Funeral of Her Late Most Sacred Majesty.

Earl Marshal's Office, May 15, 1901.

THE REMAINS OF HER LATE MOST SACRED MAJESTY QUEEN VICTORIA, of Blessed Memory, lay at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, from Tuesday, January 22nd, to Friday, February 1st, 1901.

The following Officers were on duty during that period at Osborne House:—Capt. Lloyd, Grenadier Guards; 2nd Lieut. I. O. Dennistoun, Grenadier Guards; and 2nd Lieut. Hon. C. M. B. Ponsonby, Grenadier Guards.

Four Sentries, with a Non-Commissioned Officer, were posted over the Coffin at Osborne.

At 1.45 p.m. on Friday the Coffin was borne from the House by Her Majesty's Highlanders, and placed on a Gun Carriage at the Queen's Entrance.

The Queen's Company of the Grenadier Guards, with the Queen's Colour, was drawn up facing the Entrance, and presented arms, after which, the Company wheeled about, and opened outwards, forming a double rank, through which the Gun Carriage passed.

This Escort marched on either side of the Coffin, outside the Equerries.

The Households of Her late Majesty, and of Their Majesties The King and Queen, and of the Royal Family, occupied the space outside the entrance and followed in the Procession after the Members of the Royal Family.

The Massed Bands were formed up on the Carriage Drive and moved off as soon as the Gun Carriage reached the Carriage Drive.

The Military Officers, the Royal Servants, and the Tenants of the Osborne Estate were formed up eight abreast in the Carriage Drive on the Barton Road side.

The Queen's Pipers took their place immediately in front of the Gun Carriage and played from the House to the Queen's Gate.

The Queen's Highlanders were in front of the Queen's Pipers.

The Mayors of Newport and Ryde, the Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen of the Isle of Wight Public Bodies, and the Deputy Lieutenants of the Isle of Wight, and the Royal Warrant Holders in the Island, were allotted a position inside the gates of Osborne House.

The roadway from the Queen's Gate to Trinity Pier was lined by Troops in close order.

These Troops remained in position until the minute guns from the Fleet commenced to fire.

On arrival at Trinity Pier the Massed Bands moved to a position outside Trinity Pier. The Bands ceased playing as the Coffin was drawn up at Trinity Pier, but the Drums continued the muffled roll.

On the departure of Her Majesty's Yacht "Alberta" the Bands played a Funeral March.

On the Gun Carriage being drawn up at Trinity Pier, the Coffin was removed from the Gun Carriage to the "Alberta" by Seamen of the Royal Yachts.

The Escort of The Queen's Company of Grenadier Guards formed a double line down the Gangway from the Gun Carriage to the "Alberta," and presented arms.

Minute Guns were fired by the Fleet during the passage of the "Alberta" from Cowes to Gosport.

Their Majesties The King and Queen, with His Imperial Majesty The German Emperor, and the Members of the Royal Family proceeded on board Her Majesty's Yacht "Victoria and Albert," which, with Her Majesty's Yacht "Osborne," accompanied the "Alberta" to Gosport.

All the Members of the Royal and Imperial Suites proceeded on board Her Majesty's Yacht "Victoria and Albert."

A Guard of Royal Marine Light Infantry was mounted at Gosport, and posted sentries on arrival of the Royal Yachts.

On arrival at Gosport, the Coffin remained on board Her Majesty's Yacht "Alberta," and was guarded during the night by—

A double sentry of the Royal Marine Light Infantry was posted at the head and foot of the Coffin.

On Saturday, 2nd February, 1901, at 8.40 a.m., the Coffin was carried from Her Majesty's Yacht "Alberta" by seamen of His Majesty's Yachts, and was placed in the train, which left the Clarence Victualling Yard at 8.45 a.m. for London. A Naval Guard of Honour of 100 Bluejackets was mounted on the Jetty.

Guards of Honour from the Royal Marine Light Infantry and Rifle Depot were mounted by the Train.

Troops lined the Railway on either side until the Train had passed beyond the Garrison precincts.

Full Dress was worn with red striped overalls. Troops were in Review Order with great coats, haversacks, and waterbottles.

