EDWARD, R.

EDWARD THE SEVENTH, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, to all to whom these presents shall come; Greeting!

WHEREAS it pleased Her late Majesty by Warrant bearing date the eighteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, to appoint Commissioners for the administration of the Funds provided for the purpose of assisting Colonization in Canada, from the Congested Districts in the Western Highlands and Islands of Scotland, and in Ireland:

And whereas the Commissioners appointed by Her late Majesty, or such of them as were then

acting as Commissioners, were at the late demise of the Crown still engaged upon the business entrusted to them :

And whereas We deem it expedient that the said Commissioners should continue their labours in connection with the said scheme of Colonization, notwithstanding the late demise of the Crown :

Now know ye that We, reposing great trust and confidence in the zeal, discretion, and ability of the present members of the said Commission, do by these Presents authorize them to continue their labours, and do hereby in every essential particular ratify and confirm the terms of the said Commission.

And We do further ordain that the said Com-

missioners do report to Us under their hands and seals their several proceedings since the date of their last report to Her late Majesty ; and that any proceedings which they or any of them may have taken under and in pursuance of the said Commission since the late demise of the Crown, and before the issue of these Presents, shall be deemed and adjudged to have been taken under and in virtue of this Our Commission.

Given at Our Court at *Saint James's*, the eleventh day of *April*, one thousand nine hundred and one, in the first year of Our reign.

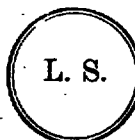

Movement into Borough of West Ham for Slaughter.

1. An animal (not being in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place) may be moved from any premises outside the Scheduled District to a slaughter-house in the borough of West Ham provided that the animal is accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of that borough.

Provisions as to Licences under this Order.

2.—(1.) A Licence under this Order shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the animal or his agent authorized in writing for this purpose to the effect:

- (i.) that the animal is not affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease and has not during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; and
- (ii.) that the movement of the animal is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the

Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board;

and every such Declaration shall be annexed to the Licence granted thereon.

(2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the slaughter-house to which the animals are to be moved, and shall be in the form set forth in the Schedule to the Essex (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1901 (No. 2) or to the like effect.

Provision as to Movement and Slaughter.

3. Every animal moved with a Licence under this Order shall be moved by the nearest available route and shall be slaughtered after its arrival at the slaughter-house without unnecessary delay

Offences.

4. If an animal is not slaughtered as required by this Order, the person to whom the Licence to move the animal is granted, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

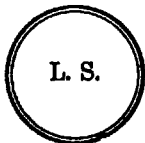
