Chattenden Naval Tramway.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Board of Trade, acting under the powers conferred by and in virtue of the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts, have, on the application of the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland (hereinafter called the Admiralty), made and settled the Provisional Order which is annexed to this Notice, authorising the Admiralty to construct and maintain a tramway in the parishes of Hoo St. Werburgh, and High Halstow, in the county of Kent.

If any objection to the said Provisional Order, on the part of any local or road authority within whose district it is proposed by the said Provisional Order to authorise the construction of the said tramway, or on the part of any owner or occupier of any land which the Admiralty are authorised to acquire by the said Provisional Order, is made by Petition lodged with the Board of Trade within one month after the date of this Notice and publication of the said Provisional Order, the said Provisional

Order shall, under the provisions of Section 10 Sub-section (2) of the Military Tramways Act, 1887, require the confirmation of Parliament.

The said Provisional Order is as follows:—

MILITARY TRAMWAYS ACT, 1887.

(As Extended to the Admiralty by the Naval Works Act, 1899.)

Chattenden Naval Tramway.

Provisional Order made by the Board of Trade under the Military Tramways Act, 1887, as extended by the Naval Works Act, 1899, authorising the Admiralty to construct and maintain a Tramway in the parishes of Hoo St. Werburgh and High Halstow in the county of Kent.

Preliminary.

1. This Order may be cited as the Chattenden Naval Tramway Order, 1901.

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act, 1899, applies for the purposes of this Order.

(2) In accordance with Section 31 of the Interpretation Act, 1899, expressions used in this Order have, unless the contrary intention appears, the same respective meanings as in the Military Tramways Act, 1887.

(3) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

The expression “the principal Act” means the Military Tramways Act, 1887, as extended by Section 2 of the Naval Works Act, 1899.

The expressions “the deposited plan,” “the deposited sections,” and “the deposited book of reference” mean respectively the plan, sections, and book of reference deposited in respect of this Order with the Board of Trade and signed by an Assistant Secretary of the Board.

(4) In the construction of the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, which are incorporated with this Order—

(a) In accordance with Section 12 of the principal Act the expressions “tramway duly authorised” and a “tramway” shall mean the tramway authorised by this Order, and the expression “promoters” shall mean the Admiralty; and

(b) The expression “road” shall have the same meaning as in the principal Act.

Tramway and Works.

3.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Order the Admiralty may construct and maintain in the line and according to the levels shown on the deposited plan and the deposited sections, and with all works necessary or suitable to the use or working thereof, the following tramway or any part of it, namely:—

A tramway in the parishes of Hoo St. Werburgh and High Halstow, in the county of Kent, running from Teapot Hard to the Naval Magazines at Chattenden.

(2) The tramway, except where it crosses a road, will be constructed and maintained on land belonging to or to be acquired for the purposes of this Order by the Admiralty.

4.—(1) The Admiralty may, with the consent of the Treasury, enter upon, take, and use such of the lands shown on the deposited plan and described in the deposited book of reference, as may be required for the purposes of this Order.

(2) For the purpose of the acquisition of land under this Order the Lands Clauses Acts shall be incorporated with this Order, subject to the following exceptions and modifications:—

(a) Sections 16 and 17 of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and the provisions of that Act with respect to affording access

to the special Act shall not be incorporated with this Order.

(b) In the construction of this Order and the incorporated Acts, this Order shall be deemed to be the “Special Act,” and the “Admiralty” shall be deemed to be the “promoters of the undertaking.”

(c) A bond shall not be required under Section 85 of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845.

(3) The powers of the Admiralty for the compulsory purchase of land for the purposes of this Order shall cease after the expiration of three years from the date of the confirmation of this Order.

(4) The Admiralty may purchase by agreement any additional land not exceeding thirty acres in quantity for any purpose connected with the tramway.

5. Subject to the provisions of this Order the Admiralty in making the tramway may deviate from the lines and levels of the tramway as delineated on the deposited plan and sections to the following extent:—

(1) The Admiralty may deviate laterally to any extent within the limits shown on the deposited plan, and to such extent beyond those limits with the consent of the owners and lessees of the lands on which the deviation is intended to be made and of the road authority of any public road affected by the deviation as may be approved by the Board of Trade.

(2) The Admiralty may deviate vertically from the levels of the tramway shown on the section to any extent except that—

(a) Where any public road is affected by the deviation the consent of the road authority shall be requisite to any deviation exceeding in any place five feet;

(b) Where any public sewers, gas pipes, or water pipes are affected by the deviation the consent of the owners or persons having the control thereof respectively shall be requisite to any deviation exceeding the respective limits aforesaid;

(c) The Admiralty shall not construct any embankment of a greater height above the surface of the ground than the height thereof as shown on the deposited section and ten feet in addition;

(3) The Admiralty may, subject to the foregoing provisions, alter the radius of any curve described on the deposited plan so that no such curve shall thereby be reduced to a less radius than ten chains, and may further reduce the radius of any curve to such extent as the Board of Trade may approve, and may alter any inclination or gradient of the tramway shown on the deposited section, so that no such inclination or gradient thereby increased shall be steeper than one foot in one hundred feet.

