The KING has been pleased by Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual (to the following effect) to amend and consolidate the Royal Warrants relating to the Albert Medal:—

#### EDWARD, R. & I.

EDWARD THE SEVENTH, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, being desirous of distinguishing by some mark of Her Royal Favour the many heroic acts performed by Mariners and others who endanger their own lives in saving or endeavouring to save the lives of others from shipwrecks and other perils of the sea; and the many heroic acts performed on land by those who endanger their own lives in saving or endeavouring to save the lives of others from accidents in mines, on railways, and at fires, or other peril within Her Dominions, other than perils of the sea, did, by Warrants under the Royal Sign Manual bearing date respectively the 7th March, 1866, the 12th April, 1867, and the 30th April, 1877, institute and create for Herself, Her Heirs, and Successors, as a mark of Royal Approbation of such heroic acts, new Decorations styled respectively "The Albert Medal of the First Class" and "The Albert Medal of the Second Class," inscribed "For Gallantry in Saving Life at Sea," and Decorations similarly styled but inscribed "For Gallantry in Saving Life on Land," which Decorations Her Majesty was desirous should be highly prized and eagerly sought after:

And whereas since the institution of these Decorations under the Warrants above mentioned, amending Warrants bearing date respectively the 13th September, 1881, the 12th March, 1891, and the 24th March, 1904, have been given under the Sign Manual, and it is Our Pleasure still further to amend the Rules governing the award of the Decorations by abolishing the ordinance that the Medal for saving life on land shall only be awarded for acts of gallantry performed within Our Dominions:

And whereas it seems to Us expedient to consolidate the Royal Warrants relating to the said Decorations, We are graciously pleased to make, ordain, and establish the following Rules and Ordinances for the government of the Decorations, which Rules and Ordinances shall from henceforth be inviolably observed and kept:

I. It is ordained that the Decorations "For Gallantry in Saving Life at Sea" shall be styled "The Albert Medal of the First Class" and "The Albert Medal of the Second Class."

II. It is ordained that "The Albert Medal of the First Class," when conferred for gallantry in saving life at sea, shall consist of a gold ovalshaped Badge or Decoration, enamelled in dark blue, with a Monogram composed of the letters V. and A., interlaced with an Anchor erect in gold, surrounded by a Garter in bronze, inscribed in raised letters of gold, "For Gallantry in Saving Life at Sea," and surmounted by a representation of the Crown of His Royal Highness the lamented Prince Consort, and suspended from a dark blue riband of an inch and three-eighths in width, with four white longitudinal stripes.

III. It is ordained that "The Albert Medal of the Second Class," when conferred for gallantry in saving life at sea, shall consist of the like shaped enamelled Badge, save and except in this class it

shall be entirely worked in bronze, instead of gold and bronze, and shall be suspended from a dark blue riband of an inch and three-eighths of an inch in width, with two white longitudinal stripes.

IV. It is ordained that the Medals shall only be awarded to those of Our faithful subjects and others who, in saving or endeavouring to save the lives of others from shipwreck or other perils of the sea, have endangered their own lives, and that such award shall be made only on a recommendation to Us by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department:

Provided always that the preliminary steps and inquiry concerning the award of either Albert Medal inscribed "For Gallantry in saving Life at Sea" shall, if the award be to any one belonging to the Royal Navy or the Royal Marines, be with the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and in other cases with the President of the Board of Trade.

V. It is ordained that the names of those persons upon whom We may be pleased to confer either of the Albert Medals inscribed "For Gallantry in Saving Life at Sea," shall be published in the London Gazette, and that a Register of the names of such of these persons as belong to the Royal Navy or the Royal Marines, shall be kept in the Office of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and a Register of the names of the persons not belonging to the Royal Navy or the Royal Marines upon whom We may be pleased to confer either Medal inscribed as aforesaid, shall be kept in the Office of the Board of Trade.

VI. It is ordained that the Decoration for gallantry in saving lives endangered otherwise than by perils of the sea, shall be styled "The Albert Medal of the First Class" and "The Albert Medal of the Second Class," and shall be inscribed "For Gallantry in Saving Life on Land."

