**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.**

(DATED 8TH MAY 1901.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREAS.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The Area described in the First Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896.
2. The Orders described in the Second Schedule to this Order are hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked : Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and either of the Orders described in the Second Schedule to this

Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and one:
