WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Essex) Order, 1901.

Dated 12th November, 1901.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Essex, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Essex) Order, 1901."

BIRDS.

Close Time varied.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited within the county of Essex shall be varied so as to be between the 14th day of March and the 16th day of August in each year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The provisions of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within so much of the County of Essex as is within the Metropolitan Police District to the following Wild Birds in the

same manner as if those Birds were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Swallow, Martins (Hirundo urbica, Hirundo riparia), Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Kestrel, Merlin, Hobby, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Osprey, Magpie, Shrikes (Lanius colluria, Lanius minor, Lanius excubitor).

The Kingfisher protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 15th day of August in any year and the 15th day of March following the killing or taking of the Kingfisher is prohibited throughout the County of Essex.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During the period between the 15th day of August in any year and the 15th day of March following the killing or taking of the following kinds of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Essex:—

Nightingale, Goldfinch, Lark, Nightjar, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Kingfisher, Cuckoo, Barn Owl, Tawny Owl, Long Eared Owl, Short Eared Owl, Kestrel, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Merlin, Hobby, Osprey, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Swallow, Sand Martin, House Martin, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Shrikes, Magpie, Wheatear, Stonechat, Whinchat, Red Start, Fly Catchers, Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Black Cap, Garden Warbler, Wood Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiff Chaff, White Throat, Lesser White Throat, Long Tailed Tit, Nuthatch, Wren, Golden Crested Wren, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Hawfinch, Linnet, Common Bunting, Snow Bunting, Landrail or Corncrake, Coot, Chaffinch, Tree Creeper.

Certain Districts exempted from the operation of the foregoing Clause.

VI. I hereby exempt from the portion of this Order numbered V, the whole County of Essex, except the portion lying within the Metropolitan Police District, and except the parishes of Epping, Epping Upland, Theydon Bois, Theydon Garnon, and Lambourne.

All Birds Protected on Sundays within a certain Area.

VII. During the period between the 15th day of August in any year and the 15th day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited in all such part of the county of Essex outside the Metropolitan Police District as lies to the east of the London and Norwich Main Line of the Great Eastern Railway, and also the following parishes or parts of parishes on the west side of the same line:—Ardleigh, Manningtree, Aldham, West Bergholt, Boxted, Chapel, Wakes Colne, Copford, Dedham, Fordham, Great Horkesley, Little Horkesley, Langham, Mount Bures, Great Tey, Little Tey, Mark's Tey, Wormingford, Mountnessing, Shenfield, Brentwood, South Weald, Noak Hill, Romford, Havering, and Hornchurch, which area is coloured in red and green on a map deposited with the Clerk of the County Council, sealed with the seal of the Secretary of State, and dated the 12th November, 1901.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected in that part of the County within the Metropolitan Police District.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within so much of the County of Essex as is within the Metropolitan Police District:—

Nightingale, Goldfinch, Larks (*Alauda arvensis*, *Alauda arborea*), Nightjar, Woodpeckers (*Gecinus viridis*, *Picus major*, *Picus minor*), Kingfisher, Cuckoo, Owls (*Asio otus*, *Strix flammea*, *Syrnium aluco*), Kestrel, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Merliu, Hobby, Osprey, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Swallow, Martins (*Hirundo urbica*, *Hirundo riparia*), Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Shrikes (*Lanius colluria*, *Lanius minor*, *Lanius excubitor*), Magpie, Wheatear, Stonechat, Whinchat, Redstart, Flycatchers (*Muscicapa grisala*, *Muscicapa atricapilla*), Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Blackcap, Garden Warbler, Wood Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiffchaff, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Long-tailed Tit, Nuthatch, Wren, Golden Crested Wren, Wagtails (*Motacilla viridis*, *Motacilla lugubris*, *Motacilla melanope*, *Motacilla raii*), Hawfinch, Linnet, Buntings (*Emberiza rustica*, *Emberiza melanocephala*, *Emberiza citrinella*), Starling, Landrail or Corncrake, Coot.

All Eggs Protected within a certain Area.

IX. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the following area for a period of five years from the date of this Order.

The whole of the foreshore, including the shingle, sand hills, salt marshes, creeks, and other uninclosed lands extending from high-water mark to the first boundary of enclosed or cultivated lands separating the foreshore from them, between the following points on the coast, viz. :—

From Harwich Lighthouse to Shoeburyness, such parts of the tidal river Blackwater as are above the town of Maldon, such parts of the river Colne as are above Wivenhoe, and such parts of the river Crouch as are above Battles Bridge being excepted from the said area.

