PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Sugar Convention Act, 1903, after reciting that by Article VII of the Convention, signed on the fifth day of March, nineteen hundred and two, in relation to sugar, provision was made for the establishment of a Permanent Commission (in the Act referred to as the Permanent Commission) charged with watching the execution of the provisions of the Convention, it is enacted that where it is reported by the Permanent Commission that any direct or indirect bounty is granted in any foreign country on the production or export of sugars His Majesty may, by Order in Council, make a prohibition Order, that is to say, an Order prohibiting sugar, from that foreign country to be imported or brought into the United Kingdom, subject to any provision which might be made by Parliament in lieu of such prohibition to impose a special duty on such sugar in accordance with the Convention; and that while a prohibition Order is in force the laws relating to the Customs shall apply as if the sugar in respect of which the Order is made were specified, with exception as to transit, in the table of prohibitions and restrictions inwards contained in section forty-two of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876. And it was also enacted that His Majesty might, similarly, make such regulations as should appear to Him necessary in relation to any such Order, and in particular require the origin of all sugar imported or brought into the United Kingdom, whether in transit or otherwise, to be proved by such certificate or other evidence as might be provided in the Order; but no Order made was to apply to molasses.

And whereas it appears from the findings of the Permanent Commission, as contained in Command Paper 1632, presented to Parliament, that the said Permanent Commission has reported that a bounty on the exportation of Sugars is

granted in Denmark, Russia, and the Argentine Republic.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Him by the said first recited Act, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered:—

That, from and after the first day of September next, and subject to any such provision by Parliament as hereinbefore treated, all sugar from Denmark, Russia, and the Argentine Republic (not including molasses and sugar-sweetened products) shall (except in transit) be prohibited to be imported or brought into the United Kingdom; and that in relation to this Order the regulations in the Schedule hereto annexed are to be deemed as made and prescribed.

SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Order refers.

REGULATION I.

All sugar (other than molasses and sugar-sweetened products) imported or brought into the United Kingdom from any place outside the same, shall be accompanied by such evidence of origin as hereinafter required; and all such sugar imported or brought into the United Kingdom not accompanied by such evidence shall be deemed to be so imported or brought in contrary to a restriction contained in section forty-two of the Customs Consolidation Act 1876, and subject as hereinafter provided, shall be dealt with accordingly, as if the same were goods enumerated and described in the table to the said section.

REGULATION II.

The evidence of origin required shall be in accordance with that laid down by the Permanent Commission in certain Articles agreed to by them for due observance of the Convention, so far as the same are applicable to the United Kingdom; that is to say:—

All sugar (other than molasses and sugar-sweetened products) shall be accompanied by a certificate of origin indicating (A) the kind and quantity of the sugar, (B) the kind, number, and marks of the packages, (C) the country of production, of origin, or of manufacture, and the country of destination of the goods, and (D) the mode of carriage by land or water.

REGULATION III.

The certificate must be signed, and issued, by the fiscal authority having jurisdiction in the country of production, of despatch, or of transformation, such fiscal authority being duly empowered for that purpose by the Government of the State.

REGULATION IV.

When the country of origin of any sugar the subject of a certificate is a State not party to the Convention, the certificate must, in addition to the particulars required above, state that the goods are derived from a factory which does not work sugar coming from either Russia, Denmark, or the Argentine Republic; and any such certificate must, as a guarantee of due signature and issue, be viséd by the proper British Consul or Vice-Consul.

REGULATION V.

No certificate is to be deemed valid after the expiry of twelve calendar months from the date of its issue, or such less time (if any) as may be mentioned in the certificate by the fiscal authority issuing the same.

REGULATION VI.

Inasmuch as it is possible that sugar may occasionally reach the United Kingdom before the arrival of the certificates of origin relating to

the same, and it would be inconvenient and expensive to importers if such sugar were not delivered from Customs charge until the arrival of the certificates, it shall be competent for the Commissioners of Customs to authorize the delivery of such sugar, on the security of a deposit of such amount or of a bond in such penalty as they may think fit, for the due production of the necessary certificate within a prescribed period, provided that they see no reason for suspecting that the sugar emanates from a prohibited country.

WHEREAS by the Sugar Convention Act, 1903, it is in pursuance of a provision to that effect in the Convention enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, declare that every sugar factory and sugar refinery and factory for the extraction of sugar from molasses in the United Kingdom shall be subject to the supervision either of the Commissioners of Customs or of the Commissioners of Inland Revenue.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the said power, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered:

That, from and after the first day of September next, inclusive, every sugar factory and sugar refinery and factory for the extraction of sugar from molasses in the United Kingdom shall be under the supervision either of the Commissioners of Customs or of the Commissioners of Inland Revenue.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section twenty-six of "The Pluralities Act 1838" after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Arch-

"bishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend Francis, Lord Bishop of Oxford, hath pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, represented to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, Francis, by Divine permission Bishop of Oxford, do in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section, of the Pluralities Act 1838, hereby represent to your Grace as follows:

"1. There is in the county of Berks and my diocese of Oxford the vicarage of Wantage the parish whereof contains a population of four thousand. The net annual value of the said benefice is three hundred and fifty-seven pounds or thereabouts.