The Vessels assembled at Spithead on the occasion of the removal of the remains of Her late Majesty the Queen were moored $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables apart, in one line, extending from off Cowes to Spithead.

The Channel Squadron formed the Eastern part and the Reserve Squadron the Western.

The Ships were moored as follows. The "Majestic" with the Vice Admiral berthed 4 cables W.N.W. from the Horse Sand Buoy, and the remaining Ships on the same line of bearing $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables apart up to the 16th berth, which was five cables E.S.E. from the S.E. Ryde Middle Buoy.

The "Alexandra" with the Rear Admiral berthed $7\frac{1}{2}$ cables N.N.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. from East Cowes Coast Guard Flag Staff, the remaining Ships (with the exception of those in 18 and 17 berths) berthed S.E. by E. Easterly from "Alexandra" $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables apart, as far as berth 19, which was $3\frac{1}{2}$ cables S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. from S.E. Ryde Middle Buoy.

Berth 17 was W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables from 16; and berth 18, E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables from 19.

Battle Ships and Cruisers moored with 6 shackles, Gun Boats with 4 shackles on each anchor, on the line of bearing with open hawse to the Southward.

The berth shewn on Plan is the position of each ship when middled.

Foreign Vessels on arrival, were berthed 3 cables S.S.W. of British Ships in the order of arrival, commencing from the Eastward.

Gun Boats were berthed at the Western end of the line for Foreign War Ships, commencing from abreast of berth 16 in that line, and working Eastwards $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables apart. Position of Western Gun Boats berth was 6 cables S.E. by S from S.E. Ryde Middle Buoy.

The procession passed to the Southward of the Battle Ships and Cruisers, and Northward of the Gun Boats, and Foreign Ships of War.

THE FOLLOWING WAS THE ORDER OF THE NAVAL PROCESSION CONVEYING THE
REMAINS OF HER LATE MAJESTY QUEEN VICTORIA.

Eight Destroyers of the Portsmouth command led the Procession from Cowes, in Columns of Divisions line ahead, one Division being off each bow of "Alberta."

On arrival in Harbour the Destroyers proceeded straight to Fountain Lake.

The "Alberta" went alongside Clarence Yard.

"Victoria and Albert" to "Trafalgar's" Buoy.

"Osborne" to "Hero's" Buoy.

"Hohenzollern" to South Railway Jetty.

"Enchantress" to Boat House Jetty.

Trinity Yacht, to Buoy.

The Depôt detailed a steam boat to attend on each of the Royal Yachts while they were at the Buoys in Harbour.

Minute Guns were fired from all Ships in the Solent, and at Cowes, commencing when "Alberta" left Trinity Pier at 3 o'clock p.m.

Each Ship stopped firing her Minute Guns immediately the tail of the Procession had passed her. After the Procession had passed the "Majestic," the Forts and Ships in Harbour commenced firing Minute Guns, and continued to do so until "Alberta" was alongside Clarence Yard.

All Guns were fired from the side of the Ship furthest from the Procession,

No Standards at all were displayed; Ensigns and Jacks were Half-Mast and Admirals' Flags right up.

The Bands played the Funeral Marches of Chopin and Beethoven only. No National Anthem was played.

On the approach of the Procession Ships were manned; Guards and Bands paraded by signal from their own Admiral commanding the Division.

The Guard presented arms as the "Alberta" passed each Ship, and then rested on their arms reversed until the Procession had gone well past her; Bands played the Dead Marches.

Ships remained manned until the Procession had passed and laid by signal from their own Admiral.

All the Marines from the Depôt and 200 men from "Excellent," manned Clarence Yard, under Captain of Depôt. Men of the Depôt manned the sea face of the Dockyard (drawn up behind the bollards) from end of South Railway Jetty to North Railway Jetty, under direction of Commander of Depôt.

Boys from the "St. Vincent" manned Burrow Island under Commander of "St. Vincent."

Guard from Depôt and Admiral's Band were on board "Victory."

A Cutter, with a Lieutenant in charge, was at each point of the entrance to Creek of Clarence Yard.

