

## FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under sections 107 and 108 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, applying the provisions of section 107 (lists of outworkers), and section 108 (employment in unwholesome premises), to the making of iron and steel cables and chains, iron and steel anchors and grapnels, cart gear, and locks, latches, and keys.

The Secretary of State for India in Council has appointed Mr. John Ramsey as Assistant Lascar Transfer Officer, to superintend the transfer of Lascars, or other persons, at Sunderland, and to grant the certificate required under section 125 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 and 58 Vic., cap. 60), with effect from the 2nd June, 1902.

The fee to be paid for every lascar, or other person, in respect of whom such certificate is applied for is limited to three shillings, and in no case is the total amount of fees in respect of one crew to exceed five pounds.

## SUFFOLK AUDIT DISTRICT.

Guiltecross Rural District.

And to all others whom it may concern.

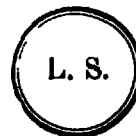
Whereas by section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 31st day of January, 1902, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of Mark William Dixon as a District Auditor, and assigned to him the duties therein mentioned and the District in which he should act as Auditor, and which in the said Order was termed "The Suffolk Audit District";

And whereas the Rural District Council of Guiltecross is an authority whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and it is desirable that the duty of auditing the Accounts of such Rural District Council and of their Officers be assigned to the said Mark William Dixon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise Prescribe, be the duty of the said Mark William Dixon to audit the Accounts of the said Rural District Council, and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article II of the above-cited Order; and that for the purpose of such Audit the area within which the powers, authorities, and jurisdiction of the said Rural District Council may be exercised shall be deemed to be within the said Suffolk Audit District.