"2. There is also in the said county and diocese the rectory of East Lockinge the parish whereof contains a population of three hundred and ten. The net annual value of this benefice is three hundred and sixteen pounds or thereabouts.

"3. A certain portion or district of the said parish of Wantage comprising the civil parish of West Lockinge the boundaries of which are well known and defined lies at a distance of about two and a quarter miles from the parish church of Wantage and about three-quarters of a mile from the parish church of East Lockinge and has a population of sixty.

"4. It appears to me that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act the said district or civil parish of West Lockinge may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Wantage and be united to the said parish of East Lockinge to which it may be more conveniently annexed.

"5. The benefice of Wantage with West Lockinge is in the patronage of the Dean and Canons of Windsor. The benefice of East Lockinge is in the patronage of Lady Wantage.

"6. The Reverend and Honourable Maurice John George Ponsouby is the present Incumbent of the benefice of Wantage and the Reverend J. G. Cornish is the present Incumbent of the benefice of East Lockinge.

"7. Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the first mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing annexed to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do hereby submit the

same to your Grace together with the consents thereto in writing of the said patrons and Incumbents. To the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such scheme you may certify the same and such consents by your report to His Majesty in Council.

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the consents referred to in the said representation are as follows:—

"The SCHEME.

"That the district and civil parish of West Lockinge shall be separated from the said parish of Wantage and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of East Lockinge. That the Incumbent of the benefice of East Lockinge shall have the sole and exclusive cure of souls within the said district so annexed to East Lockinge.

"That the parishioners of such district shall be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of East Lockinge but shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Wantage except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said parish church of Wantage and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be solemnized and performed in the parish church of East Lockinge for the inhabitants of the said district and all fees dues ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said district shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the benefice of East Lockinge.

"That a modus of three pounds eight shillings and fourpence arising from West Lockinge shall be transferred to the rectory of East Lockinge but that no other alteration shall be made in the emoluments of the said benefices of Wantage and East Lockinge.

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said benefices or either of them.

"The Very Reverend Philip Frank Eliot, D.D., Dean of the King's Free Chapel of Saint George within His Castle of Windsor and the Canons of the same Chapel the patrons or persons entitled to present to the benefice of Wantage in the county of Berks and diocese of Oxford in case the same were now vacant the Reverend and Honourable Maurice John George Ponsouby the Incumbent of the same benefice Lady Wantage of Lockinge House Wantage, the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice of East Lockinge in the county of Berks and diocese of Oxford in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend James George Cornish the Incumbent of the same benefice hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several consents to the scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

And whereas the said scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration:

And whereas the said Archbishop being satisfied with the said scheme hath certified the

same and the consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his report dated the eighteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and three, which said report is in the words and figures following:—

“We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council,

“That the Right Reverend Francis Bishop of Oxford has represented unto us (amongst other things)—

“That there are in the county of Berks and his diocese of Oxford the benefice (being a vicarage) of Wantage, and the benefice (being a rectory) of East Lockinge.

“That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that a certain portion or district of the said parish of Wantage comprising the civil parish of West Lockinge the boundaries whereof are well known and defined may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Wantage and annexed to the parish of East Lockinge for ecclesiastical purposes only under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838.

“That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the Very Reverend Philip Frank Eliot D.D. Dean of the King's Free Chapel of Saint George within His Castle of Windsor and the Canons of the same Chapel the patrons or persons entitled to present to the said benefice of Wantage in case the same were now vacant the Reverend and Honourable Maurice John George Pousouby the Incumbent of the same benefice, Lady Wantage of Lockinge House Wantage the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of East Lockinge in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend James George Cornish the Incumbent of the same benefice has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

“The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents above referred to are hereunto annexed.

“And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act 1838 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section sixteen of “The Pluralities Act, 1838,” as amended by “The Pluralities Act, 1850,” it is, amongst other things, enacted, “That whenever it shall appear

“to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause with respect to his own diocese a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands to the said Archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only.”

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the eighteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and three, in the words following, that is to say:—

“We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of All England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:

“That the Right Reverend Richard Lord Bishop of Llandaff as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the rectory of Tintern Parva and the perpetual curacy of Chapel Hill both in the county of Monmouth having represented unto us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed one thousand five hundred persons may with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice we enquired into the circumstances of the case.