Two Picket Boats, with a Lieutenant in each, kept the course clear from entrance of Harbour to "Victory"—boats provided, officered and manned by Depôt.

These boats also carried out Guard duty at night.

Men. No. 1 and Hats.

The Gilkicker Signal Station, which is in telephonic communication with the Signal Tower, was manned whilst the Ships were assembled at Spithead.

The Flag of the Commander-in-Chief at Portsmouth was not saluted by any Ships arriving at Spithead.

Fires were put out when Ships were in exact station.

All Flag Officers and Staff, all Captains, The Inspector General of Haslar Hospital, The Superintendent of Clarence Yard, and The Chief Inspector of Machinery attended at the Clarence Yard on the occasion of the removal of the remains of Her late Majesty QUEEN VICTORIA, from the "Alberta" to the train.

Minute Guns were fired from the "Victory," "Majestic," and all saluting ships in Harbour, from the time the Coffin left the "Alberta," till the train was out of sight.

Guards and Bands were paraded in the "Victory," and "St. Vincent," and those two ships manned by signal.

100 Marines from the Dépôt and 100 Seamen from the "Excellent" formed guards to the right and left of the Railway Line, outside the Station, under the Captain of the Dépôt.

Four Steam boats from "Vernon" were in the vicinity of the Royal Yachts, in time to disembark the Royal Princes and their Suites.

In connection with the Funeral at Windsor the "Majestic" fired 81 Minute Guns, commencing at 2.11 p.m., and ceasing at 3.31 p.m., when the Military commenced at 3.32, and ceased at 4.52, Sunset.

ORDER OF CEREMONIAL OBSERVED IN LONDON AND AT WINDSOR AT THE FUNERAL OF HER LATE MAJESTY QUEEN VICTORIA, 2ND FEBRUARY, 1901.

On Saturday the Second day of February, 1901, the train from Portsmouth conveying the Remains of Her late Majesty, and also conveying The King and other Members of the Royal Family, arrived at Victoria Station at 11 o'clock. The Earl Marshal, The Lord Steward, The Lord Chamberlain of the Household, and The Master of the Horse were in attendance at the Station.

Naval and Military Guards of Honour were mounted at the Station.

The Coffin was removed from the Train by an Officer and twelve men of the Foot Guards and Household Cavalry, and, having been placed upon a Gun carriage, was covered by a Pall of white satin and by the Royal Standard, on which rested the Cushion and Crown, the Regalia, and the Insignia of the Order of the Garter.

The Gun Carriage conveying the Remains of Her late Majesty was then drawn by eight cream coloured horses to Paddington Railway Station, escorted in the following processional order:—

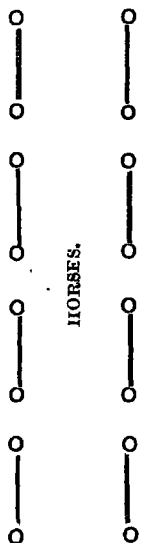

CLOSING ESCORT.

Eighty-one Minute Guns were fired while the Procession moved from Victoria to Paddington Stations.

The King, the Members of the Royal Family, the Royal Representatives, with the exception of those whose names appear in the list of occupants of the six Royal Carriages, the Earl Marshal and the Master of the Horse rode on Horseback.

The Coffin was taken from the Gun Carriage, on the arrival at Paddington Station, by the Bearer Party of Non-Commissioned Officers of the Guards and Household Cavalry, and was placed in the Royal Train, which also conveyed The King and the other Royal Personages who had taken part in the Procession.

On arriving at Windsor the Coffin was removed from the train by a second Bearer Party of Non-Commissioned Officers of the Guards and Household Cavalry, and placed upon a Gun Carriage drawn by eight horses of the Royal Artillery, covered by a Pall of white satin and the Royal Standard, on which rested the Cushion and Crown, the Regalia, and Insignia of the Order of the Garter.

Naval and Military Guards of Honour were mounted at Windsor.

At the moment of starting for St. George's Chapel the horses attached to the Gun Carriage became restive and it was found necessary to unharness them. The duty of drawing the Gun Carriage was then entrusted to a detachment of the men forming the Naval Guard of Honour.

