexed as a district for spiritual purposes to the consecrated church of Saint Mark Cheetham Hill situate within the limits of the said parish of Manchester and the said district was named ‘The District of Saint Mark Cheetham Hill.’

“And whereas the said District of Saint Mark Cheetham Hill has become a new parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-seven by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and four and by the said above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four.

“And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-sixth day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty and published in the London Gazette on the thirtieth day of the same month certain parts of the said new parish of Saint Mark Cheetham Hill and of the new parish of Saint Luke Cheetham Hill also within the original limits of the parish of Manchester aforesaid were set out and constituted for and annexed as a district for spiritual purposes to the consecrated church of Saint Mary at Crumpsall situate within the original limits of the said parish of Manchester and the same district was named ‘The District of Saint Mary Crumpsall.’

“And whereas the said District of Saint Mary Crumpsall has also become a new parish of the character contemplated as aforesaid.

“And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the tenth day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four and published in the London Gazette on the fourteenth day of the same month certain parts of the said new parish of Saint Luke Cheetham Hill and of the said new parish of Saint Mary Crumpsall were set out and constituted for, and annexed as a district for spiritual purposes to the consecrated church of

Saint Thomas situate at Lower Crumpsall within the original limits of the parish of Manchester aforesaid, and the said district was named ‘The District of Saint Thomas Lower Crumpsall.’

“And whereas the said district of Saint Thomas Lower Crumpsall has also become a new parish of the character contemplated as aforesaid.

“And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Mark Cheetham Hill and of the said new parish of Saint Mary Crumpsall and of the said new parish of Saint Thomas Lower Crumpsall should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Mark Cheetham Hill and of the said new parish of Saint Mary Crumpsall shall be altered so that all those two portions of the said new parish of Saint Mark Cheetham Hill which are described in the first schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and are thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such lastly-named new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Mary Crumpsall.

“And further that in like manner the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Mark Cheetham Hill and of the said new parish of Saint Thomas Lower Crumpsall shall be altered so that all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Mark Cheetham Hill which is described in the second schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto appended and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from the same new parish of Saint Mark Cheetham Hill and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Thomas Lower Crumpsall.

“And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“The FIRST SCHEDULE.

“The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Saint Mark Cheetham Hill in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Mary Crumpsall, in the same county and diocese being:—

“I. "We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-nine and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Conway, in the county of Carnarvon and in the diocese of Bangor.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Conway is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Sir Thomas Erskine, of Cambo, in the county of Fife, Baronet, and his heirs and assigns.

"And whereas the said Thomas Erskine is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Conway now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Bangor.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Watkin

Herbert, now Bishop of the said diocese of Bangor, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary be the said Watkin Herbert, Bishop of the said diocese of Bangor, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Thomas Erskine (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Watkin Herbert Bishop of the said diocese of Bangor (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Conway now vested in him the said Thomas Erskine and his heirs and assigns as aforesaid shall be transferred from him and them to the said Watkin Herbert Bishop of the said diocese of Bangor and his successors Bishops of the same diocese, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Watkin Herbert, Bishop of the said diocese of Bangor, and by his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 6th April, 1901, and will be payable at six months after date, viz. :—on the 6th October, 1901.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 2nd proximo, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than one o'clock, on Saturday, the 6th proximo.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

THE INEBRIATES ACTS, 1879 to 1899.

RULES FOR RETREATS LICENSED UNDER THE ABOVE ACTS.

I, THE Right Honourable Charles Thomson Ritchie, being one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by virtue of the power conferred on me by the above Acts, do hereby revoke the rules for Retreats made on the 10th day of August, 1888, by the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, then one of Her late Majesty's Secretaries of State, and in their place I do hereby make the following rules for Retreats licensed under the above Acts:—

Application for Licence.

1. Before application is made to a local authority by any person or persons desirous of obtaining a licence to conduct a retreat under the Inebriates Acts, the following particulars with respect to the proposed institution shall be previously submitted to the Secretary of State for approval.

