WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1895, it was amongst other things enacted that where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order. and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient;

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the third day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and his Majesty the Emperor of Austria and King of Hungary for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, in the case of which Treaty "The Extradition Act, 1870," was applied by Order in Council of the seventeenth March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four;

And whereas a Declaration was concluded on the twenty-sixth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one, between His Majesty and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Hungary, amending Article XI of the said Treaty of the third of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Declaration is in the terms following:—

As it is considered necessary by the Government of Great Britain and Ireland and by the Governments of Austria and Hungary to extend the period of fourteen days fixed in Article

XI of the Treaty for the mutual surrender of criminals, concluded on the 3rd December, 1873, between Her late Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, &c., on one side, and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Bohemia, &c., and Apostolic King of Hungary, on the other, the respective Plenipotentiaries, undersigned, have agreed that—

The last paragraph of Article XI of the said Treaty of Extradition shall be altered as follows:—

“Provided, however, that he shall be discharged if, within the shortest time possible, and at the utmost within one month, a requisition for his surrender in accordance with the terms of Article IX of this Treaty be not made by the Diplomatic Representative of the State which requests his extradition.”

The present Declaration shall have the same force and duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 3rd December, 1873, to which it relates.

The present Declaration shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged as soon as possible at London.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

“Vorausgesetzt wird übrigens, dass in der kürzesten Frist und zwar längstens binnen einem Monate bei sonstiger Entlassung des Verhafteten, durch den diplomatischen Vertreter des um die Auslieferung ersuchenden Staates eine Requisition wegen der Auslieferung in der dem Artikel IX dieses Vertrages entsprechenden Weise erhoben wird.”

Die gegenwärtige Erklärung wird dieselbe Kraft and Dauer haben, wie der Auslieferungsvertrag vom 3. December 1873, auf welchen sie sich bezieht.

Die gegenwärtige Erklärung wird ratificirt werden und werden die Ratificationen sobald als möglich in London ausgetauscht werden.

A jelen nyilatkozat meg fog erősítettetni, s a megerősítési okiratok, mihelyt lehet Londonban ki fognak cseréltetni.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the sixth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and two, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Austria and Hungary under and in accordance with the said Treaty as amended by the said Declaration above set forth.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and entitled “An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals,” shall continue in force there, and no longer.

"Le Journal officiel publie la communication suivante de la commission instituée d'ordre suprême pour combattre la peste.

Six cas suspects d'être dus à la peste se sont encore produits à Odessa les 29, 30 et 31 août dernier. Depuis le 28 mai il y a eu en tout 24 cas, dont 6 suivis de décès; un de ces cas s'est produit en mai, un en juin, six en juillet et seize en août.

Par mesure de prudence spéciale, les dispositions suivantes ont été prises, en dehors de celles mentionnées dans les publications insérées dans les NoNo 147, 157, 169, 178 et 185 du Messenger officiel :

1° Des commissions sanitaires exécutives ont été instituées dans les districts limitrophes du littoral de la mer Noire, dans les divers arrondissements des provinces de Kherson, de Bessarabie, de Tauride et de Catherinoslav, du territoire du Don, à Sévastopol, à Kertch-Yénikalé et à Nicolaïew, ainsi que sur le chemin de fer entre Odessa et Razdelnaïa.

2° Le service de surveillance médicale dans les centres habités de la province de Kherson a été renforcé.

3° On a institué un service sévère de surveillance médicale sur les navires partant d'Odessa à destination des divers ports russes.

4° Il a été enjoint de placer un médecin à bord de chacun des vapeurs faisant le service des passagers entre Odessa et l'intérieur.

5° Toutes les provenances d'Odessa sont soumises à une visite médicale dans les autres ports."

Bye-laws as to Tramways.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Cardiff, acting by the Council as the promoters of the Tramways in the county borough of Cardiff, intend after the expiration of two weeks from the date of the first publication of this notice in the local newspapers and after publication in the London Gazette to apply to the Board of Trade for confirmation of the following Bye-laws as to Tramways duly made by the said Council on the 9th day of September, 1902:—

BYE-LAWS made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Cardiff, acting by the Council, as the Promoters of the Tramways in the county borough of Cardiff, under the Tramways Act, 1870.

Interpretation of Terms.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the following words shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

“Corporation” means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Cardiff, and shall include any Lessees or other persons for the time being working the Tramway System hereinafter referred to;

“Tramways” means the Tramway System now or at any time hereafter worked by the Corporation;

“Car” means any carriage or car run by the Corporation upon the Tramways for the conveyance of passengers.

