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### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 3RD MARCH 1903.)

KING'S LYNN (SWINE-FEVER) OKDER OF 1903.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 18 16, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Provisions of Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 applied to the Borough of King's Lynn.

1.—(1.) The provisions of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 shall apply to the borough of King's Lynn, but no swine, fat or store, shall be moved out of the said borough, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

(2.) Nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine where they are moved through that borough by railway from a place outside that borough to another place outside that borough without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within that borough.

(3.) Swine may be moved with a Licence of an Inspector of the Board or of a person authorized by the Board to grant the same, which Licence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the movement necessary or expedient.

#### Exclusion of Borough of King's Lynn from Scheduled Order.

2. From and after the commencement of this Order, the borough of King's Lynn shall cease to form part of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by the Order described in the Schedule hereto: Provided that such withdrawal shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under such Order and the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

#### Offences.

3. If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and three.

#### Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the KING'S LYNN. (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1903.

## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 2ND MARCH 1903.)

#### EOVIL AND DISTRI FEVER) PROHIBITION (SWINE-YEOVIL DISTRICT $\mathbf{OF}$ MOVE · MENT ORDER OF 1903.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

#### Movement of swine into out of or within Scheduled District.

1. No swine shall be moved into or out of the district described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District ; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Au.h.rity.

#### Offences.

3.--(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the YEOVIL AND DISTRICT (SWINE - FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1903.
