		The companies were then exposed to a most heavy and galling fire from the right and left front. Lieutenant Masterson undertook to give a message to the Imperial Light Horse, who were holding a ridge some hundred yards behind, to fire to the left front and endeavour to check the enemy's fire.
		In taking this message he crossed an open space of a hundred yards which was swept by a most heavy cross fire, and although badly wounded in both thighs, managed to crawl in and deliver his message before falling exhausted into the Imperial Light Horse trench. His unselfish heroism was undoubtedly the means of saving several lives.

Foreign Office, May 31, 1901. PASSPORTS FOR SPAIN.

COMPULSORY REGISTRATION OF FOREIGNERS IN THE PROVINCE OF BARCELONA.

HIS Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from His Majesty's Consul at Barcelona a Despatch stating that the Civil Governor of the Province of Barcelona has issued an Order making compulsory the registration of

all foreigners in that Province.

· Under this Order all British subjects residing in the Province of Barcelona on the 1st of June, 1901, will be required to register themselves at a British Consulate, and to obtain from the Consul a certificate to the effect that they have attended personally before him, and have satisfied him that they are British subjects, which certificate they should then present, in Barcelona, at the office of the Civil Governor, and in other towns and villages at the office of the Mayor, in order that their names, description, occupation, birthplace, domicile, and last place of residence may be duly registered. British subjects arriving hereafter in the Province of Barcelona will be required to carry out these formalities within 24 hours after their arrival. Any contravention of the Order will be punished by a fine of 500 pesetas, and, if thought desirable, by expulsion from the Province.

His Majesty's Consul points out that, in order to ensure compliance with these requirements, British subjects travelling to the Province of Barcelona should be careful to provide themselves in advance with Foreign Office Passports, which they should present, immediately upon arrival, at

the British Consulate.

From May 25th the import and carriage in transit of rags, wearing apparel in use, and unwashed personal linen and bedding from Port

Elizabeth (Cape Colony), is prohibited.

This prohibition applies as well to baggage brought by travellers in so far as their unwashed bed and personal linen is concerned; it does not, however, extend to the import and carriage in transit of goods which may have been forwarded from Port Elizabeth but of which there is sufficient proof that they have some other place of origin, and that they are transported and packed in such a manner that they cannot possibly come into contact with any objects of contagion.

Moreover the prohibition as regards carriage in transit is not to extend to goods packed in such a manner that they can neither be handled nor be

touched en route.