“Conductor” means any servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car.

“Driver” means any servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a Car.

“Officer” means any member of the Police Force or any Inspector of Public Carriages or Tramway Inspector in the employ of the Corporation.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

2. No person shall swear or use obscene, indecent or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or tramway station, or premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

Objectionable Persons.

3. Any person who is in a state of intoxication, and who from that cause is in the opinion of the conductor unfit to be a passenger on a car shall not be allowed to board or enter upon any car, and if any such person be found in or upon any car he or she shall be requested by the conductor to leave the car, failing which it shall be lawful for the conductor or an officer of the Corporation to remove such person from the car.

Dogs.

4. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any car. Any dog or other animal taken

into or found on any car shall be removed by the person in charge thereof from the tramway car immediately upon request by the conductor.

Damaging Cars.

5. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these By-laws, for the amount of any damage so done.

Smoking.

6. No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars, or cigarettes, inside any car, except in a compartment which may be specially set apart for the purpose. No person shall smoke tobacco or other weed in or upon the footboard or other access or entrance to any car.

Spitting.

7. No person shall spit in or on any car.

Payment of Fares.

8. Every passenger shall, before leaving the car, pay to the conductor the fare legally payable for his or her journey, and obtain a ticket therefor, and no ticket shall be used a second time for travelling on any car. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his or her journey. A child under three years of age, who is sitting on the lap of a passenger, shall not be liable to pay a fare, but all children above three years of age shall pay full fare.

No person shall travel, or attempt to travel, on a car without paying his fare, and with intent to avoid payment thereof.

Tickets.

9. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his or her ticket to any officer of the Corporation duly authorized in that behalf, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his or her ticket or pay the fare for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

10. A passenger, not being an artizan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation, shall not use, or attempt to use, any ticket intended only for such artizans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

Interference with the Duties of the Conductor or Driver.

11. No person other than the conductor or driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car or its equipment.

Luggage.

12. No luggage or parcels of any description, unaccompanied by a passenger, shall be conveyed upon any car by any driver or conductor.

No person shall carry or deposit upon any car any luggage which shall cause hindrance or annoyance to passengers.

Entering Full Cars.

13. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to carry, no additional person shall enter, board, or remain in or upon any such car. The conductor shall not

permit any person beyond the licensed number of passengers to enter, board or remain in or upon any part of a car. Such person shall leave the car upon the request of the conductor, and in case of refusal may be removed from the car.

Disabled Cars.

14. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or injured car.

The Corporation shall not be bound to complete any journey in any specific period of time.

Cars proceeding to Sheds.

15. No person shall travel upon a car which is proceeding to a shed and is not on its usual route, unless permitted so to do by the conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable on such route.

Travelling on Step, &c.

16. No person, except a driver, conductor, or officer of the Corporation, shall travel or ride on the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car, or stand either on the platforms or on the outside or in the interior of any car.

No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or board a car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a car.

Firearms.

17. No person shall travel in or on any car with firearms, or dangerous articles or things, provided that nothing contained in this Bye-law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military, Reserve, or Auxiliary Forces carrying unloaded firearms.

Entering and Leaving Cars.

18. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor or officer.

No person shall board a car before any person desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

Entering a Car when in motion.

19. No person shall enter, board or leave, or attempt to enter, board or leave any car whilst in motion.

Use of Signal Bells.

20. No person shall ring, or cause to be rung, any of the signal bells upon any car, so as to effect the unnecessary stoppage of any car nor signal a car to start.

Persons suffering from Disease not to travel on Cars.

21. No person afflicted with any infectious or contagious disease shall board, enter, or travel on any car, or attempt so to do. And no driver or conductor shall wilfully or knowingly suffer or permit any such person so to do.

"Infectious or contagious disease" means any of the following diseases: Small-pox, Cholera, Diphtheria, Membranous Croup, Erysipelas, the disease known as Scarlatina or Scarlet Fever; and the fevers known by any of the following names: Typhus, Typhoid, Enteric, Relapsing, Continued or Puerperal.

Power to remove Passengers committing offence.

22. Any person who shall commit, whilst on any car, any legal offence or any breach of these Bye-laws, shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from a car, and if such person shall have paid his or her fare, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his or her fare so paid.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws.

23. Every conductor and driver shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof; and

if any such conductor or driver fails to enforce the same as aforesaid, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

Penalty.

24. Any person offending against, or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

25. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use, a printed copy of these Bye-laws.

These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of January, 1903.

The foregoing Bye-laws were made at a Meeting of the Council held on the 9th day of September, 1902.