6.—(1) The roads and ways mentioned in the first column of the schedule to this Order shall be carried over the railway by means of bridges of such width between the fences thereof as the Admiralty think fit, not less than the width set opposite to the number of the road or way in the second column of that schedule.

(2) Such provision shall be made for the convenient crossing of the tramway by foot passengers using the roads or ways marked X to Y on the plan as the Board of Trade direct.

7. The tramway shall be on such gauge as the Admiralty, with the approval of the Board of Trade, determine, and may be laid with single or double lines as the Admiralty think fit, subject

to the approval of the Board of Trade as to any part of the tramway which is laid upon a road.

8.—(1) The carriages used on the tramway may be moved by animal power or, with the consent of the Board of Trade, by steam power, electrical power, or any mechanical power, and the power so authorised shall accordingly be the power prescribed by the Provisional Order within the meaning of Section 6 of the principal Act.

(2) The consent of the Board of Trade, under this section, to the use of any power, may be given for such period and subject to such terms and conditions as the Board think fit.

(3) A power other than animal power shall not be used as a motive power on the tramway until byelaws or regulations have been made with regard thereto under Section 8 of the principal Act, and shall not be used otherwise than in accordance with these regulations.

9.—(1) A person shall not wilfully injure, obstruct, or trespass on the tramway or any engine or carriage used upon it.

(2) If any person acts in contravention of this provision, that person shall, for each offence, be liable to a fine not exceeding five pounds.

10. Sections 49 and 50 of the Tramways Act, 1870, which provide penalties in the case of obstruction in laying out the tramway, and in the case of wilful injury or obstruction to the tramway, shall apply in the case of the tramway authorised by this Order as they apply in the case of a tramway under the said Act.

11. The Admiralty shall cause notice of any byelaws or regulations made with regard to the tramway under Section 8 of the principal Act to be published in such manner as the Board of Trade direct.

12. In the event of the tramway or any portion thereof being worked by electricity, the Admiralty shall conform with any conditions the Board of Trade may impose, with a view to prevent injury caused by fusion for electrolytic action, or the interference with any electric wire, line, or apparatus, and with any conditions which the Postmaster-General may impose for the protection of any electric wire, line, apparatus, or work belonging to or used by him.

Provisions as to Roads.

13. The provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, mentioned in paragraph (a) of Section 4 of the principal Act (being Sections 26 to 33 (both inclusive) of the said Tramways Act, 1870), are incorporated with and form part of this Order so far as regard the construction and maintenance of the tramway if it is laid across any road being a carriageway on the level, subject as follows:—

The provisions of Sections 27 and 30 of the Tramways Act, 1870, with respect to penalties, and so much of Section 28 of the said Act as authorises the road authority, in the event of the promoters failing to comply with the provisions of the said section, themselves to do the works therein mentioned at the expense of the promoters, shall not be incorporated with this Order, and the following provisions shall apply and have effect in lieu thereof, viz:—

In any case in which it is represented in writing to the Board of Trade by the road authority of any district in which the tramway is situate, or by twenty inhabitant ratepayers of that district, that the Admiralty has made any default in complying with any of the requirements of Sections 27 or 28 of the Tramways Act, 1870, as respects any road in the district, the Board of Trade may, if they think fit, direct an

inquiry as to the matters in dispute by an officer to be appointed by the Board, and that officer shall make a report in writing to the Board, and if the Board certify that the default mentioned in the representation has been proved to their satisfaction, the Admiralty shall make good the default in the manner and within the time specified in the certificate, and if they fail to do so the road authority may themselves at any time after seven days' notice to the Admiralty make good the default in the manner so specified, and the expense incurred by the road authority in so doing shall be repaid to them by the Admiralty out of any moneys to be provided by Parliament and applicable for that purpose.

14. The following provisions shall in addition to the other provisions of this Order, and of any enactments incorporated therewith, apply with respect to such parts, if any, of the tramways as are by this Order authorised to be laid across any road being a carriageway on the level, viz:—

(1) The rails shall be such as the Board of Trade approve.

(2) The tramway shall be laid and maintained in such manner that the uppermost surface of the rail shall be on a level with the surface of the road, and if any road authority hereafter alter the level of the road whereon any of such tramways is laid or authorised to be laid, the Admiralty shall alter or (as the case may be) lay the rails so that the uppermost surface thereof shall be on a level with the surface of the road as altered.