- (1.) The name proposed for the retreat.
- (2.) The names of persons applying for a licence.
- (3.) A description and plan of the site.
- (4.) Plans of building, showing area, height, and arrangement of rooms, the external offices and conveniences attached to the buildings, and all necessary details as to safe custody, water supply and baths, fire escapes, drainage, ventilation and sanitary arrangements.

The plans must exhibit:—

- (a.) Adequate bedroom or dormitory accommodation, day rooms and proper provision for the employment of inmates. Dormitories should show 600 cubic feet of air space per head and separate bedrooms at least 720 cubic feet, but no calculation for height of room is to exceed 12 feet, and in each case conditions must exist for efficient ventilation.
- (b.) Separate and suitable room or rooms to be used, in case of necessity, for the treatment of cases of illness.

Forms.

2. The forms numbered I to VI in the Appendix A hereto shall be used for the purposes set out in the headings thereof, and in lieu of the forms set out in the Second Schedule of the Act of 1879. Forms VII and VIII are for the use of licensees making application to Justices for "Discharge" or "Leave of Absence" in the case of patients detained under the Acts, and in accordance with sections 12 and 19 respectively of the Act of 1879.

Plans.

3. The plan or plans submitted to the Justices according to the Form No. 1 of Appendix A, shall be hung up in some conspicuous place in the retreat.

On the plan or plans the rooms to be appropriated to the use of inebriates, hereafter termed "patients," shall be distinguished from those used by the licensee and his family.

Superintendent and Deputy.

4. The resident licensee of a retreat shall, wherever possible, be a registered medical man.

He may from time to time appoint a Deputy, who shall be a person approved by the Inspector, to assist him in the execution of his duties and in the general management of the retreat.

The local authority granting a licence for a retreat may give consent to the appointment of such Deputy as a permanent officer, so that he may at any time be ready to act during the temporary absence of the licensee in accordance with the conditions of section 3 of the Inebriates Act, 1888.

Books.

5. The licensee of the retreat shall provide and keep the following books, namely:—

- (a.) The "Register of Admissions and Discharges."
- (b.) The "Case Book," in which the medical attendant, or the licensee, if acting as medical attendant, shall enter the name, sex, and previous occupation of every patient admitted into the retreat, and other particulars.

Subsequent entries shall be made in the case book recording the progress of each case, and also all bodily ailments, injuries, or accidents happening to the patients; the medicines and alcoholic stimulants (if any) administered; and the special treatment adopted for the cure of the patient, with the result. Such entries shall be made monthly or oftener.

The licensee shall take such steps as are reasonably practicable to learn the history of his patients after they have been licensed or discharged, and the information thus procured shall be entered in the Case Book in the words "Doing well," "Improved," "Not improved," "Not heard of," "Insane," or "Dead," as the case may be, together with any particulars of interest that may have been ascertained.

The "Register," and "Case Book" shall respectively be in the forms, and contain entries of the particulars given and indicated in the Schedules B and C hereto annexed.

- (c.) A "Licensee's Journal," in which shall be entered, under date, particulars of all matters of importance occurring in the retreat, noting therein all instances of infraction of discipline or offences by patients, servants, or persons unconnected with the institution, especially detailing all circumstances associated with the obtaining of liquor by patients, either by their own efforts or by aid of other persons, and the means taken to prevent recurrence. Should any physical restraint or coercion be employed, a full detail of the circumstances shall be at once entered in the journal. A note shall also be made at the commencement of every month stating the number of private patients accommodated in the retreat, in addition to those duly admitted "under the Acts."

- (d.) A "Visitors' Book," with which shall be bound up Queen's Printer's copies of the above Acts, which shall be for the use of the Inspector, and the Inspector shall enter therein such observations and report as he may think fit, and a copy of all such entries shall, within three days after the date thereof respectively, be transmitted by the licensee to a Secretary of State by post.

- (e.) The licensee shall keep a list of all patients residing in his house, or who may be absent on license, together with the payments made by or for each of them.