Moji Bay—Regulations.

THE following Regulations respecting Moji Bay have been received from the Japanese Government:—

LIMITS.

The outer limit of the harbour, which is divided into three districts, is an imaginary line drawn S. 48° W. from Moji Saki to a position about 4 cables N. 40° W. from Kuwanoki No Hana, and a line drawn from this position about S. 5° W. to Komoriye Village.

The "First District" is approximately inshore of a line drawn N. 45° E. from a staff erected on Shiroki Saki.

The "Second District" is approximately between the outer limit of the First District and a line drawn S. 47° W. from Kajiga Hana.

The "Third District" lies approximately between the outer limit of the Second District and the outer limit of the harbour.

Two white staffs with diamond-shaped top-marks have been erected (a) on Kajiga Hana, (b) at eastern entrance to Moji Camber, (c) at Shiroki Saki, (d) at Komoriye, and (e) at Deshimachi, each pair in line showing the boundary of a district.

ANCHORAGE.

The First District is for anchorage of vessels under 800 tons.

The Second District is allotted for anchorages to steam vessels of over 800 tons.

The Third District is allotted for anchorages of war vessels, and also for sailing ships of over 800 tons.

Torpedo vessels which desire to anchor in the First or Second Districts must obtain special permission to do so from the Harbour Master.

No vessel is allowed to anchor within three-quarters of a cable of the red buoy marking the north-eastern end of Moji Shoal, or within 2 cables of the black and white buoy marking the south-west end of the same shoal.

Vessels about to leave the harbour when another vessel is entering must not do so until the incoming vessel has anchored.

APPROACHING THE HARBOUR.

Vessels bound for the harbour must hoist their colours and make their number, if from the westward to Mutsure (Rokuren) Lighthouse, if from the eastward to He Saki Lighthouse, when they will receive in reply information as to their berth, both these lighthouses being connected by telephone with the Harbour Master's Office. In bad weather the anchorage to be taken up will be made by signal from the lighthouse flagstaff as follows:—

Flag H.—Take up a convenient clear berth in First District.

Flag J.—Take up any clear berth in Second District.

Flag K.—Take up any clear berth in Second District eastward of a line running due south from Moji Shoal, north-east buoy (red).

Flag L.—Take up any clear berth in Second District eastward of a line running due south from Moji Shoal, south-west buoy (black and white horizontal stripes).

Flag N.—Take up any convenient berth off Kuzuha, outside the harbour limit, clear of telegraph cables.

Flag P.—Take up a clear berth in the Second or Third Districts.

Flag R.—Take up a clear berth in Second District, eastward of a line running N.N.W. from Shiroki Saki.

Flag T.—Take up a clear berth in Third District.

Magnetic Variation and Currents.

AS several wrecks have taken place in recent years on the south-east coast of Newfoundland, and some navigators appear to consider that the variation of the compass near Newfoundland may be sufficiently in error to cause such mishaps, it seems desirable to state that the variation in this locality is sufficiently accurately determined for the purposes of safe navigation, and also to call the attention of Mariners to the statements respecting the currents on the east coast of Newfoundland given in the Admiralty sailing directions.

In the Newfoundland and Labrador Pilot, 1897, it is stated on page 18 that the currents and tides generally around Newfoundland are subject to anomalies of which the causes are unknown; "on the east coast, for example, where the current goes generally to the southward, it sometimes happens that for a day or two the direction is reversed, and the current runs to the northward even against the wind."

Again, on page 19 it is stated that over the banks southward of Newfoundland, during south or S.W. breezes, there is a strong set to the northward, which is still stronger during and after a N.E. wind.

From observations made in vessels when repairing the submarine cables, and also from observations recently made by Staff-Captain Tooker, R.N., employed surveying on the Newfoundland coasts, it appears that on the eastern edge of the bank of Newfoundland, and from thence westward to the shore, the currents are very variable. The ordinary set of the current over the Great Bank is to the south-westward, but north-easterly currents are by no means rare.

Mariners approaching Newfoundland in thick weather should therefore on no account neglect to use the lead and proceed with caution, as it is impossible to foretell with certainty how the current may have been setting.

No. 839.—BORNEO—EAST COAST.

Balik Papan Bay—Alteration in Buoyage.
