THE King has been graciously pleased to signify His intention to confer the decoration of the Victoria Cross on the undermentioned Officers and Non-Commissioned Officer, whose claims have been submitted for His Majesty's approval, for their conspicuous bravery during the action at Komati River on the 7th November, 1900, as stated against their names :—

Regiment.	Name.	Act of Courage for which recommended.
Royal Canadian Dragoons	Lieutenant H. Z. C. Cockburn	Lieutenant Cockburn, with a handful of men, at a most critical moment held off the Boers to allow the guns to get away ; to do so he had to sacrifice himself and his party, all of whom were killed, wounded, or taken prisoners, he himself being slightly wounded.
Royal Canadian Dragoons	Lieutenant R. E. W. Turner	Later in the day when the Boers again seriously threatened to capture the guns, Lieutenant Turner, although twice previously wounded, dismounted and deployed his men at close quarters and drove off the Boers, thus saving the guns.
Royal Canadian Dragoons	Sergeant E. Holland	Sergeant Holland did splendid work with his Colt gun, and kept the Boers off the two 12-pounders by its fire at close range. When he saw the enemy were too near for him to escape with the carriage, as the horse was blown, he calmly lifted the gun off and galloped away with it under his arm.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by a General Order dated the 9th day of November, 1896, in exercise of the powers con-

ferred upon Us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and the Public Health Act, 1896, and every other power enabling Us in that behalf, made certain regulations (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), with a view to the treatment of persons affected with Cholera, Yellow Fever, or Plague, and for the prevention of the spread of such diseases;

And whereas by Article 6 of the Regulations it is provided that every Port Sanitary Authority and every other Sanitary Authority within whose district persons are likely to be landed from ships coming foreign shall, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the port, fix some place where the Master of any ship certified under the Regulations to be infected with Cholera, Yellow Fever, or Plague shall, as required by Article 10 of the Regulations, moor or anchor such ship until the requirements of the Regulations have been duly fulfilled; and it is further provided that the place to be fixed as aforesaid shall be some place within the jurisdiction or district of the Sanitary Authority, unless We otherwise consent; in which case the place so fixed shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to be within such jurisdiction or district;

And whereas the Urban District Council of Heysham being a Sanitary Authority within the meaning of the Regulations, and hereinafter referred to as "the Sanitary Authority," propose, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the Port of Barrow-in-Furness, to fix the place hereinafter referred to, and indicated by a circle drawn in red on the map or chart in the Schedule to this Order, as the place where any ship certified to be infected as aforesaid may be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article 10 of the Regulations and, such place being situate without their jurisdiction or district, have made application to Us for our consent in the matter:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by the Acts and the Regulations aforesaid, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, We do hereby Declare, Order, and Direct as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—We consent to the Sanitary Authority fixing, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the Customs Port of Barrow-in-Furness, the waters included within the circle drawn in red on the Map or Chart in the Schedule to this Order as the place where any ship, bound to any place within the District of the Sanitary Authority, and certified under the Regulations to be infected with Cholera, Yellow Fever, or Plague, shall be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article 10 of the Regulations.

ARTICLE II.—The jurisdiction of the Sanitary Authority shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to extend, and the Regulations shall apply, to any such ship certified as aforesaid which, in pursuance of the Regulations or of any directions given thereunder, shall be moored at the place so fixed as a Mooring Station as hereinafter mentioned, and to any such ship which shall be on its way thither for the purpose of being so moored.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: (Altering General Accounts Order): Appointment of Stocktaker:—

Martley Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Martley Union:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by General Orders of the Poor Law Board dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Martley Union (amongst others), it is required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts in the form of the Certificate referred to in the said Orders;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse belonging to the said Union, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Martley Union, as and when they shall think fit to do so, may appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth, and may revoke such appointment. When any such appointment is made it shall be notified to Us forthwith.

ARTICLE II.—Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations in force for the time being as to the appointment of Officers by the said Guardians, and a person appointed to the office of Stocktaker shall receive such remuneration as may from time to time be assigned to him by the said Guardians.

ARTICLE III.—No person, except with Our consent, shall be appointed to the office of Stocktaker while holding any other office under the Guardians.

ARTICLE IV.—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse, and compare the same with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the Accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account" and the "Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account."

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

ARTICLE V.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article IV, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form:—

"Submitted to me this _____ day of _____, 19____, and found to be correct as regards the quantities of stock remaining in _____ store.

" (Signed) _____
"Stocktaker."