VII. It is ordained that "The Albert Medal of the First Class," when conferred for gallantry in saving life on land, shall consist of a gold oval-shaped Badge or Decoration, enamelled in crimson, with a Monogram composed of the letters V. and A., erect in gold, surrounded by a Garter in bronze, inscribed in raised letters of gold, "For Gallantry in Saving Life on Land," and surmounted by a representation of the Crown of His Royal Highness the lamented Prince Consort, and suspended from a crimson riband of an inch and three-eighths in width, with four white longitudinal stripes.

VIII. It is ordained that "The Albert Medal of the Second Class," when conferred for gallantry in saving life on land, shall consist of the like shaped enamelled badge, save and except that it shall be entirely worked in bronze, instead of gold and bronze, and shall be suspended from a crimson riband of an inch and three-eighths of an inch in width, with two white longitudinal stripes.

IX. It is ordained that the names of those upon whom We may be pleased to confer either of these Decorations shall be published in the London Gazette, and that a register thereof shall be kept in the Office of Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

X. It is ordained, that the Medals shall only be awarded to those of Our faithful subjects and others who, in saving or endeavouring to save the lives of others from accidents in mines, on railways, or at fires, or other peril other than perils of the sea, have endangered their own lives, and that such award shall be made only on a recommendation to Us by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

The following Rules and Ordinances are ordained for the government of the Decorations whether awarded for Gallantry in Saving Life at Sea, or on

XI. It is ordained that "The Albert Medal of the First Class" shall be confined to cases of extreme and heroic daring, and that "The Albert Medal of the Second Class" shall be given in cases which, though falling within the cases contemplated by this Warrant, are not sufficiently distinguished to deserve "The Albert Medal of the First Class.'

XII. It is ordained that each Medal shall be

suspended from the left breast.

XIII. It is ordained that any act of gallantry which is worthy of recognition by the award of the Albert Medal, but is performed by one upon whom the Decoration has already been conferred, may, on a recommendation to Us by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, be recorded by a bar attached to the riband by which the Medal is suspended; and for every such additional act an additional bar

may be added.

XIV. In order to make such additional provision as shall effectually preserve pure these most honourable Decorations, it is ordained that if any person on whom either of such Decorations is conferred be guilty of any crime or disgraceful conduct which in Our judgment disqualifies him for the same, his name shall, by an especial Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual, be forthwith erased from the register of those upon whom the said Decoration shall have been conferred, and his Medal shall be forfeited. And every person to whom the said Medal is given shall, before receiving the same, enter into an engagement to return the same if his name shall be so erased as aforesaid under this regulation. It is hereby further declared, that We, Our Heirs and Successors, shall be the sole judges of the circumstance demanding such expulsion. Moreover, We shall at all times have power to order that any person who may at any time have been expelled shall be restored to the enjoyment of the Decoration.

XV. The Warrants of the 7th March, 1866, the 12th April, 1867, the 30th April, 1877, the 13th September, 1881, the 12th March, 1891, and the 24th March, 1904, are hereby repealed.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, this fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and five, in the fifth year of Our Reign.

His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a Despatch from His Majesty's Minister at Seoul enclosing a translation of certain Regulations enforced on 17th April last by the Japanese Military Authorities for the control of vessels entering and leaving the port of Wonsan.

The Regulations run as follows:-

1. All vessels, except those belonging to the Naval Department, are prohibited from entering or leaving Wonsan Bay between sunset and sunrise without special permission of the Commander.

2. Vessels entering or leaving the port must take a course south of the line between the south-western point of Nikolski Island and the

southern extremity of Sho shin tao.

3. Vessels navigating within the area contained by the line connecting Black Rock, the north oint of High Island, the eastern extremity of Nikolski Island and Codrika Point and the line of the harbour limits may not exceed a speed of five

4. Regulations 2 and 3 do not apply to steamers whose tonnage does not exceed twenty tons displacement, cargo boats, small craft belonging to the military or naval departments, or other boats under special permission of the Commander. It must be understood, however, that the Commander may enforce these restrictions if considered necessary.

5. Any vessels infringing these Regulations are liable to meet with an accident and to be

fired upon at night.

A picket boat will be kept to guide vessels into port.

Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or of any Order by which such provisions are applied to any scheduled area, swine may be moved from the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any place of destination in Great Britain situate in any scheduled area, if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place to which the swine are proposed to be moved.

The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and while being so moved shall not be subject to Regulations made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board relating to Swine-Fever.