“That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and is not of inconvenient extent and that The Right Honourable Hardinge Earl of Halsbury Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain being in right of the Crown the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the rectory of Tintern Parva and also to the perpetual curacy of Chapel Hill in case the same were vacant consents to the proposed union.

“That six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry and consent to Your Majesty in

Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Llandaff, our enquiry into the circumstances of the case, the statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consent in writing of the said patron and the copies of the representation and notices before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church called Christ Church, Fulham, situate within the new parish (some time consolidated chapelry) of Saint James, Moore Park, Fulham, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint James, Moore Park, Fulham, and of the new parish (some time district chapelry) of Saint Matthew, Fulham, in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes,

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint James, Moore Park, Fulham, and of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Fulham, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Christ Church, Fulham, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, as such Bishop and also as the patron (in right of his See) of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint James, Moore Park, Fulham, and with the consents of the Very Reverend William Hagger Barlow, Doctor in Divinity, Dean of the Cathedral Church of Peterborough, the Reverend Henry Elliott Fox, Clerk in Holy Orders, a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, the Reverend Sir John Robert Laurie Emilius Laurie, Baronet, Clerk in Holy Orders, Francis Augustus Bevan, of Number 54, Lombard-street, in the city of London, Banker, and John Francis William Deacon, of Number 20, Birchin-lane, in the said city, Banker, as the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Fulham (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint James, Moore Park, Fulham and of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Fulham, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church called Christ Church Fulham situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Christ Church, Fulham.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Christ Church, Fulham, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the new parish (some time consolidated chapelry) of Saint James, Moore Park, Fulham in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London which is bounded upon part of the north-west and upon the south-west by the new parish of Saint Dionis, Parsons Green, Fulham, upon the south-east by the new parish (some time district chapelry) of Saint Matthew Fulham both in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the north-east and upon the remaining part of the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Fulham, from the said new parish of Saint James, Moore Park, Fulham, at a point in the middle of Imperial-road opposite to the middle of the lane or footpath, called Gas Factory-lane leading from Bagley's-lane to Imperial-road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Imperial-road for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as Harwood-terrace and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Harwood-terrace for a distance of two chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to its junction with Bagley's-lane,



and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Bagley's-lane for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with New King's-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of New King's-road for a distance of ten chains and a quarter or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint James, Moore Park, Fulham from the said new parish of Saint Dionis, Parsons Green, Fulham.

"II. And also all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Fulham which is bounded upon the north-east upon the north-west and upon the west by the said new parish of Saint James, Moore Park, Fulham and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the south-west and upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint James, Moore Park, Fulham from the said new parish of Saint Matthew Fulham at a point in the middle of Wandsworth Bridge-road near its junction with Hazlebury-road and opposite to the middle of Post Office-passage and extending thence north-eastward to and along the middle of Post Office-passage for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where it meets Broughton-road and extending thence first north-eastward to and then south-eastward along the middle of Broughton-road for a distance of eighteen chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with Stephendale-road and extending thence first north-eastward and then north-westward along the middle of Stephendale-road for a distance of twelve chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to its junction with Elswick-street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Elswick-street for a distance of five chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Bagley's-lane and extending thence north-eastward in the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Imperial-road upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Matthew Fulham from the said new parish of Saint James Moore Park, Fulham."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

(b.) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave:

(c.) In the said churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein.

**HATLEY SAINT GEORGE.**—Forthwith and entirely in the southern part of the Parish Churchyard of Saint George, Hatley, in the county of Cambridge, such part containing an area of thirty-three square poles or thereabouts.

**OCKLEY.**—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Margaret, Ockley, in the county of Surrey, and in so much of the churchyard as is not reserved for the

exclusive interment of members of the Calvert family, except as follows:—

(a.) In the vaults now existing in the said churchyard and belonging to James Woodgate Arbuthnot and Henry Charles Lee Steere, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vaults be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In the earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard in which the body of John Sheldrake is buried, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of his family:

(c.) In the said portion of the churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place with the exclusive right of burial therein.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representations, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the twenty-eighth day of September next:

#### REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION 2 OF THE SUGAR CONVENTION ACT, 1903, AND CONSEQUENT ORDER IN COUNCIL.

The Commissioners of Customs and the Commissioners of Inland Revenue, in pursuance of the power vested in them by section 2 of the "Sugar Convention Act, 1903," and consequent Order in Council, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

(1.) From the first day of September next inclusive no premises shall be used for making or extracting crystallized sugar from beet, cane, molasses, &c., or for refining such sugar, unless the same premises be placed in bond, and kept under the permanent supervision of Revenue Officers both by day and night.

(2.) The premises will be divided into two sections, viz., the Refinery or factory, in which the raw materials are to be kept and operated on, and the Refinery Warehouse, where the finished articles and by-products are to be stored.