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such alteration in the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE VI.—The Master of the Workhouse shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article IV, submit to him the stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VII.—The Master of the Workhouse shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by the first above-cited Order.

RAILWAY EMPLOYMENT (PREVENTION OF ACCIDENTS) ACT, 1900.

1. Brake levers on both sides of waggons.
2. Labelling waggons.
3. Movement of waggons by propping and towing.

5. Lighting of stations or sidings where shunting operations are frequently carried on after dark.
6. Protection of point rods and signal wires, and position of ground levers working points.
7. Position of offices and cabins near working lines.
8. Marking of fouling points.

11. Working of trains without brake vans upon running lines beyond the limits of stations.
12. Protection to permanent way men when relaying or repairing permanent way.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 19TH APRIL 1901.)

ESSEX (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF
1901 (No. 2).

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Modification of former Order.

1. The Essex (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1901 is hereby modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Movement within Scheduled District with Licence between different parts of a Farm or between Farms in the same Occupation.

2.—(1.) Where the Local Authority consider that it is necessary or expedient that any animals within their district should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District—

(i.) On a particular occasion, either from one part of a farm to another part of the same farm, or between different farms in the occupation of the same person ; or

(ii.) As often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms in the occupation of the same person ;

and it is impossible to so move the animals otherwise than along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare, the Local Authority may authorize such movement by a licence (in the form set forth in the Schedule to this Order or to the like effect) granted by an Inspector of such Local Authority to the occupier of the farm, provided that the animals are not in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place and their movement is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(2.) Where the movement authorized by the Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence" and shall be in force until it is revoked by the Local Authority by a Notice to the occupier of the farm. In other cases the Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.

(3.) The Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorized to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorized to be moved.

(4.) The animals shall be moved between the several parts of the farm or between the different farms, as the case may be, by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and shall be accompanied by the Licence authorizing the movement.

(5.) The expression "farm" means any premises occupied by the same person as one

farm whether all the premises are held of the same landlord or not, but does not include any common or other land occupied by such person together with other persons.

Saving for Orders of the Board and Regulations of Local Authority.

3. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board relating to any disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease and to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals, but nothing in any such Regulation shall permit the movement of animals in contravention of any Order of the Board.

Production of Licences ; Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

(3.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Offences.

5. If an animal is moved in contravention of the conditions of a Licence under this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Interpretation.

6. In this Order—

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture ;
"Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats, and swine.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of April, one thousand nine hundred and one.

Short Title, &c.

8. This Order may be cited as the **ESSEX (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1901 (No. 2)**, and shall be read with the Order mentioned in Article 1 of this Order.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 22ND APRIL 1901.)

HEREFORD (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1901.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Provisions of Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 applied to the City of Hereford.

1.—(1.) The provisions of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 shall apply to the city of Hereford, but no swine, fat or store, shall be moved out of the said city except as expressly authorized by this Order.

(2.) Nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine where they are

moved through that city by railway from a place outside that city to another place outside that city without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within that city.

(3.) Swine may be moved with a Licence of an Inspector of the Board or of a person authorized by the Board to grant the same, which Licence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the movement necessary or expedient.

Offences.

2. If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

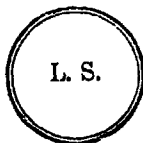

Buckinghamshire.—(1.) An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Stoke and Burnham, and the parishes of Hughenden, West Wycombe, Chepping Wycombe Rural, Little Marlow, Wooburn, and Hedsor, in the administrative county of Buckingham; and also comprising the borough of Chepping Wycombe (6 September, 1900).

(2.) An Area comprising the parishes of Hanslope, Castle Thorpe, and Haversham, in the administrative county of Buckingham (21 March, 1901).

Devonshire.—An Area comprising the parishes of Sherwood Villa, Whitestone, Alphington, Ide, Dunchideock, Shillingford, Kenn, Kenton, Powderham, Exminster, Topsham, Clyst St. George, Sowton, Heavitree (and its detached part), and Pinhoe, in the administrative county of Devon (18 April, 1901).

Gloucestershire.—An Area comprising the petty sessional division of Gloucester, in the administrative county of Gloucester; and also comprising the city of Gloucester (15 March, 1901).

Hampshire.—An Area comprising the parishes of Winton, Holdenhurst, Pokesdown, Southbourne, Highcliffe, Christchurch East, Sopley, Hurn,

Milton, Hordle, Sway, and Milford, and the borough of Christchurch, in the administrative county of Southampton; and also comprising the borough of Bournemouth (19 April, 1901).

Isle of Ely.—See Norfolk and Isle of Ely.