Notices.

6. In addition to the notices required by the Acts, the licensee shall, immediately after the death or within two days of discharge of any patient in the retreat, send by post notice of such death or discharge to the Clerk of the Local Authority and to a Secretary of State.

The licensee shall, within two clear days, send by letter to the Inspector notice of every licence permitting a patient to be temporarily absent from the retreat, and such notice shall give the name and address of the person with whom the patient is to reside during such absence.

He shall also, immediately send notice by letter marked "Urgent" to the Inspector of every escape of a patient, and, on subsequent return, of the return of such patient to the retreat, stating whether or not a warrant was issued.

Admissions and Discharges.

7. Copies of admission forms sent to the Secretary of State, in accordance with section 11 of the Act of 1879, must be accompanied with exact information of the date of entry of the patient to whom such admission forms apply, and in notifying the discharge of a patient from a retreat to the Secretary of State, the licensee shall, in all cases, state the cause of such discharge.

In the event of discharge from any cause other than that of "efflux of time," the licensee shall, in notifying such discharge to the Secretary of State, send detailed particulars of the circumstances that led to his application to a Justice of the Peace for an order under section 12 of the Act of 1879. Whenever possible, notice of an intended application for discharge of a patient, duly signed by the licensee of the retreat, shall be sent, at least seven days before such application is made, to the Inspector, to the person by whom the last payment for the patient was made, and to one at least of the persons who signed the Statutory Declaration under which the patient was admitted to the retreat.

When a licensee receives notice that application is about to be made to procure the discharge of a patient under section 18 of the Act of 1879, he should furnish the Secretary of State with an immediate report of any circumstances which he considers should properly be laid before the Judge, but which are likely to remain undisclosed unless he intervene.

Inspection.

8. All parts of the retreat shall at all times be open to the Inspector, and shall be shown to him at his visitation, and every patient detained in the retreat shall be produced to him. The licensee shall give full and true information to the Inspector in reply to such inquiries as he may deem necessary, and lay before him all books, registers, lists, and documents by the Acts or hereby required to be kept, and at all times furnish him with copies of any entries which he may require.

The licensee and the medical attendant respectively shall, whenever required by the Inspector, furnish him with a special report upon the mental and bodily condition and conduct with reference to abstinence from intoxicating liquor, or otherwise, of any patient on the register of the retreat. The Inspector's annual report shall be a detailed and independent criticism of the working of each retreat during the year, and if the licensee neglects to provide facilities for employment, or allows the establishment to fall below a proper standard of discipline or efficiency, the Inspector shall report to this effect to the Secretary of State, who at his discretion will consider the advisability of communicating with the Licensing Authority.

Employment.

9. The licensee shall submit to the Secretary of State, with the other rules of the establishment, details of the kind of work to be required of the patients, and of the amount which shall be regarded as a task required by health, and of any punishments proposed for idleness and refusal to comply with such rules.

Inebriates being or becoming Insane.

10. If any patient admitted into or detained in the retreat shall be found to be, or shall while in the retreat become, insane, the licensee shall immediately give notice thereof by letter marked

"Urgent" to the Inspector, to the person by whom the last payment for such patient was made, and to one at least of the persons who signed the Statutory Declaration under section 10 of the Inebriates Act, 1879. He shall also, by giving notice to the relieving officer of the union or parish in which the retreat is situated or by procuring an urgency order, take the necessary steps to the intent that the patient so being or becoming insane may forthwith be placed under proper care and control as a lunatic.

Separation of Sexes.

11. The licensee shall, in cases where patients of both sexes are received in a retreat, make due provision for the separation of the sexes at night, and at all but defined hours in the daytime.

Treatment.

12. The licensee shall give, when required by the Inspector, full information as to the medical or other curative treatment of the patient; but if the Inspector is dissatisfied with the methods adopted, the circumstances of each particular case shall be fully reported by him to the Secretary of State, who, if he shall consider such course necessary, will make due representation to the Licensing Authority, directing their attention to the matter.

