	75TH COMPANY, IMPERIAL YEOMANRY.			
15481	Trooper J. Middleton	At Reitfontein, near Craddock, Cape Colony, on 28th April, 1901. One of a party ordered to climb a steep kopje. Was first up, and found 25 Boers coming up from opposite side, about 200 yards off. He at once opened fire, and by killing one man and one horse, checked enemy till rest of force arrived. Had they occupied the kopje, considerable loss would have been caused to our men.	..	Promoted corporal by Commander-in-Chief.