(3) The Admiralty shall at all times maintain and keep in good condition and repair to the satisfaction of the road authority, and so as not to be a danger or annoyance to traffic, the rails of which any of such tramways for the time being consist, and the substructure upon which the same rest, and if the Admiralty fail to comply with this provision the same provisions shall apply as apply under this Order in the case of the failure by the Admiralty to comply with the requirements of Sections 27 or 28 of the Tramways Act, 1870, as incorporated with this Order.

15. Every local authority shall at all times have free access to and communication with all their sewers and drains underneath any part of a road across which the tramway is laid on the level, and power to lay lateral and private drains to communicate therewith, without the consent or concurrence of the Admiralty, and the provisions contained in Sections 32 and 33 of the Tramways Act, 1870, shall be applicable in the case of any such sewer or drain of or under the control of the local authority as if the same were a pipe for the supply of gas and water.

16. Sections 61 and 62 of the Tramways Act, 1870, which relate to the right to regulate traffic on roads, and the right of the public to use roads, shall apply with reference to any road across which the tramway is laid under the Order as they apply with reference to roads across which a tramway is laid under that Act.

17. Nothing in this Order shall take away any power of any road authority to widen, alter, divert, or improve any road across which the tramway is laid.

18. Notwithstanding anything in this Order, the Admiralty shall not acquire or be deemed to acquire any right other than that of user of any road across which the tramway is laid.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 9TH APRIL 1901.)

BURTON-UPON-TRENT (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1901.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Provisions of Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 applied to the Borough of Burton-upon-Trent.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896, dated the eleventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and

ninety-six, shall, except as hereinafter provided, apply to the borough of Burton-upon-Trent.

Movement of Swine out of Borough of Burton-upon-Trent.

2.—(1.) Notwithstanding anything in the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896, no swine, fat or store, shall be moved out of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent except as expressly authorized by this Order.

(2.) Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine where they are moved through that borough by railway from a place outside that borough to another place outside that borough without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within that borough.

Swine only to be Moved out of Borough for Immediate Slaughter.

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place) may be moved out of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of that borough, on the following conditions (namely) :

(i.) Every pig so moved shall be slaughtered within four days after and exclusive of the day on which the pig is moved out of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent, or if it has been exposed in a market fair or sale licensed under the above-mentioned Order then within four days after and exclusive of the day on which the market fair or sale was held.

(ii.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than five days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted and the name or description of the slaughter-house, pig-sty, or other place of destination to which the swine are to be moved.

(iii.) The Local Authority of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent shall cause a copy of the Movement Licence to be forthwith sent to the Local Authority of the District into which the swine are to be moved.

(iv.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article.

(v.) The swine while being moved under this Article and until they are slaughtered shall so far as practicable be kept separate from all swine not marked for slaughter under this Order or the above-mentioned Order.

(vi.) The Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate shall take such steps as are necessary to insure that the swine are moved to the said place and are slaughtered there within the period prescribed by this Article.

(vii.) No pig shall be moved under this Article unless and until it has been marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(2.) Movement of swine under this Article is subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of swine into the District of the Local Authority, but nothing in any such Regulation shall permit the movement of swine in contravention of this Order.

Forms of Movement Licence.

4. The Movement Licence under the preceding Article shall be in the Form given in the Schedule

to the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 with the requisite adaptations.

Movement of Swine by Licence of Board.

5. Swine may also be moved with a Licence of an Inspector of the Board or of a person authorized by the Board to grant the same, which Licence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the movement necessary or expedient.

Limitation on Granting of Movement Licences.

6. A movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the swine to be moved or by his agent, or by the owner or consignee or other person selling the swine, or exposing the swine for sale, or by the purchaser thereof or by his agent, or by the auctioneer or other person conducting or licensed to hold the market fair or sale at which the swine are exposed, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Movement Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

8.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act 1894.

(3.) If a pig is not slaughtered as required by this Order, the person to whom the Licence to move the pig is granted, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(4.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the person to whom the Licence to move the pig is granted, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person failing to cause the same to be so marked, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(5.) If any person, with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

9. This Order shall come into operation on the sixteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and one.

Short Title.

10. This Order may be cited as the BURTON UPON-TRENT (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER of 1901.

The enemy, who were hidden by trees, opened fire on the party at a range of about 20 yards, killing two and wounding five, including Lieutenant Sandilands. Sergeant Farmer at once went to the Officer, who was perfectly helpless, and carried him away under a very heavy and close fire to a place of comparative safety, after which he returned to the firing line and was eventually taken prisoner.