Visits of Friends.

13. Patients in a retreat may at all reasonable times be visited by their relatives and friends: Provided always, that if in any case the licensee shall think that the visit of any particular person or persons would at any particular time, or generally, be prejudicial to the patient proposed to be visited, or would be likely to hinder the cure of such patient, he may prohibit such visit.

In the case of a prohibited visit the licensee shall give his reasons for refusal, in writing, to the visitor, and an entry of such reasons shall be made in the "Journal," and a copy thereof sent to the Inspector within 24 hours.

The Inspector may at any time give an order, in writing under his hand, for the admission to any patient of any relative or friend of such patient of either sex (or of any medical practitioner or legal adviser, whom any such relative or friend of such patient shall desire to be admitted to the patient), and such order of admission may be for a single admission or for an admission for a limited number of times, or for admission generally at all reasonable times.

The licensee may, if he shall think fit, direct that interviews between patients and visitors of the opposite sex shall take place in the presence of an official or attendant of the retreat.

Patients' Letters.

14. The licensee shall deliver letters and parcels addressed to patients in his retreat, and shall post or forward all letters written by the patients of his retreat according to the intentions of the writers, except in cases in which he is authorized to open or detain them by Regulation approved by the Secretary of State under Rule 20, *post*.

Provided always, that all letters written by a patient and addressed to a Secretary of State, to any Judge of the High Court of Justice, to a County Court Judge, to the Local Authority or Clerk thereof, or to the Inspector, shall be forwarded unopened and without delay.

Public Houses.

15. A patient detained in a retreat shall not, without written permission from the licensee of the retreat, enter any public-house or other house where intoxicating liquors are sold.

Intoxicating Liquors.

¶ 16. Without special written authority from the licensee or medical attendant of a retreat, no patient detained in a retreat shall take, have in his possession, administer to another patient similarly detained, or introduce or cause to be introduced into a retreat, any intoxicating liquor, or sedative, narcotic or stimulant drug or preparation.

Prosecutions.

17. It shall be the duty of the Inspector to report to the Secretary of State any serious offence against the provisions of these Acts, or these Rules, which may be brought to the notice of the Inspector, with a view to take such action in relation thereto as the Secretary of State may direct.

Attendants.

18. Every attendant and servant shall be duly informed of the offences specified in the Acts, and of the penalties attached to the commission thereof. They shall also be furnished with a copy of the "Regulations and Orders" authorized by the Secretary of State, and it shall be the duty of the licensee to prosecute every attendant offending against the Acts or these Rules, and, in case of conviction, to dismiss the offender from his service.

Regulations and Orders.

19. "Regulations and Orders" (not inconsistent with these Rules) for the domestic arrangements of the retreat and the management and treatment of the inmates thereof shall, within one month from the granting of the licence, be drawn up by the licensee, and by him be submitted to the Inspector; and such "Regulations and Orders," when approved by the Secretary of State, shall be adopted and strictly observed in the conduct of the establishment.

(DATED 27TH MARCH 1901.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896.

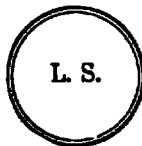

THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, that the limitation which is referred to in the paragraph printed in italics in the subjoined Extract from the General Regulations respecting Open Competitive Examinations for situations in the Civil Service included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of the 4th June, 1870, will not apply to any persons comprised in the Classes (A), (B), (C), whose service may have commenced prior to the 10th of April, 1900, being the date of publication of the Regulations in question in the London Gazette.

Extract.

"4. In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made viz:—

(iii.) Persons who have served for two full consecutive years—

(A.) In any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners,

(B.) In the Royal Irish Constabulary, or

(C.) As Registered Copyists in connection with the Civil Service, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service, *with the limitation that persons comprised in Classes (A), (B), (C), will not be allowed to deduct from their actual age more than two years when competing for the situation of Assistant of Customs, or more than one year when competing for the situation of Assistant of Excise.*"