(3.) Before any premises can be used as a Refinery or Refinery Warehouse they must be approved by either the Board of Customs or the Board of Inland Revenue.

(4.) In the application for approval of the premises the trader must state generally the nature of the operations to be carried on therein. The Surveyor or Supervisor should report whether the premises are suitable for the purposes intended, and sufficiently large to justify the granting of a bond; he should also state the estimated amount of duty that will be paid; the quantity of goods likely to be received and delivered annually, and what additional expense to the Crown would be entailed by the approval of the premises.

Suitable plans should accompany the application.

(5.) The premises approved hereunder will be subject to the regulations of the Warehousing Code as to the amount of the penalty of the bond; the supervision by Officers; the providing of suitable office accommodation; the receipt and delivery of the goods, and in all other respects so far as the same regulations are applicable.

(6.) The following "check registers" will be kept by the Revenue Officers stationed on the premises:—

1. Raw Sugar Register.
2. Refinery Register.
3. Warehouse Register.

On receipt of the raw sugar into the Refinery full particulars will be recorded on the debit side of the Raw Sugar Register, and on the credit side will be recorded, from entries or notices to be furnished by the trader, all quantities taken for the purpose of being refined. The exact stock of raw sugar will thus always be readily ascertainable.

The Refinery Register will contain full particulars of all the sugar taken from the stock of raw sugar for refining, and of all the refined sugar, pieces, and by-products produced therefrom. The particulars of the raw sugar will be obtained from the entries or notices above provided for, and the quantities of the refined sugar, pieces, &c., from the warehousing entries.

(7.) At the end of each year, or more frequently if deemed desirable, an account of the stock will be made up in the Refinery Register showing the receipts of raw sugar and the deliveries into Refinery Warehouse of the finished products, as well as the stock in hand in the Refinery, with any gain or loss; and the Surveyor or Supervisor will certify thereon whether he is satisfied that the gain or loss has not been caused by improper means.

A copy of this account with a duplicate will be sent, in the Customs, to the Surveyors-General, and, in the Excise, to the Chief Inspector, who will bring under the notice of their respective Boards any instances of excessive loss, in order that, in the absence of satisfactory explanation, the duty may be charged thereon.

When the account is finally approved it will be sent, in the Customs, to the Statistical Office, and, in the Excise, to the Accountant-General, Somerset House.

(8.) The finished sugar and the by-products are to be placed in the Refinery Warehouse as soon as practicable after they are packed and weighed, and they are to be brought to account by means of an ordinary warehousing entry or notice to be lodged by the refiner. The quantities and rateable values of the sugar and the by-products will be fixed at the time the goods are received into the Refinery Warehouse, and, as a rule, the goods will not be subject to re-weight or re-test prior to delivery. On the receipt of the goods into the Refinery Warehouse they will be entered in the Warehouse register, and, as deliveries take place on payment of duty, or for removal to another warehouse, or for exportation, or for use at a distillery, such deliveries will be recorded in the usual manner, and the regulations of the Code as to warehoused goods will obtain generally, except that goods cleared from a Refinery Warehouse for home consumption will not be liable to warehousing charges.

(9.) Stock books must be kept by the refiners in a form to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs or Commissioners of Inland Revenue. Such stock books must be open to the check and

inspection of the Revenue Officers whenever required.

(10.) Free samples not exceeding 56 lbs. for every 100 tons of the finished product may be taken from the goods prior to their delivery from the Refinery. Requests for such samples must be presented by the trader, and a record of the quantities taken will be kept in a memorandum book to be provided for the purpose.

(11.) Sugar which may have been damaged after deposit in a Refinery Warehouse, or after its delivery on payment of duty, may be received into a refinery, to be again refined, and its equivalent in refined sugar based on the actual weight and polarisation of the damaged sugar may be delivered without payment of duty.

(12.) If any person shall claim drawback on any sugar upon which duty has not been paid, or shall do any act in contravention of or shall fail to comply with any of the foregoing Regulations, he shall be liable to a penalty of fifty pounds, and the goods in respect of which the offence has been committed shall be forfeited; and such penalty and forfeiture shall be deemed to be a penalty and forfeiture incurred under and imposed by the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876.

1. Ships arriving from Valparaiso shall proceed directly to Ilha Grande, where they will undergo the necessary sanitary treatment at the quarantine station.

2. Vessels from Valparaiso which have not undergone quarantine at Ilha Grande may embark passengers and goods in quarantine at the ports of Rio de Janeiro, Bahia, Pernambuco, and Belem (Pará).

3. The goods mentioned in Article 30 of the regulations of the Directory General of Public Health will not be admitted, nor will the entry be allowed of onions, potatoes, sprouts, straw, cereals, and forage.

4. These measures shall be applied to vessels from the above port and from the 16th of June last.