The Gold Sticks and White Staves proceeded on either side of this Procession into the Choir.

Behind the Coffin, which was immediately preceded by the Earl Marshal, The Lord Steward, and The Lord Chamberlain, walked The King, the other Members of the Royal Family, the Royal Representatives and the remainder of the Procession; those who had ranged themselves outside the West Door falling in after the suites of the Special Envoys.

His Majesty The King, Chief Mourner, stood at the Head of the Coffin.

The Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household took his place at the Foot of the Coffin.

The Lesson was read by The Bishop of Winchester.

The Sentence "I heard a voice from Heaven" was read by The Dean of Windsor, and after the Lord's Prayer the Anthem "How blest are they" was sung.

The Prayers were read by The Archbishop of Canterbury.

William Henry Weldon, Esquire, Norroy, Deputy to Garter Principal King of Arms, pronounced the Styles of Her late Most Sacred Majesty of Blessed Memory:—

"Thus it hath pleased Almighty God to take out of this transitory life unto His Divine Mercy,

"the late Most High, Most Mighty, and Most Excellent Monarch, Victoria by the Grace

"of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the

"Faith, Empress of India, and Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter.

"Let us humbly beseech Almighty God to bless with long life, health and honour, and all

"worldly happiness, the Most High, Most Mighty, and Most Excellent Monarch, Our

"Sovereign Lord, Edward, now, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great

"Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, and Sovereign of

"the Most Noble Order of the Garter."

"GOD SAVE THE KING."

The Anthem, "Blessed are the departed," was then sung, and the Archbishop of Canterbury pronounced the Benediction.

The Foreign Representatives who were especially accredited for the occasion, and the Ambassadors and Ministers, were accompanied by Colonel the Hon. Sir William Colville, K.C.V.O., C.B., Master of the Ceremonies, the Hon. R. Moreton, Marshal of the Ceremonies, and R. F. Synge, Esq., C.M.G., Assistant Marshal of the Ceremonies, and were presented with their Suites to His Majesty after the Ceremony.

His Majesty's Body Guard of the Hon. Corps of Gentlemen at Arms was on duty in the Choir of the Chapel, the Yeomen of the Guard being on duty in the Nave.

Eighty-one minute guns were fired in the Long Walk at Windsor as the Procession left Windsor Station.

The Knights of the several Orders, who walked in the Procession, wore their respective Collars.

Full Dress, with Trousers, a Band of Crape on the left arm, and Greatcoats were worn.

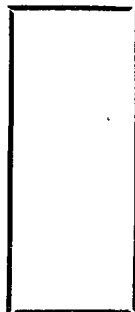

The route was through the Norman Gateway, across the Quadrangle, through George IV. Archway, down the Long Walk, and through the Lodge leading from the Long Walk to the Mausoleum.

The whole of the road from George IV. archway to the gates of the Mausoleum was lined with troops, under the command of Colonel Napier Miles, First Life Guards.

A battery of Royal Horse Artillery fired a salute of 81 guns in the Long Walk.

The Queen's Pipers played from the gates to the Mausoleum.

On arrival, the Queen's Company opened outwards and formed a double rank on the steps of the Mausoleum. The Band of the Grenadier Guards went to a position assigned to them.

The Dean of Windsor and the Choir met the Cortège on the steps of the Mausoleum.

The Highlanders, Pipers, and Servants, on arrival, went straight into the Mausoleum and took up the position allotted to them.

The Coffin was then carried into the Mausoleum, preceded by the Choir and the Clergy.

The Royal Family on entering the Mausoleum took their places on either side of the Sarcophagus, the Royal Households standing in the Transepts on either side.

The Anthem, "Man that is born of a woman," was sung by the Choir.

The sentence of committal to the Grave was read by the Bishop of Winchester.

Earth was cast upon the Coffin by Colonel Lord Edward Pelham Clinton, K.C.B. (Master of the Household to Her late Majesty).

The Prayers were read by the Dean of Windsor.

After the concluding Anthem a Prayer of Thanksgiving and the Benediction were pronounced by the Bishop of Winchester.

Levée Dress and Great Coats were worn, with Ribbons and Stars but no Collar.
